FEDERAL TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION STATE OF GOOD REPAIR FLEET



The City of South Padre Island was awarded \$115,000 from the Federal Transit Administration State of Good Repair Fleet Grant. The City Council authorized WAVE staff to purchase two buses, one in May of FY 10-11 and the purchase of a second bus in November of FY 11-12.

HEALTH & SAFETY GRANT

On December 23rd, the Fire Department received the "Health and Safety" grant under the AFG (Assistance to Firefighters Grant) program. The grant provided full physical exams, cardiologic evaluations, immunization updates and verification and health counseling for all SPI firefighters.



EXCELLENCE IN FINANCIAL REPORTING



The City of South Padre Island received the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting from the Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA) for the 2010 Comprehensive Annual Report. This is the 21st consecutive year that the City has achieved this award. Our appreciation is given to the Finance Department staff for their hard work in attaining this award.

STATE OF TEXAS SEAL

MUNICIPAL COURT ONLINE PAYMENTS

The Municipal Court received its first online payment on October 1, 2011, from someone in Grandbury, TX in the amount of \$370.00. This payment option is now available on our City's website. With this service, violators will be able to pay their tickets online using their citation number, license plate number or driver's license number. As of Sept. 14th, 2011 the City has received \$84,633.03 in payments through the online payment module.

Municipal Court Division

MUNICIPAL SERVICES BUREAU

Municipal Services Bureau is the collection firm that the City is currently using to collect monies that are over sixty days past due. MSB was brought to the City Council on April 7th, 2010 which put our first submission to them in September of 2010. Since October 1st, 2010 to September 14th, 2011 MSB has collected \$42,447.

SCOFFLAW

The City Council approved the City Manager to sign an Interlocal Agreement with Cameron County and TX Department of Motor Vehicles on December 10th, 2010. The Municipal Court submitted 300 cases on April 14th, 2011. Three cases have been paid and one has been placed on a payment plan. The total collected so far is \$1,281.80. This program denies the registration or re-registration of vehicles if the registered owner has a warrant for delinquent Class C misdemeanor traffic offenses for failure to appear or resolve cases.

TEXASSCOFFLAW

OMNIBASE

The City Council approved the City Manager to sign an Interlocal Agreement with the Texas Department of Public Safety on July 21st, 2010. This program blocks the renewal of a drivers license of a person who fails to appear or to satisfy a judgment ordering payment of a fine and cost related to any offence that a court has jurisdiction.





COURT AUDIO

The Municipal Court was happy to announce their new audio system in February of this year. We are happy to have this tool available for the use of Judge and the visitors of the Court. The Audio system is made up of three wireless microphones that can be moved around in the court room as needed to create multi-functional uses.

On the November 2nd General Election the citizens of the City of South Padre Island voted in favor of a \$3.8 million that will allow the construction of the new Fire & Emergency Services Station. 827 citizens voted, with 352 voting against the bond and 474 voting in favor of the \$3.8 million bond.

ASBPA COASTAL SUMMIT



The week of February 28th, Mayor Pinkerton, Mayor Pro-Tem Evans and Council Member Ridolfi visited the U.S. Capitol to meet with elected officials and agency staff to seek funding for the City of South Padre Island's beach re-nourishment project, Padre Boulevard medians, sidewalks reconstruction project, and other local economic development initiatives. City Manager Clarke, Coastal Resources Manager Trevino and Development Director Vasquez accompanied the local elected officials to organized meetings and provide supporting information.

GENERAL ELECTION

COMMUNITY SURVEY

The City of South Padre Island conducted a community survey to gather feedback from the community about the quality of life in the City of South Padre Island and the services provided by the City.

Issues that were measured were public safety, transportation, maintenance, development, fiscal management, waste disposal, code enforcement, communication, community outreach, customer service and the quality of life of residents, property owners, business owners and employees in the City of South Padre Island.



TAX INCREMENT REINVESTMENT ZONE (TIRZ)



The Cameron County Commissioners Court approved the interlocal agreement between the city and the county for participation in the Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone (TIRZ). During the life of the zone, \$29 million from the City, Laguna Madre Water District and Cameron County will be invested in infrastructure within the approved boundaries.



