AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS, ESTABLISHING THE AD VALOREM AND PERSONAL PROPERTY TAX RATE FOR TAX YEAR 2010, AND SETTING THE ASSESSED VALUATION AT ONE HUNDRED PERCENT (100%) OF THE FAIR MARKET VALUE AND PROVIDING FOR DISCOUNTS IN THE EVENT OF EARLY PAYMENT, AND PROVIDING FOR PENALTY AND INEREST IN ACCORDANCE WITH STATE LAW; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY

SECTION 1. There is hereby established a tax rate of \$0.245610 of each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of assessed valuation on all ad valorem and personal property taxable under the laws of this State by the Town of South Padre Island and said Municipal Tax is levied and fixed for the following purposes, to wit:

First: An annual tax of \$0.219321 for each \$100.00 worth of all property within the limits of the City of South Padre Island, which is made taxable by law either for State or County purposes, is hereby levied and fixed for the current expenditures of the City of South Padre Island, Texas, and for the general improvements of the City and its property. THIS TAX RATE WILL RAISE MORE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS THAN LAST YEAR'S TAX RATE.

Second: A tax of \$0.026289 for each \$100.00 worth of all property within the limits of The City of South Padre Island, Texas, which is made taxable by law, either for State or County purposes, is hereby levied and fixed for the purposes of creating an interest and sinking fund for the retirement of general obligation bond.

SECTION 2. There is hereby granted a discount for early payment of the 2010 taxes, which discount shall be: three percent (3%) on 2009 taxes paid during the month of October 2010; two percent (2%) on 2010 taxes paid during the month of November 2010; and one percent (1%) on 2010 taxes paid during the month of December 2010.

SECTION 3. Any payment not timely made shall bear such penalty and interest as is provided by State Law.

<u>SECTION 4</u>. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase or provision of this ordinance shall be ajudged invalid or held unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part of provision thereof, other than the part so decided to be invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall become effective immediately.

Staff is requesting that the City Council review the purpose of each committee and consider merging some of the committees that share like goals and objectives. For example, The City Council may consider merging Padre Boulevard Revitalization Committee, Form Based Code Commission and Development Plan and Review Board into one committee as they share a common theme of regulating design standards. It is an appropriate time to review the established guidelines and overall structure of our committees as many terms expire at the end of September. Further, our volunteers are a limited resource that we need to use wisely and many of our citizens have been extravagant in the giving of their time and may need a break from service to reenergize.

It may be less confusing for a citizen wanting to stay informed to clarify the role of each committee. Presently, citizens need to attend (or view) multiple meetings and know the specific role of each committee to stay informed. A consolidated approach may provide a little more focus of broader areas of responsibility and provide a little more clarity regarding the objective of each committee and be a more effective use of volunteer time addressing the issue of some committees having very little on their agendas and some volunteers spending a great deal of time serving on multiple committees

It would be interesting to get input from those who currently serve on the various Boards and Commissions and incorporate their insight into the process.

WHEREAS, the Sections 22-2 through 22-3.2 of the City of South Padre Island Code of Ordinances created the Beach and Dune Task Force; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS:

<u>Section 4</u>: The Beach and Bay Task Force will establish goals annually including the following general objectives:

- Make programmatic recommendations to enhance public safety of the Laguna Madre Bay and at the Beach.
- Recommend policy to the City Council to protect and preserve the Laguna Madre Bay and the Beach to ensure its ecological vitality for the future.
- Develop an appropriate method and/or agreement both with the General land Office and the Army Corps of Engineers that they will not permit any type of improvements at the end of City streets abutting the bay and that area that extends into the Laguna Madre Bay.
- Work on creating access to the beach and the bay through including but not limited to walkovers, bay accesses, boat ramps, parking for boat trailers and vehicles to enhance recreational opportunities and economic viability.
- Preserve and enhance the dunes and strive to establish a continuous dune line based upon a 1993 study conducted by Robert A. Morton: *Beach and Dune Conditions at South Padre Island, Texas; Assessment and Recommendations* (Bureau of Economic Geology, The University of Texas at Austin). Additional specifications published and amended by the General Land Office in its *Dune Protection and Improvement Manual for the Texas Gulf Coast* should also be used as a reference.

<u>Section 5</u>: The Beach and Bay Task Force will strive to educate the public regarding the importance of implementing ecologically sound principles in regards to maintaining the Beach and Bay for the public's enjoyment.

