AGREEMENT FOR THE TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF STATE RIGHT-OF-WAY
THIS AGREEMENT is made by and between the State of Texas, acting by and through the Texas Department of Transportation, hereinafter called the "State," and the City of, a municipal corporation, acting by and through its duly authorized officers, hereinafter called the "City."
WITNESSETH
WHEREAS, the State owns and operates a system of highways for public use and benefit, including <u>นิเอมเมลา เจอ</u> , in <u>Cameron</u> , County; and
WHEREAS, the City has requested the temporary closure of the lane of the western size of the western cause of the purpose of t
WHEREAS, the Event will be located within the City's incorporated area; and
WHEREAS, the State, in recognition of the public purpose of the Event, wishes to cooperate with the City so long as the safety and convenience of the traveling public is ensured and that the closure of the State's right-of-way will be performed within the State's requirements; and
WHEREAS, on the 15 <sup>TH</sup> day of DECEMBER, 20 15, the PORT SABEL City Council passed Resolution / Ordinance No, attached hereto and identified as "Exhibit B," establishing that the Event serves a public purpose and authorizing the City to enter into this agreement with the State; and
WHEREAS, 43 TAC, Section 22.12 establishes the rules and procedures for the temporary closure of a segment of the State highway system; and
WHEREAS, this agreement has been developed in accordance with the rules and procedures of 43 TAC, Section 22.12;
NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants and agreements of the parties hereto, to be by them respectively kept and performed as hereinafter set forth, it is agreed as follows:
AGREEMENT
Article 1. CONTRACT PERIOD  This agreement becomes effective upon final execution by the State and shall terminate upon completion of the Event or unless terminated or modified as hereinafter provided.

## Article 1. CONTRACT PERIOD

#### Article 2. EVENT DESCRIPTION

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The description of the Event, including the proposed schedule of start and stop times, approximate number of people attending the Event, and equipment involved shall be attached hereto and identified as "Exhibit C."

#### Article 3. OPERATIONS OF THE EVENT

- **A.** The City shall assume all costs for the operations associated with the Event, to include but not limited to, plan development, materials, labor, public notification, providing protective barriers and barricades, protection of highway traffic and highway facilities, and all traffic control and temporary signing.
- **B.** The City shall submit to the State for review and approval the construction plans, if construction or modifications to the State's right-of-way is required, the traffic control and signing plans, traffic enforcement plans, and all other plans deemed necessary by the State.
- **C.** The City will not initiate closure prior to 24 hours before the scheduled Event and all barriers and barricades will be removed and the highway reopened to traffic within 24 hours after the completion of the Event.
- **D.** The City will provide adequate enforcement personnel to prevent vehicles from stopping and parking along the main lanes of highway right-of-way and otherwise prevent interference with the main lane traffic by both vehicles and pedestrians. The City will prepare a traffic enforcement plan, to be approved by the State in writing at least 48 hours prior to the scheduled Event. Additionally, the City shall provide to the State a letter of certification from the law enforcement agency that will be providing traffic control for the Event, certifying that they agree with the enforcement plan and will be able to meet its requirements.
- **E.** The City hereby assures the State that there will be appropriate passage allowance for emergency vehicle travel and adequate access for abutting property owners during construction and closure of the highway facility. These allowances and accesses will be included in the City's traffic control plan.
- **F.** The City will avoid or minimize damage, and will, at its own expense, restore or repair damage occurring outside the State's right-of-way and restore or repair the State's right-of-way, including roadway and drainage structures, signs, and pavement, etc. to a condition equal to that existing before the closure, and, to the extent practicable, restore the natural environment, including landscape features.

## Article 4. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

Upon completion or termination of this agreement, all documents prepared by the City will remain the property of the City. All data prepared under this agreement shall be made available to the State without restriction or limitation on their further use.

## Article 5. TERMINATION

- **A.** This agreement may be terminated by any of the following conditions:
  - (1) By mutual written agreement and consent of both parties.
  - (2) By the State upon determination that use of the State's right-of-way is not feasible or is not in the best interest of the State and the traveling public.
  - (3) By either party, upon the failure of the other party to fulfill the obligations as set forth herein.
  - (4) By satisfactory completion of all services and obligations as set forth herein.
- **B.** The termination of this agreement shall extinguish all rights, duties, obligations and liabilities of the State and City under this agreement. If the potential termination of this agreement is due to the failure of the City to fulfill its contractual obligations as set forth herein, the State will notify the City that possible breach of contract has occurred. The City

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must remedy the breach as outlined by the State within ten (10) days from receipt of the State's notification. In the event the City does not remedy the breach to the satisfaction of the State, the City shall be liable to the State for the costs of remedying the breach and any additional costs occasioned by the State.