MEDIA EFFORTS

City Manager Joni Clarke and Mayor Pinkerton joined Tourism Coordinator Lili DeRousie and Executive Director for the Convention and Visitors Bureau, Dan Quandt, at a breakfast gathering with Mexico media representatives. These individuals were brought in by AeroMexico to assist in promoting our area to our southern neighbors. Other partners in this project include the Rio Grande Valley Premium Outlets and the Brownsville CVB.



END OF FISCAL YEAR EVENT



On September 30th, the City held their Fiscal Year End Celebration to acknowledge staff accomplishments throughout the 2010-11 fiscal year. The Leadership Team served staff Rudy's barbeque, potato salad, coleslaw, tea and peach cobbler for des-

DUNE RESTORATION PROJECTS



Since December 2010 the City has hosted 5 Saturday morning volunteer events. At these events a total of 400 volunteers came out to help from various organizations; students

from South Texas College and the University of Texas at Brownsville, Texas Master Naturalists, Winter Visitors, Island locals, and students from school districts from across the Rio Grande Valley. In addition to the volunteer events, the local elementary school brought 350 kids from the 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade levels on field trips to the beach where we taught them the importance of the dunes and gave them a chance to help plant vegetation.



The City purchased the plants but was able to save a considerable amount of money on installation with help from the volunteers. The expense to the City was approximately \$21,000 to order the plants. The total volunteer time accumulated was approximately 2,100 man hours. The cost for the same amount of plants installed by a contractor would be approximately \$70,500. Through the volunteer program the City was able to save approximately \$50,000.





BENEFICIAL USE OF DREDGE MATERIAL



The City of South Padre Island together with the Texas General Land Office and the US Army Corps of Engineers united for the Beneficial Use of Dredge Material (BUDM) project. The BUDM project consisted of dredging sand from the Brazos Santiago Pass and placing it on the northern section of the City of South Padre Island. The project will widen the beach and thus increase habitat for flora and fauna, and increase protection to private property and public infrastructure.

The Environmental Health Services Department hosted the 8th Annual Texas Environmental Health Association (TEHA) Educational Conference at The Isla Grand on December 8th, 9th & 10th. Over 75 participants from around the state attended the conference in order to earn their CEU's for Registered Sanitarians, Animal Control, Vector Control and Code Enforcement Officers. Guest speaker was senator Eddie Lucio.



RECYCLING PRESENTATION

On August 2nd, at the South Padre Island Golf Club, Environmental Health Services Director, Victor Baldovinos and Code Enforcement Officer David Travis discussed the history and the impact of recycling on South Padre Island to students from Corpus Christi Martin Middle School's Science and Spanish Club, and from Los Fresnos ROTC. The presentation was part of the First Annual Rio Grande/Rio Bravo Watershed Youth & Family Leadership in Stewardship Conference. Code Enforcement Officer David Travis also introduced the upcoming plastic bag reduction ordinance, the importance of using biodegradable, compostable

The Department of State Health Services is no longer inspecting for compliance with state law. The responsibilities were assigned to the Texas Department of Agriculture.

An inspection was performed on July 20th, 2011 at our facility and revealed no violations! During the inspection, the Texas Department of Agriculture Pesticide Chief Inspector Carlos Rivas stated "he wished more municipalities" kept their chemical storage rooms just like ours!"

Mosquito Identification Study

On the week of July 11th to the 15th. 2011. Clark Mosquito Co. generously performed a mosquito identification study in order to identify disease carrying mosquitoes that reside in our area. They brought their field biologist along with senior interns to conduct the survey. Unfortunately at the time of surveying, the mosquito count was very low and the study could not be completed. We did however: learn the different techniques on how to trap mosquitoes. The short study did identify the majority of mosquito species in our area as being nuisance mosquitoes and not disease carrying mosquitoes.