RESOLUTION NO. 815 (AS AMENDED)

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND ABOLISHING THE CVB ADVISORY BOARD, CREATING AND EMPOWERING THE SOUTH PADRE ISLAND CONVENTION AND VISITORS AUTHORITY, ALLOCATING SPECIFIC APPOINTMENTS AND REPEALING THOSE PORTIONS OF PREVIOUS RESOLUTINS IN CONFLICT WITH THIS RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, The Board of Aldermen by Resolution No. 260 had heretofore established the Visitors and Convention Advisory Board which was to consist of seven (7) members and subsequent to such Resolution the Board was renamed as the Convention and Visitors Bureau Advisory Board and subsequently had the membership of the board increased to eight (8) members appointed by the Board of Aldermen and a 9th member being the Chairman of the South Padre Island Chamber of Commerce; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Aldermen wishes to give additional authority to this board, changing the board name and allocating membership on the board to specific criteria.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS:

Section 1. The Convention and Visitors Bureau Advisory Board is hereby abolished.

<u>Section 2</u>. The Convention and Visitors Authority is hereby created. The Authority will have governing responsibility over the Convention and Visitors Bureau, including all aspects of day-to-day operations. An annual budget and marketing plan will be submitted to the Board of Aldermen for approval. No expenditures of funds for the Convention and Visitors Bureau shall be allowed without the approval of the board of the Convention and Tourism Authority.

<u>Section 3</u>. Employees of the Convention and Visitors Bureau remain Town employees. The Executive Director of the Convention and Visitors Bureau shall report to the Authority and serve as liaison with the Board of Aldermen.

Section 4.

4-1. Board members of the Convention and Visitors Authority shall be appointed by the Board of Aldermen using the following criteria:

Four appointed from the hotel industry (two full service hotels, two limited service hotels) Two condominium industry representatives One tourism-related industry representative One citizen at large The sitting chair of the South Padre Island Chamber of Commerce The City Manager of South Padre Island (as amended by Resolution 815-A on December 19, 2007)

4-2. If any member of the Convention and Visitors Authority Board is delinquent in their payment of the Hotel Motel Bed Tax, shall be suspended from the Board; and if it becomes delinquent for more than 90 days, that member shall cease to become a member of the Convention and Visitors Authority Board. (As amended by the Board of Aldermen on July 2, 2008)

Section 5: For implementation, the current members of the CVB Advisory Board shall remain in their positions until new appointments are made. Following the new appointments by the Board of Aldermen, five of the appointees will be for two year terms and four for one year terms. These terms shall be decided by lots. All subsequent terms will be for two years, with a maximum of three consecutive terms. The chair of the Authority could serve a maximum of three consecutive terms. The chair of the Authority could serve a two year term and is eligible for a maximum second two year term. The chair could remain on the CVB board for a third consecutive term, but not as Chair.

<u>Section 6</u>. Ex-officio members of the Authority Board shall include the CVB Executive Director and one representative each from the Brownsville/South Padre Island International Airport and Valley International Airport in Harlingen.

<u>Section 7</u>. Those portions of any resolution heretofore enacted in conflict with this Resolution are repealed only to the extent of their conflict with this Resolution.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF SUCH CITY BY AMENDING CHAPTER 4, ARTICLE I, SECTION 4-5(A) BY PROVIDING FOR THE ADOPTION OF THE 2009 INTERNATIONAL RESIDENTIAL CODE WITHOUT SECTION P2904 AND MODIFICATION OF THE EXCEPTION IN SECTION R302.2; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY OF FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$500.00) FOR ANY VIOLATION; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION IN CAPTION FORM.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS:

<u>Section 1</u>. Section 4-5 (A) of Article I of Chapter 4 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of South Padre Island is hereby amended to provide for the adoption of the 2009 International Code without Section P2904 and modification of the exception in Section R302.2 within the City and such Section 4-5 (A) shall hereafter read as follows:

Sec. 4-5 Adoption of the Standard Codes.

A) "The Town adopts the 2009 International Building Code, <u>2009 International Residential Code</u> without Section P2904 (deleted) and the Exception in Section R302.2 does not apply unless the townhouses install a sprinkler system, 2009 International Fire Code, 2009 International Mechanical Code, 2009 International Plumbing Code, 2009 International Fuel Gas Code, 2008 National Electrical Code, 1997 Standard Housing Code, and the 1985 Unsafe Building Abatement Code and all other amendments thereto except as modified by the Code of Ordinances."

<u>Section 2</u>. Any violation of the above amended sections of Chapter 4 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of South Padre Island may be punished by a fine not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each offense or for each day such offense shall continue and the penalty provisions of Section 21-1 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby adopted and incorporated for all purposes.