## Article 6. DISPUTES

Should disputes arise as to the parties' responsibilities or additional work under this agreement, the State's decision shall be final and binding.

### Article 7. RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PARTIES

The State and the Local Government agree that neither party is an agent, servant, or employee of the other party and each party agrees it is responsible for its individual acts and deeds as well as the acts and deeds of its contractors, employees, representatives, and agents.

## Article 8. INSURANCE

- **A.** Prior to beginning any work upon the State's right-of-way, the City and/or its contractors shall furnish to the State a completed "Certificate of Insurance" (TxDOT Form 1560, latest edition) and shall maintain the insurance in full force and effect during the period that the City and/or its contractors are encroaching upon the State right-of-way.
- **B.** In the event the City is a self-insured entity, the City shall provide the State proof of its self-insurance. The City agrees to pay any and all claims and damages that may occur during the period of this closing of the highway in accordance with the terms of this agreement.

#### Article 9. AMENDMENTS

Any changes in the time frame, character, agreement provisions or obligations of the parties hereto shall be enacted by written amendment executed by both the City and the State.

## Article 10. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

The City shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local environmental laws, regulations, ordinances and any conditions or restrictions required by the State to protect the natural environment and cultural resources of the State's right-of-way.

## Article 11. LEGAL CONSTRUCTION

In case one or more of the provisions contained in this agreement shall for any reason be held invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability shall not affect any other provisions hereof and this agreement shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.

## Purpose

The purpose of this plan is to best manage traffic flow during the 34<sup>th</sup> Annual Longest Causeway Run and Fitness Walk event as it enters South Padre Island. Also, to provide procedures for deployment of personnel and equipment to ensure the success and safety of this event.

#### Discussion

It is the plan of this law enforcement agency along with other city departments to work together and manage personnel and equipment placed in areas to enhance the flow of traffic and control the run and walking route(s).

#### Action

The placement of traffic control barrels/cones on the roadway to direct traffic movement to minimize the delay of traffic movement. The placement of these devices would be at a time and place identified by city personnel and staff of the event. Identified locations where police and other city personnel could be positioned to ensure control and safe movement of traffic.

## Locations of management control:

- 1. Westbound S.H. 100 across the Queen Isabella Memorial Causeway and then north on Park Rd. 100.
- 2. On P.R. 100-Northbound to Atol St for the runners.
- 3. West Atol St. (one block) and then south on Laguna Blvd. until the finish line at the 2300 blk. of Laguna Blvd.
- 4. Eastbound traffic on the Queen Isabella Memorial Causeway can continue without interruption.
- 5. Westbound traffic from South Padre Island on the Causeway will be able to use the left lane as they travel to Port Isabel until the end of the run and walk event, then both westbound lanes will be open.

A tail-escort of emergency vehicles will be available until the end of the wellness walk on the South Padre Island

#### **ORDINANCE 17-17**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 13 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS, BY AMENDING SECTION 13-24(E) THAT DAMAGE TO DUNES AND DUNE VEGETATION IS PROHIBITED; ESTABLISH WHEN IT IS NECESSARY TO REMOVE EQUIPMENT AND WHERE EQUIPMENT MUST BE PLACED WHEN REMOVED FROM THE BEACH: AND **DURING TIMES** OF **ORDINARY** WEATHER **ALL** EQUIPMENT MUST BE SECURED TO PREVENT MOVEMENT BY WIND AND/OR WATER; AND ADDING SECTION 13-24(P) THAT REQUIRES PROPERTY OWNERS AND UMBRELLA VENDORS TO IDENTIFY ON THE APPLICATION FORM A REMOVAL LOCATION THAT COMPLIES WITH THE ORDINANCE THAT IDENTIFIES THE PLACEMENT OF STORED EQUIPMENT OUT OF THE CRITICAL DUNE AREA ONCE NECESSARY CONDITIONS HAVE BEEN DETERMINED BY THE CITY MANAGER OR THEIR PROXY

# BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS:

<u>Section 1</u>. Chapter 13 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of South Padre Island is hereby amended to read as follows:

## Chapter 13 Section 13-24 Regulation of Shade Devices and Chairs on the Public Beach

No person or entity may place shade devices, chairs or other physical devices for rent or use by third parties on any portion of the beach within the City of South Padre Island located seaward of the Historical Building Line without obtaining a permit from the City as provided for by this Section 13-24, and comply with all provisions of this section, to-wit:

- E) Damage to the dunes and dune vegetation is prohibited. In the case of a hurricane warning, coastal flood warning, or tropical storm warning as issued by the National Weather Service for South Padre Island, as determined by the City Manager or their proxy, all equipment must be removed from the beach and placed west of the "critical dune area" as defined by Chapter 22. Equipment shall be stored away from such area that is deemed a threat to the dunes or public safety, as determined by the City Manager or proxy. During times of ordinary weather conditions, all stored equipment must be secured to prevent movement by wind and/or water. Public health and safety equipment may be exempt from this ordinance.
- P) Property owners and umbrella vendors are required to identify on the application form a removal location that is in compliance with the ordinance that identifies the placement of stored equipment out of the Critical Dune Area once necessary conditions (as defined by letter E in this section) have been determined by the City Manager or their proxy.