BOND UPGRADE

This constitutes an upgrade from the last rating of Aa3. Standard and Poor's issued a bond rating of A+. Proceeds from the current sale will fund the design and construction of a new Fire and Emergency Services Station. This was achieved through the hard work and dedication of Rodrigo Gimenez and Cynthia Erickson who provided the information to the rating companies.

FINANCE IS GOING GREEN

The City of South Padre Island Finance Department is doing their best to preserve the environment by going paperless with many of their reports. The payroll, accounts payable and cash receipt reports are all saved in PDF format now instead of printing them. This reduces the storage space required, saves trees and eventually saves space in our landfills!

Rosie Guzman continues the Finance Departments efforts to go green by encouraging vendors to sign up for Electronic Funds Transfer electronic payment option. This helps the environment by using a paperless payment system thereby reducing the number of paper checks printed.

THE ISLANDER'S TOASTMASTERS CLUB

The Islanders Toastmasters club was started in 2010 as an employee only club. It was changed to a public club so that anyone could join in 2011. Toastmasters is a public speaking and leadership group that has regular meetings so that our members can practice becoming better speakers and performing in leadership roles. The club conducts weekly meetings every Thursday at noon at City Hall.



COMMUNICATION IMPROVEMENTS



There have been a number of improvements in communication that were implemented in 2011. The City introduced its new weekly newsletter entitled "Eye on SPI" and continued to improve its blog, Facebook and Twitter pages. Also, with the purchase of a video camera and editing software, staff began releasing videos through its YouTube page. Lastly, the City introduced an eComment service as part of its live and archived video streaming service for city meetings. This service allows people to share their opinion on City Council agenda items online prior to the meeting.

GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEMS (GIS)



The City has continued to develop its Geographic Information Systems data and provide training to employees interested in learning more about the program. The City replaced its five year old plotter through the contributions of multiple departments because the previous one was not meeting the needs of the City. The new plotter allows staff to generate maps more quickly and has been a great addition to

the GIS services. Staff also began testing Google Earth Pro as a more user friendly and cost effective tool for creating interactive maps, presentations and images.





POLICE TECHNOLOGY IMPROVEMENTS

The Police Department is the biggest department in the City and also uses the most technology. The City updated its agreement with the State to include 10 mobile units for the Texas Law Enforcement Telecommunication System (TLETS). This allows the police officers to perform drivers license and license plate lookups in the field without having to contact dispatch. The City also purchased 10 refurbished laptops so that all vehicles could be equipped with computer access. Information Services also assisted in the Watch Guard Video, LiveScan and other Police technology projects.



CITY SERVERS GO VIRTUAL

In 2010, the City began to replace its aging server infrastructure with virtualized technology. During 2011 the City implemented centralized storage which is required to get all of the benefits of virtualization. Now the City has virtualized

its entire critical server infrastructure with built in redundancy and backup to meet the growing needs and expectations of the City staff. With the new improvements the City is able to take multiple server backups a day, restore failed servers in hours instead of days and better prepare for emergency outages.





CITY EXPLORES TABLET COMPUTERS

Tablet computers were the hot thing in 2011 and the City began exploring how to use this technology to improve services and reduce costs.

- City Council Member Alita Bagley tested tablets as part of a paperless agenda process to reduce costs and staff time required to generate paper packets.
- Coastal Resources Manager Reuben Trevino has been using a tablet out in the field to improve communication and documentation of beach-related items. The tablet has improved his ability to handle beach issues and communicate with staff back at the office while out in the field.
- Emergency Medical Services will be using tablets instead of the traditional Panasonic Toughbook computers, saving approximately \$2,000 for every device required by EMS.

Tablets have not yet replaced the desktop but the number of uses continues to grow. The City has also began implementing centralized application hosting which would allow the tablets to run the majority of the City's software from anywhere with an internet connection.

ENHANCED SECURITY TECHNOLOGY

Security was a big issue in government technology during 2011 because of the numerous attacks by hacking groups on Public Safety agencies. The City implemented a new firewall with enhanced security features towards the beginning of the year and switched anti-virus providers from Computer Associates (CA) to McAfee. Enhancements were also made to the Police Department vehicles for remote access to comply with the State's requirements.