<u>Section 3</u>. If for any reason any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word or provision of this ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by final judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word or provision of this ordinance for it is the definite intent of this Board of Aldermen that every section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word or provision hereof be given full force and effect for its purpose.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall become effective when published in caption form.

WHEREAS, the State has indicated its willingness to approve the establishment of such facilities and other uses conditioned that the <u>City of South Padre Island</u> will enter into agreements with the State for the purpose of determining the respective responsibilities of the <u>City of South Padre Island</u> and the <u>State with reference thereto, and conditioned that such uses are in the public interest and will not damage</u> the highway facilities, impair safety, impede maintenance or in any way restrict the operation of the highway facility, all as determined from engineering and traffic investigations conducted by the State.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants and agreements of the parties hereto to be by them respectively kept and performed as hereinafter set forth, it is agreed as follows:

1. DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION

City of South Padre Island will prepare or provide for the construction plans for the facility, and will provide for the construction work as required by said plans at no cost to the State. Said plans shall include the design of the access control, necessary horizontal and vertical clearances for highway structures, adequate landscape treatment, adequate detail to ensure compliance with applicable structural design standards, sufficient traffic control provisions, and general layout. They shall also delineate and define the construction responsibilities of both parties hereto. Completed plans will be submitted to State for review and approval and when approved shall be attached to the agreement and made a part thereof in all respects. Construction shall not commence until plans have been approved by the State. Any future revisions or additions shall be made after prior written approval of the State.

2. INSPECTION

Ingress and egress shall be allowed at all times to such facility for Federal Highway Administration personnel and State Forces and equipment when highway maintenance operations are necessary, and for inspection purposes; and upon request, all parking or other activities for periods required for such operations will be prohibited.

The state auditor may conduct an audit or investigation of any entity receiving funds from the state directly under the contract or indirectly through a subcontract under the contract. Acceptance of funds directly under the contract or indirectly through a subcontract under this contract acts as acceptance of the authority of the state auditor, under the direction of the legislative audit committee, to conduct an audit or investigation in connection with those funds. An entity that is the subject of an audit or investigation must provide the state auditor with access to any information the state auditor considers relevant to the investigation or audit.

3. PARKING REGULATIONS

Parking regulations shall be established limiting parking to single unit motor vehicles of size and capacity no greater than prescribed for $1^{1}/_{2}$ ton trucks, such vehicles to conform in size and use to governing laws. Parking shall be permitted only in marked spaces.

Parking shall be prohibited when a security threat, as determined by TxDOT, exists.

4. PROHIBITION/SIGNS

Regulations shall be established prohibiting the parking of vehicles transporting flammable or explosive loads and prohibiting use of the area in any manner for peddling, advertising or other purposes not in keeping with the objective of a public facility. The erection of signs other than those required for proper use of the area will be prohibited. All signs shall be approved by the State prior to the actual erection.

5. RESPONSIBILITIES

Maintenance and operation of the facility shall be entirely the responsibility of the City of South Padre Island _______. Such responsibility shall not be transferred, assigned or conveyed to a third party without the advanced written approval of the State. Further, such responsibility shall include picking up trash, mowing and otherwise keeping the facility in a clean and sanitary condition, and surveillance by police patrol to eliminate the possible creation of a nuisance or hazard to the public. Hazardous or unreasonably objectionable smoke, fumes, vapor or odors shall not be permitted to rise above the grade line of the highway, nor shall the facility subject the highway to hazardous or unreasonably objectionable dripping, droppings or discharge of any kind, including rain or snow.

6. FEES

Any fees levied for use of the facilities in the area shall be nominal and no more than are sufficient to defray the cost of construction, maintenance and operations thereof, and shall be subject to State approval.

7. TERMINATION UPON NOTICE

This provision is expressly made subject to the rights herein granted to both parties to terminate this agreement upon notice, and upon the exercise of any such right by either party, all obligations herein to make improvements to said facility shall immediately cease and terminate.

8. MODIFICATION/TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

If in the sole judgment of the State it is found at any future time that traffic conditions have so changed that the existence or use of the facility is impeding maintenance, damaging the highway facility, impairing safety or that the facility is not being properly operated, that it constitutes a nuisance, is abandoned, or if for any other reason it is the State's judgment that such facility is not in the public interest, this agreement under which the facility was constructed may be : (1) modified if corrective measures acceptable to both parties can be applied to eliminate the objectionable features of the facility; or (2) terminated and the use of the area as proposed herein discontinued.