Section 2. Any violation of this Ordinance may be punished by a fine not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each offense or for each day such offense shall continue and the penalty provisions of Section 21-1 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby adopted and incorporated for all purposes.

Section 3. If for any reason, any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word, or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by final judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word, or provision of this Ordinance, for it is the definite intent of this City Council that every section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word, or provision hereof be given full force and effect for its purpose.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Ordinance shall become effective upon publication of its caption.

## **ORDINANCE 17-18**

AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING THE HEREINAFTER DESCRIBED TERRITORY TO THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, CAMERON COUNTY, TEXAS, AND EXTENDING THE BOUNDARY LIMITS OF SAID CITY SO AS TO INCLUDE SAID HEREINAFTER DESCRIBED PROPERTY WITHIN SAID CITY LIMITS, AND GRANTING TO ALL THE INHABITANTS OF SAID PROPERTY ALL THE RIGHTS AND PRIVILEGES OF OTHER CITIZENS AND BINDING SAID INHABITANTS BY ALL OF THE ACTS, ORDINANCES, RESOLUTIONS, AND REGULATIONS OF SAID CITY; AND ADOPTING A SERVICE PLAN.

**WHEREAS,** §43.021 of the Texas Local Government Code and Section 4.04 of Charter of the City of South Padre Island, Texas, an incorporated city, authorizes the annexation of territory, subject to the laws of this state.

**WHEREAS**, the procedures prescribed by the Subchapter C-1 of Chapter 43 of the Texas Local Government Code and the laws of this state have been duly followed with respect to the following described territory, to wit:

A 10 foot wide strip of land along the southernmost portion of land known as Andy Bowie Park, extending out into the Gulf of Mexico, going south approximately 317 feet and also including submerged land east of Block 20, Padre Beach Estates Subdivision; Lot 2 Contran Subdivision; East Tracts 16 and 17, Padre Beach Subdivision, containing 6.61 acres, more or less.

Also identified on the Annexation Map that is attached as Exhibit "A".

# NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS:

**Section 1:** That the heretofore described property is hereby annexed to the City of South Padre Island, Cameron County, Texas, and that the boundary limits of the City of South Padre Island be and the same are hereby extended to include the above described territory within the city limits of the City of South Padre Island, and the same shall hereafter be included within the territorial limits of said city, and the inhabitants thereof shall hereafter be entitled to all the rights and privileges of other citizens of the city of South Padre Island and they shall be bound by the acts, ordinances, resolutions, and regulations of said city.

**Section 2:** The Map showing the boundaries of the City and its Extraterritorial Jurisdiction shall be immediately amended to include the annexed territory.

**Section 3:** A service plan for the area is hereby adopted and attached as **Exhibit "B"** and is hereby approved as part of this Ordinance.

Section 4: The described and annexed property shall be zoned PBN (Padre Boulevard North) Character Zone.

Section 5: The adoption of this ordinance is a condition of the Specific Use Permit that was conditionally granted in Ordinance No. 17-15, and said Specific Use Permit shall issue upon final adoption of this annexation ordinance. The Specific Use Permit and its conditions shall apply to any covered use in the annexed area.

Section 6: Once this annexation ordinance is adopted and an application for an Annual Fireworks Permit application is submitted, the permit will be issued at the time of inspection and it must remain on site of the display at all times until the next inspection. The permit will be revoked at any time if it fails at the inspection.

Section 7: If any part, phrase, or sentence of this ordinance is held void or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, or if any portion of land hereby annexed shall be held to be ineligible for annexation or shall be held to have been wrongfully annexed, the remaining portions of said ordinance and the remaining portions of land so annexed shall be considered severable and shall remain in full force and effect.

**Section 8:** The City Secretary is hereby directed to file with the County Clerk of Cameron County, a certified copy of this Ordinance.

## I. Introduction

This service plan has been prepared in accordance with the Texas Local Government Code (LGC), Sections 43.065 and 43.056(b)-(o) under the authority of home-rule power given by LGC Section 43.021.