COMMUNICATIONS STATISTICS



We posted almost 400 status updates that generated more than 100,000 interactions. Uploaded 32 photo albums and closed the year with 542 Facebook friends.

Tweeted 355 tweets to our 400 twitter followers. Our followers retweeted more than 50 of our tweets and mentioned "SouthPadreTexas" in more than 100 tweets.





We published 110 blogs that were read by more than 4000 viewers.

On March 8th, 2011 we published the first weekly newsletter titled "Eye on SPI". Since then, we have published 30 editions to our 195 subscribers.





We have released 40 press releases to our media contact list.

Almost 550 local news on South Padre Island have been published or aired.





125 Board and Committee meetings have been video stream through our live video stream service to the community.





CRIME VICTIMS EXPO

The Police Department hosted the first Crime Victims event in October in an effort to educate our local community on the resources available to them, with several guest speakers from local entities such as: the Family Crisis Center, Friendship of Women, Monica's House, and the Cameron County District Attorney's Office. The Crime Victims expo was part of the Domestic Violence Awareness Month events.





K-9 LUCKY

Congratulations to "Lucky"! After his six month probationary period, "Lucky" has proved to be a valuable partner and an asset to Officer Joseph Gonzalez and to the entire South Padre Island Police Department.





The SPIPD has a new seating area outside the Police Department at the Municipal Complex to accommodate our Spring Break guests to avoid an overcrowded lobby. The expenses were less than \$400 for materials that included two benches made of recvcled material and planters.



DOMESTIC AND SEXUAL VIOLENCE



The SPI-PD in conjunction with the Cameron County District Attorney's office, co-sponsored 'A Comprehensive Response to Combat Domestic and Sexual Violence' in June of 2011. PD had a record of attendance with 105 law enforcement professionals from Cameron County and the surrounding counties.

NEW VIDEO SYSTEM

The SPI-PD purchased and installed a new state-of-the-art high-definition Watchguard in-car video systems. The new video system will greatly assist PD in prosecuting criminal cases in court. The equipment also promotes officer safety, assists in officer training and protecting the City from false accusations.





SPI-PD MARINE PATROL

In 2010-2011 SPI-PD made giant steps in its mission to create a SPI-PD Marine Patrol division. In mid 2011, SPI-PD was notified that their Home Land Security Stone Garden Grant applications had been approved. SPI-PD hopes to receive the funds in January 2012, which will be used to purchase a boat, fuel and staffing.



UNIFORM POLO SHIRTS



SPI-PD purchased new uniform polo shirts with their new patch embroidered for the Records Clerks. The initiative supports the professionalism of our Records Department.

GULF CART LICENSE PLATES

SPI-PD has issued over 40 golf cart license plates. The plates are attractive and our cart owners seem to enjoy them. With TxDot doing away with golf cart registrations, SPI created an ordinance to allow our cart owners to continue their usage.





SPI-PD issued several hundred green street-side parking permits to owners and property managers whom requested them. SPI PD also aggressively issued a combination of warnings and citations, and have begun enforcement of the beach street endings, concerning overnight parking violations.



SPI POLICE DEPARTMENT STATISTICS

Throughout the course of fiscal year 2010/2011, we received 18,552 calls for service, generated 1,885 incident reports, worked 293 motor vehicle accidents, and the jail housed 1,202 prisoners.

We reviewed over 800 cases with at least 200 cases needing substantial and detailed investigation work, research and examination. Over \$67,000.00 was recovered in stolen or missing property.

SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS & GPS

PADRE BLVD. & ENTERTAINMENT DISTRICT FORM BASED CODE

City Council completes work on major project to revitalize Padre Boulevard and the Entertainment District. In coordination with TxDOT and utilizing criteria based on the Designing Walkable Thoroughfares Manual, the City adopted the Padre Boulevard and Entertainment District Form Based Code. The new regulations are designed to facilitate economic development projects, enhance aesthetics of the Island's built urban form and to create a safe, walkable, bicycle-friendly community.