9. PROHIBITION OF STORAGE OF FLAMMABLE MATERIALS

All structures located or constructed within the area covered by the agreement shall be fire resistant. The storage of flammable, explosive or hazardous materials is prohibited. Operations deemed to be a potential fire hazard shall be subject to regulation by the State.

10. RESTORATION OF AREA

The <u>City of South Padre Island</u> shall provide written notification to the State that such facility will be discontinued for the purpose defined herein. The <u>City of South Padre Island</u> shall, within thirty (30) days from the date of said notification, clear the area of all facilities that were its construction responsibility under this agreement and restore the area to a condition satisfactory to the State.

11. PREVIOUS AGREEMENTS

It is understood that this agreement in no way modifies or supersedes the terms and provisions of any existing agreements between the parties hereto.

12. INDEMNIFICATION

The	City of South Padre Island	acknowledges that it is not an
agen	t, servant or employee of the State, and that it is responsible for	or its own acts and deeds and for
those	e of its agents or employees during the performance of contrac	t work.

Neither party hereto intends to waive, relinquish, limit or condition its right to avoid any such liability by claiming its governmental immunity.

When notified by the State to do so, the other party hereto shall within thirty (30) days from receipt of the State's written notification pay the State for the full cost of repairing any damages to the highway facility which may result from its construction, maintenance or operation of the facility, and shall promptly reimburse the State for costs of construction and/or repair work made necessary by reason of such damages.

Nothing in this agreement shall be construed as creating any liability in favor of any third party against the State and the <u>City of South Padre Island</u>. Additionally, this agreement shall not ever be construed as relieving any third party from any liability against the State and the <u>City of South Padre Island</u>, but the <u>City of South Padre Island</u>, but the <u>Shall be come fully subrogated to the State and shall be entitled to maintain any action over and against the third party which may be liable for having caused the <u>City of South Padre Island</u> to pay or disburse any sum of money hereunder.</u>

13. INSURANCE

 City of South Padre Island
 shall provide necessary safeguards to

 protect the public on State maintained highways including adequate insurance for payment of any

 damages which might result during the construction, maintenance and operation of the facility

 occupying such airspace or thereafter, and to save the State harmless from damages, to the extent of

 said insurance coverage and insofar as it can legally do so.
 Prior to beginning work on the State's

 right of way, the
 City of South Padre Island
 's construction contractor

 shall submit to the State a completed insurance form (TxDOT Form No. 1560) and shall maintain the
 required coverage during the construction of the facility.

14. USE OF RIGHT OF WAY

It is understood that the State by execution of this agreement does not impair or relinquish the State's right to use such land for highway purposes when it is required for the construction or re-construction of the traffic facility for which it was acquired, nor shall use of the land under such agreement ever be construed as abandonment by the State of such land acquired for highway purposes, and the State does not purport to grant any interest in the land described herein but merely consents to such use to the extent its authority and title permits.

15. ADDITIONAL CONSENT REQUIRED

The State asserts only that it has sufficient title for highway purposes. The <u>City of South Padre Island</u> shall be responsible for obtaining such additional consent, permits or agreement as may be necessary due to this agreement. This includes, but is not limited to, appropriate permits and clearances for environmental, ADA and public utilities.

16. FHWA ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

If the Facility is located on the Federal-Aid Highway System, "ATTACHMENT A", which states additional requirements as set forth in the Federal Highway Administration's Title 23, Code of Federal Regulations, § 710, shall be attached to and become a part of this agreement.

17. CIVIL RIGHTS ASSURANCES

The <u>City of South Padre Island</u>, for itself, its personal representatives, successors and interests and assigns, as part of the consideration hereof, does hereby covenant and agree as a covenant running with the land that: (1) no persons, on the grounds of race, color, sex, age, national origin, religion or disabling condition, shall be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination in the use of said facility; (2) that in the construction of any improvements on, over or under such land and the furnishing of services thereon, no person on the ground of race, color, sex, age, national origin, religion or disabling condition, shall be excluded from participation in, denied the benefits of, or otherwise be subjected to discrimination; (3) that the

City of South Padre Island shall use the premises in compliance with all other requirements imposed by or pursuant to Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Department of Transportation, Subtitle A, Office of the Secretary, Part 21, Non-discrimination in Federally-Assisted programs of the Department of Transportation - Effectuation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and as said Regulations may be amended.

That if in the event of any breach of the above non-discrimination covenants, the State shall have the right to terminate the agreement and reenter and repossess said land and the facilities thereon, and hold the same as if said agreement had never been made or issued.

