AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER 18 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES BY ADDING A NEW SEC. 18-21 PROVIDING THAT IN PROSECUTION OF OFFENSES INVOLVING THE STOPPING, STANDING, OR PARKING OF AN UNATTENDED MOTOR VEHICLE IT IS PRESUMED THAT THE REGISTERED OWNER OF THE VEHICLE IS THE PERSON WHO STOPPED, STOOD, OR PARKED THE VEHICLE AT THE TIME AND PLACE THE OFFENSE OCCURRED; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION NOT TO EXCEED FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$500.00); PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND AUTHORIZING PUBLICATION IN CAPTION FORM.

WHEREAS, the City of South Padre Island has heretofore enacted Chapter 18 (Traffic) of the Code of Ordinances which includes offenses regarding stopping, standing or parking a vehicle; and

WHEREAS, subchapter G of Chapter 545 of the Transportation Code of the State of Texas provides that the governing body of a local authority may provide that in a prosecution of offenses involving the stopping, standing, or parking of an unattended motor vehicle it is presumed that the registered owner of the vehicle is the person who stopped, stood, or parked the vehicle at the time and place the offense occurred; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that such an ordinance should be enacted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS:

<u>Section 1</u>. Chapter 18 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of South Padre Island is hereby amended to add a new Sec. 18-21 to read as follows:

"Sec. 18-21 Presumption.

Any offense under subchapter G of Chapter 545 of the Transportation Code of the State of Texas or this Code of Ordinances in a prosecution of offenses involving the stopping, standing, or parking of an unattended motor vehicle it is presumed that the registered owner of the vehicle is the person who stopped, stood, or parked the vehicle at the time and place the offense occurred."

<u>Section 2</u>. This Ordinance repeals all portions of any prior ordinances or parts of ordinances of the Code of Ordinances in conflict herewith.

<u>Section 3</u>. Any violation of this Ordinance may be punished by a fine not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each offense or for each day such offense shall continue and the penalty provisions of Section 21-1 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby adopted and incorporated for all purposes.

<u>Section 4.</u> If for any reason any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by final judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word or provision of this Ordinance for it is the definite intent of this City Council that

every section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word or provision hereof be given full force and effect for its purpose.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Ordinance shall become effective when published in summary form or by publishing its caption.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 3 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS, BY ADDING A NEW SEC. 3-8.1, AMENDING SEC. 3-9, SEC. 3-10 AND SEC. 3-22 PROVIDES FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF A LOCAL RABIES CONTROL AUTHORITY, DUTIES OF OWNERS OF ANIMALS, QUARANTINE AUTHORITY AND PERSONS AUTHORIZED FOR RABIES CONTROL DUTIES; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING A PENALTY OF FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$500.00) FOR EACH OFFENSE; PROVIDING FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE ORDINANCE; AND AUTHORIZING PUBLICATION IN CAPTION FORM.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. That a new Sec. 3-8.1 be added to Chapter 3 the Code of Ordinances of the City of South Padre Island, Texas, to read as follows:

"Sec. 3-8.1 Local Rabies Control Authority -- appointment.

The City Council will appoint a Local Rabies Control Authority to act pursuant to this Chapter as provided herein and to further handle the impounding and disposal of animals as provided for in this Article. The City of South Padre Island Environmental Health Director shall be designated as the Local Rabies Control Authority for the City of South Padre Island pursuant to section 826.017 of the Texas Health & Safety Code. "

<u>SECTION 2</u>. Sec. 3-9, Sec. 3-10 and Sec. 3-22 of Chapter 3 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of South Padre Island are hereby amended to hereinafter read as follows:

Sec. 3-9 Rabies--Owner quarantine of animal.

"It shall be the duty of every person who owns an animal, or keeps an animal in or on his premises, or on premises under his control, within the city, when such animal shows symptoms of hydrophobia, or has been exposed to such disease, or has injured some person or animal, upon such person being notified by the duly designated Health Official of such fact or facts, to at once cause said animal to be confined and secured by a veterinarian for a period of not less than ten (10) days (240 continuous hours starting at the time of the bite), and until it can be reasonably determined by such Local Rabies Control Authority that such animal is not afflicted with such disease. "

Sec.3-10 "Rabies-- Local Rabies Control Authority quarantine of animal.