This service plan has been prepared for certain waterways and submerged lands belong to the State of Texas, lying and being situated to the east of Lots 16 and 17 Padre Beach Estate Subdivision and Contran Subdivision Lot 2, out of Gulf of Mexico, and a 10-foot width southernmost pieces of the Andy Bowie Park in Cameron County, Texas, that are total 6.61 acres. The boundaries can be found at the Exhibit "A" and are roughly described as follows:

**COMMENCING** at a one-half inch iron pin found at the intersection of the East Right-of-Way line of Padre Boulevard (Texas State Park Road No. 100) with the North boundary line of Tract 17, and being the Southwest corner of Lot 2, Contran Subdivision (Cabinet 1, Slot 1416-A, Map Record);

**THENCE**, North 90 Deg. East, a **distance** of 1,569 feet to the East jurisdictional boundary line of the City of South Padre Island, TX, for the **POINT OF BEGINNING**;

**THENCE**, along the East jurisdictional boundary line of the City of South Padre Island, TX, North 5 Deg. 44 Min. 27 Sec. West, A distance of 557.8 feet;

Full municipal services will be provided to the annexed areas within the time provided in the LGC Section 43.056(b). For the purpose of this plan, "full municipal services" means services provided by the annexing municipality within its full-purpose boundaries, which does not include water, wastewater, gas and electrical services.

Per LGC Sec. 43.056(f), this service plan does not:

- Require the creation of another political subdivision;
- Require a landowner in the area to fund the capital improvements necessary to provide municipal services in a manner inconsistent with Chapter 395, Texas Local Government Code unless otherwise agreed to by the landowner;
- Provide services in the area in a manner that would have the effect of reducing by more than a negligible amount the level of fire and police protection and emergency medical services provided within the corporate boundaries of the City before annexation;
- Provide services in the area in a manner that would have the effect of reducing by more than a negligible amount the level of fire and police protection and emergency medical services provided within the area before annexation; or
- Cause a reduction in fire and police protection and emergency medical services within the area to be annexed below
  that of area within the corporate boundaries of the City with similar topography, land use, and population density.II.
  General Statement

## II. General Statement

It is the intent that this service plan provides the annexed area with a level of services, infrastructure, and infrastructure maintenance that is comparable to the level of services, infrastructure, and infrastructure maintenance available in other parts of the City with topography, land use, and population density similar to those reasonably contemplated or projected in the area. (LGC Sec. 43.056(g))

This service plan shall be valid for a term of ten (10) years. Renewal of the service plan shall be at the discretion of the City Council. (LGC Sec. 43.056(1))

The service plan may be amended if the City Council determines at a public hearing that changed conditions or subsequent occurrences make this service plan unworkable or obsolete. The City Council may amend the service plan to conform to the changed conditions or subsequent occurrences pursuant to the LGC Sec. 43.056.



## III. The Service Plan

As used in this service plan, the term 'providing services' includes having services provided by any method or means by which the City may extend municipal services to any other area of the City, including the City's infrastructure extension policies, service provider's capital improvement plan, and developer/owner participation in accordance with applicable law.

All of the annexation area is part of the waters of the Gulf of Mexico, which is again part of the State Waterway System, and therefore the service will be limited to those options available for such areas.

#### A. Police Protection

The South Padre Island Police Department will provide protection and law enforcement services in the annexation area commencing on the effective date of annexation. The services will include:

- Normal patrols and responses to calls for service;
- Handling of offense and incident reports;
- Emergency Management;
- Special units, such as traffic enforcement, criminal investigations, narcotics law enforcement; and
- Gang suppression, and crime response team deployment when required.

These services are provided on a citywide basis and the area will be combined with existing Police Reporting Areas.

#### B. Fire Protection

The South Padre Island Fire Department will provide fire protection services with existing personnel and equipment, and such services will be provided to the annexed area commencing on the effective date of the annexation. These services include:

- 911 Emergency Response
- Fire suppression and rescue;
- Hazardous materials mitigation and regulation;
- Dive rescue;
- Technical rescue;
- Aircraft/rescue/firefighting;
- Patrol/ Life Guard protection;
- Disaster Preparedness Activities;
- Fire Investigation; and
- Mobile Intensive Care Unit (MICU) and 1st responder emergency medical services.

These services are provided on a citywide basis.

## C. Emergency Medical Services

MICU and 1st responder emergency medical services by existing personnel and equipment of the South Padre Island Fire Department will be provided to the annexed area commencing on the effective date of the full-purpose annexation. Each Fire Department ambulance, engine, ladder truck, and boat in coordination with the police department is capable of providing EMS, including defibrillation, medical administration, IV therapy, advanced airway management, and initial treatment of injuries.

## D. Other Operations and Services

All other applicable municipal services will be provided to the area in accordance with the City of South Padre Island's established policies governing extension of municipal services to newly annexed areas.

In general, other City functions and services, and additional services described above can be provided for the annexation area by utilization of existing facilities. It is estimated that any additional capital improvements are not necessary to provide services to the annexed area this time.