18. AMENDMENTS

Any changes in the time frame, character or responsibilities of the parties hereto shall be enacted by a written amendment executed by both parties hereto.

19. LEGAL CONSTRUCTION

In case one or more of the provisions contained in this agreement shall for any reason be held invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability shall not affect any provision hereof and this agreement shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained in this agreement.

Inasmuch as this project is on the Federal-Aid highway system, the following additional requirements as applicable with the Federal Highway Administration's Title 23, Code of Federal Regulations, § 710.

- 1. Any significant revision in the design or construction of the facility shall receive prior approval by the Texas Department of Transportation subject to concurrency by the FHWA.
- 2. Any change in the authorized use of airspace shall receive prior approval by the Texas Department of Transportation subject to concurrence by the FHWA.
- 3. The airspace shall not be transferred, assigned or conveyed to another party without prior Texas Department of Transportation approval subject to concurrence by the FHWA.
- 4. This agreement will be revocable in the event that the airspace facility ceases to be used or is abandoned.

ANDREW HOWARD LLC. ("the Consultant") is pleased to submit this letter agreement (the "Agreement") to City of South Padre Island ("the Client") for providing Transit Planning Services. Our project understanding, scope of services, schedule, and fee are below.

Understanding

The City of South Padre and the rural transit provider, the Wave, are seeking to expand ridership of the system by providing greater access to transit. A feasibility study is proposed to define the cost and benefits of constructing a park and ride facility at the gateway to the City. The intent is to transfer visitors to the island arriving via car to a bus for circulation between beach and other attractions. It is believed that the improvement will also provide greater efficiency to everyday commuter trips.

The Wave currently shares limited office space with the City of South Padre. Defining the feasibility of constructing and maintaining an administrative office for the Wave will be uncovered during this planning process. Opportunities for cost sharing with the South Padre Island Tourism Information and Visitor Center will be explored. The result of the feasibility study will be a clear understanding of costs, benefits and FTA funding eligibility of the project.

Approach

FTA prefers there to be a planning basis for every project or for every group of federally funded projects. Planning studies at varying levels of detail are typically undertaken in support of projects to acquire, install, or construct major transit facilities. The majority of successful FTA grant applications cite and summarize pertinent parts of these studies. The paragraphs that follow provide guidance to their content:

(1) Passenger Amenities.

(a)Passenger Shelters-Passenger shelters proposed at load and transfer points, park-and-ride stations, employment concentrations, and housing concentrations for the elderly and persons with disabilities are eligible for FTA assistance. A program for bus shelters should be developed for existing and proposed network <u>based</u> on the operator's shelter criteria, and, in the case
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of significant increases, should be included in the grant application. A map indicating the transit network and shelter location should accompany the shelter program.

(b) Transfer Facility or Transportation Center --The basis for a new transfer facility or transportation center should be documented in a planning study. Elements would include a determination of transit demand and other use, an evaluation of existing transfer facilities or sites to satisfy existing and future transit needs, evaluation and selection of sites if a new facility is warranted, preliminary concept design and cost estimate of the transit transfer facility, development of a staging and financing plan, and environmental documentation for the new facility.

(c) Park-and-ride Facilities-- The basis for a new park-and-ride lot should be documented in a planning study. Generally, activities would include an evaluation of demand and service needs, evaluation of sites to satisfy existing and future transit needs, preliminary concept design of the park-and-ride lots, development of a staging and financing plan, and environmental documentation for the new facility.

(2) Administrative Facilities. The basis for new administrative facilities or major expansion or renovations of existing facilities should be documented in a planning study. Activities would include an evaluation of the condition and adequacy of the existing facility, development of site evaluation criteria, identification and evaluation of alternative sites based upon site evaluation and design requirements, final site selection and preliminary concept building design, environmental documentation, and the development of a staging and financing plan.

Scope of Services

Fundamentally all FTA projects need preliminary cost estimates and shared facility projects need cost allocation information. It is also recommended that this Feasibility Study analyze long term costs to maintain the facility (i.e. utilities, repairs, taxes, etc.) The exploration of a long-term shared use agreement with the Texas Department of Transportation for R-O-W use will be explored as part of this feasibility.

- 1. Determination of Existing and Future Transit Operations and Administrative Needs
 - a. Park and Ride and Administrative Office sized to accommodate the transit needs of the users.
 - b. Basis for evaluating existing facilities sizing and designing new facility.
 - c. Space for future expansion -future need reasonably supported
- 2. Evaluation of Existing Facility to Satisfy Existing and Future Transit Operations and Administrative Needs
 - a. Define existing facilities
 - Condition of existing facility evaluated to consider structural soundness, condition of various building systems
 - Identify costs necessary to correct existing facility and to properly equip the present facility.
- 3. Evaluation and Selection of Site If New Facility is Warranted
 - a. Adequacy of site area and shape to accommodate existing and projected

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ANDREW HOWARD LLC STANDARD PROVISIONS

(1) **Consultant's Scope of Services and Additional Services.** The Consultant's undertaking to perform professional services extends only to the services specifically described in this Agreement. However, if requested by the Client and agreed to by the Consultant, the Consultant will perform additional services ("Additional Services"), and such Additional Services shall be governed by these provisions. Unless otherwise agreed to in writing, the Client shall pay the Consultant for the performance of any Additional Services an amount based upon the Consultant's then-current hourly rates plus an amount to cover certain direct expenses including in-house duplicating, local mileage, telephone calls, postage, and word processing. Other direct expenses will be billed at 1.15 times cost. Technical use of computers for design, analysis, GIS, and graphics, etc., will be billed at \$25.00 per hour.

(2) Client's Responsibilities. In addition to other responsibilities described herein or imposed by law, the Client shall:

(a) Designate in writing a person to act as its representative with respect to this Agreement, such person having complete authority to transmit instructions, receive information, and make or interpret the Client's decisions.

(b) Provide all information and criteria as to the Client's requirements, objectives, and expectations for the project including all numerical criteria that are to be met and all standards of development, design, or construction.

(c) Provide to the Consultant all previous studies, plans, or other documents pertaining to the project and all new data reasonably necessary in the Consultant's opinion, such as site survey and engineering data, environmental impact assessments or statements, zoning or other land use regulations, etc., upon all of which the Consultant may rely.

(d) Arrange for access to the site and other private or public property as required for the Consultant to provide its services.

(e) Review all documents or oral reports presented by the Consultant and render in writing decisions pertaining thereto within a reasonable time so as not to delay the services of the Consultant.

(f) Furnish approvals and permits from governmental authorities having jurisdiction over the project and approvals and consents from other parties as may be necessary for completion of the Consultant's services.

(g) Cause to be provided such independent accounting, legal, insurance, cost estimating and overall feasibility services as the Client may require or the Consultant may reasonably request in furtherance of the project development.

(h) Give prompt written notice to the Consultant whenever the Client becomes aware of any development that affects the scope and timing of the Consultant's services or any defect or noncompliance in any aspect of the project.

(i) Bear all costs incident to the responsibilities of the Client.

(3) **Period of Services.** Unless otherwise stated herein, the Consultant will begin work timely after receipt of an executed copy of this Agreement and will complete the services in a reasonable time. This Agreement is made in anticipation of conditions permitting continuous and orderly progress through completion of the services. Times for performance shall be extended as necessary for delays or suspensions due to circumstances that the Consultant does not control. If such delay or suspension extends for more than six months (cumulatively), Consultant's compensation shall be renegotiated.

(4) Method of Payment. Compensation shall be paid to the Consultant in accordance with the following provisions:

(a) Invoices will be submitted periodically, via regular mail or email, for services performed and expenses incurred. Payment of each invoice will be due within 25 days of receipt. The Client shall also pay any applicable sales tax. All retainers will be held by the Consultant for the duration of the project and applied against the final invoice. Interest will be added to accounts not paid within 25 days at the rate of 12% per annum beginning on the 25th day. If the Client fails to make any payment due the Consultant under this or any other agreement within 30 days after the Consultant's transmittal of its invoice, the Consultant may, after giving notice to the Client, suspend services until all amounts due are paid in full.

(b) If the Client objects to an invoice, it must advise the Consultant in writing giving its reasons within 14 days of receipt of the invoice or the Client's objections will be waived, and the invoice shall conclusively be deemed due and owing.

(c) If the Consultant initiates legal proceedings to collect payment, it may recover, in addition to all amounts due, its reasonable attorneys' fees, reasonable experts' fees, and other expenses related to the proceedings. Such expenses shall include the cost, at the Consultant's normal hourly billing rates, of the time devoted to such proceedings by its employees.

(d) The Client agrees that the payment to the Consultant is not subject to any contingency or condition. The Consultant may negotiate payment of any check tendered by the Client, even if the words "in full satisfaction" or words intended to have similar effect appear on the check without such negotiation being an accord and satisfaction of any disputed debt and without prejudicing any right of the Consultant to collect additional amounts from the Client.

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(5) Use of Documents. All documents, including but not limited to drawings, specifications, reports, and data or programs stored electronically, prepared by the Consultant are related exclusively to the services described in this Agreement, and may be used only if the Client has satisfied all of its obligations under this Agreement. They are not intended or represented to be suitable for use, partial use or reuse by the Client or others on extensions of this project or on any other project. Any modifications made by the Client to any of the Consultant's documents, or any use, partial use or reuse of the documents without written authorization or adaptation by the Consultant will be at the Client's sole risk and without liability to the Consultant, and the Client shall indemnify, defend and hold the Consultant harmless from all claims, damages, losses and expenses, including but not limited to attorneys' fees, resulting therefrom. Any authorization or adaptation will entitle the Consultant to further compensation at rates to be agreed upon by the Client and the Consultant. Any electronic files not containing an electronic seal are provided only for the convenience of the Client, and use of them is at the Client's sole risk. In the case of any defects in the electronic files or any discrepancies between them and the hardcopy of the documents prepared by the Consultant, the hardcopy shall govern. Only printed copies of documents conveyed by the Consultant may be relied upon. Because data stored in electronic media format can deteriorate or be modified without the Consultant's authorization, the Client has 60 days to perform acceptance tests, after which it shall be deemed to have accepted the data.

(6) **Opinions of Cost.** Because the Consultant does not control the cost of labor, materials, equipment or services furnished by others, methods of determining prices, or competitive bidding or market conditions, any opinions rendered as to costs, including but not limited to opinions as to the costs of construction and materials, shall be made on the basis of its experience and represent its judgment as an experienced and qualified professional, familiar with the industry. The Consultant cannot and does not guarantee that proposals, bids or actual costs will not vary from its opinions of cost. If the Client wishes greater assurance as to the amount of any cost, it shall employ an independent cost estimator. Consultant's services required to bring costs within any limitation established by the Client will be paid for as Additional Services.

(7) **Termination.** The obligation to provide further services under this Agreement may be terminated by either party upon seven days' written notice in the event of substantial failure by the other party to perform in accordance with the terms hereof through no fault of the terminating party, or upon thirty days' written notice for the convenience of the terminating party. If any change occurs in the ownership of the Client, the Consultant shall have the right to immediately terminate this Agreement. In the event of any termination, the Consultant shall be paid for all services rendered and expenses incurred to the effective date of termination, and other reasonable expenses incurred by the Consultant as a result of such termination. If the Consultant's compensation is a fixed fee, the amount payable for services will be a proportional amount of the total fee based on the ratio of the amount of the services performed, as reasonably determined by the Consultant, to the total amount of services which were to have been performed.

(8) **Insurance.** The Consultant carries Workers' Compensation insurance, professional liability insurance, and general liability insurance. If the Client directs the Consultant to obtain increased insurance coverage, the Consultant will take out such additional insurance, if obtainable, at the Client's expense.

(9) **Standard of Care.** In performing its professional services, the Consultant will use that degree of care and skill ordinarily exercised, under similar circumstances, by reputable members of its profession in the same locality at the time the services are provided. No warranty, express or implied, is made or intended by the Consultant's undertaking herein or its performance of services, and it is agreed that the Consultant is not a fiduciary with respect to the Client.

(10) **LIMITATION OF LIABILITY.** In recognition of the relative risks and benefits of the Project to both the Client and the Consultant, the risks have been allocated such that the Client agrees, to the fullest extent of the law, and notwithstanding any other provisions of this Agreement or the existence of applicable insurance coverage, that the total liability, in the aggregate, of the Consultant and the Consultant's officers, directors, employees, agents, and subconsultants to the Client or to anyone claiming by, through or under the Client, for any and all claims, losses, costs or damages whatsoever arising out of, resulting from or in any way related to the services under this Agreement from any cause or causes, including but not limited to, the negligence, professional errors or omissions, strict liability or breach of contract or any warranty, express or implied, of the Consultant or the Consultant's officers, directors, employees, agents, and subconsultants, shall not exceed twice the total compensation received by the Consultant under this Agreement or \$50,000, whichever is greater. Higher limits of liability may be negotiated for additional fee. Under no circumstances shall the Consultant be liable to the Client or those claiming by or through the Client for lost profits or consequential damages, for extra costs or other consequences due to changed conditions, or for costs related to the failure of contractors to perform work in accordance with the plans and specifications. This Section 10 is intended solely to

limit the remedies available to the Client or those claiming by or through the Client, and nothing in this Section 10 shall require the Client to indemnify the Consultant.

(11) **Certifications.** The Consultant shall not be required to execute certifications or third-party reliance letters that are inaccurate, that relate to facts of which the Consultant does not have actual knowledge, or that would cause the Consultant to violate applicable rules of professional responsibility.

(12) **Dispute Resolution.** All claims by the Client arising out of this Agreement or its breach shall be submitted first to mediation in accordance with the Construction Industry Mediation Rules of the American Arbitration Association as a condition precedent to litigation. Any mediation or civil action by Client must be commenced within one year of the accrual of the cause of action asserted but in no event later than allowed by applicable statutes.

(13) Hazardous Substances and Conditions.

(a) Services related to determinations involving hazardous substances or conditions, as defined by federal or state law, are limited to those tasks expressly stated in the scope of services. In any event, Consultant shall not be a custodian, transporter, handler, arranger, contractor, or remediator with respect to hazardous substances and conditions. Consultant's services will be limited to professional analysis, recommendations, and reporting, including, when agreed to, plans and specifications for isolation, removal, or remediation.

(b) The Consultant shall notify the Client of hazardous substances or conditions not contemplated in the scope of services of which the Consultant actually becomes aware. Upon such notice by the Consultant, the Consultant may stop affected portions of its services until the hazardous substance or condition is eliminated. The parties shall decide if Consultant is to proceed with its services and if Consultant is to conduct testing and evaluations, and the parties may enter into further agreements as to the additional scope, fee, and terms for such services.

(14) Construction Phase Services.

(a) If the Consultant's services include the preparation of documents to be used for construction and the Consultant is not retained to make periodic site visits, the Client assumes all responsibility for interpretation of the documents and for construction observation, and the Client waives any claims against the Consultant in any way connected thereto.

(b) If the Consultant provides construction phase services, the Consultant shall have no responsibility for any contractor's means, methods, techniques, equipment choice and usage, sequence, schedule, safety programs, or safety practices, nor shall Consultant have any authority or responsibility to stop or direct the work of any contractor. The Consultant's visits will be for the purpose of endeavoring to provide the Client a greater degree of confidence that the completed work of its contractors will generally conform to the construction documents prepared by the Consultant. Consultant neither guarantees the performance of contractors, nor assumes responsibility for any contractor's failure to perform its work in accordance with the contract documents.

(c) The Consultant is not responsible for any duties assigned to the design professional in the construction contract that are not expressly provided for in this Agreement. The Client agrees that each contract with any contractor shall state that the contractor shall be solely responsible for job site safety and for its means and methods; that the contractor shall indemnify the Client and the Consultant for all claims and liability arising out of job site accidents; and that the Client and the Consultant shall be made additional insureds under the contractor's general liability insurance policy.

(15) No Third-Party Beneficiaries; Assignment and Subcontracting. This Agreement gives no rights or benefits to anyone other than the Client and the Consultant, and all duties and responsibilities undertaken pursuant to this Agreement will be for the sole benefit of the Client and the Consultant. The Client shall not assign or transfer any rights under or interest in this Agreement, or any claim arising out of the performance of services by Consultant, without the written consent of the Consultant. The Consultant reserves the right to augment its staff with subconsultants as it deems appropriate due to project logistics, schedules, or market conditions. If the Consultant exercises this right, the Consultant will maintain the agreed-upon billing rates for services identified in the contract, regardless of whether the services are provided by in-house employees, contract employees, or independent subconsultants.

(16) **Confidentiality.** The Client consents to the use and dissemination by the Consultant of photographs of the project and to the use by the Consultant of facts, data and information obtained by the Consultant in the performance of its services. If, however, any facts, data or information are specifically identified in writing by the Client as confidential, the Consultant shall use reasonable care to maintain the confidentiality of that material.

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(17) **Miscellaneous Provisions.** This Agreement is to be governed by the law of the State of Texas. This Agreement contains the entire and fully integrated agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous negotiations, representations, agreements or understandings, whether written or oral. Except as provided in Section 1, this Agreement can be supplemented or amended only by a written document executed by both parties. Provided, however, that any conflicting or additional terms on any purchase order issued by the Client shall be void and are hereby expressly rejected by the Consultant. Any provision in this Agreement that is unenforceable shall be ineffective to the extent of such unenforceability without invalidating the remaining provisions. The non-enforcement of any provision by either party shall not constitute a waiver of that provision nor shall it affect the enforceability of that provision or of the remainder of this Agreement.