In the event no owner, keeper or person in control of an animal showing such symptoms of hydrophobia, or which has been exposed thereto, which has injured some person or animal, can be found by the duly designated Local Rabies Control Authority, it shall be the duty of the Local Rabies Control Authority, or designee, to confine said animal in a secure place for such period of time and until it is determined that such animal is not afflicted with such disease. "

Sec. 3-22 "Persons authorized for Local Rabies Control Authority duties.

The Environmental Health Director or his designee is hereby authorized to carry out the duties of the Local Rabies Control Authority as provided in this Chapter, and to handle the impounding and disposal of animals. Any Police Officer, Policeman or Animal Control Officer is hereby authorized to use tranquilizer guns on animals in order to facilitate handling, impounding and disposal, as provided for in this Chapter."

<u>Section 3</u>. Any violation of this Ordinance may be punished by a fine not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each offense or for each day such offense shall continue and the penalty provisions of Section 21-1 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby adopted and incorporated for all purposes.

<u>Section 4</u>. If for any reason, any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word, or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by final judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word, or provision of this Ordinance, for it is the definite intent of this City Council that every section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word, or provision hereof be given full force and effect for its intended purpose.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall become effective when published in summary form or by publishing its caption.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER 13 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND BY ADDING A NEW SECTION 13-22.2 TO PROVIDE FOR PERMITTING OF TEMPORARY PARKING FACILITIES DURING THE SUMMER IN THE ENTERTAINMENT DISTRICT OF THE CITY; PROVIDING FOR REGULATIONS AND FEES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$500.00) FOR EACH VIOLATION; PROVIDING FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE ORDINANCE; AND PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION IN CAPTION FORM.

WHEREAS, the City of South Padre Island is a beachfront and bay front resort City that experiences during the summer high visitation and traffic in the entertainment district of the City that provides fireworks on the weekend and on holidays; and

WHEREAS, due to a large amount of automobile traffic during the summer and when the fireworks are presented, the required parking for existing facilities becomes inadequate; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to encourage and allow temporary parking facilities during the summer period when there is excessive automobile traffic and boat trailers in the entertainment district.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Code of Ordinances of the City of South Padre Island is hereby amended to add a new Section 13-22.2 to Chapter 13 to read as follows, to-wit:

"Sec. 13-22.2. Permits for Temporary Parking Facilities in the Entertainment District.

During the summer (Friday before Memorial day to the day after Labor day) permits may be issued by the City for temporary parking facilities in the Entertainment District. These permits may be granted with special provisions and requirements that the City Manager or his/her designee may deem necessary to preserve the health and safety of the users and of the neighborhood where said temporary parking is located. Any person or entity desiring to have temporary parking facilities shall comply with the following:

- a) Obtain a permit issued by the City with an initial fee of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) and the City Council by Resolution may change this fee.
- b) The permit must specifically describe in writing where the temporary parking facilities will be located.
- c) The parking area is not required to be paved but it must have a surface that will not allow vehicles to become stuck or encroach in any wetlands.

- d) The City Manager or her/his designee may require that the parking area be fenced with appropriate entrances and exit gates in order to allow for the orderly entrance and exit of traffic to the public streets.
- e) The permit may require that the permit holder provide security, as well as sanitation facilities for the area. No type of business activity may be conducted on or from the permitted parking area other than parking for a fee."

<u>Section 2</u>. Any violation of this Ordinance may be punished by a fine not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each offense or for each day such offense shall continue and the penalty provisions of Section 21-1 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby adopted and incorporated for all purposes.

<u>Section 3</u>. If for any reason, any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word, or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by final judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word, or provision of this Ordinance, for it is the definite intent of this City Council that every section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word, or provision hereof be given full force and effect for its purpose.

Discussion and Action to Approve Resolution No. 2010-15 of the City of South Padre Island, Texas (the "Applicant"), authorizing the submission of four grant applications to the Texas General Land Office ("GLO") Texas Coastal Management Plan ("CMP") and authorizing a designated official to execute all documents and application forms on behalf of the City of South Padre Island.

ITEM BACKGROUND

The Coastal Management Program Grant Cycle 16 is now available. All pre-proposals must be completed by June 23, 3010. However, the City Grant Writer last day is June 16 and applications should be completed before this date. This program allows for beach shoreline access, rehabilitation of vegetation, and other areas of coastal management. The City applied for four applications last cycle. Three of the available projects were previously submitted and the City staff has scores and edits to improve future applications.

Per the last City Council meeting (6/2/10), City staff were directed to fill out four applications. The applications in priority order are:

- 1. Gay Dawn Circle
- 2. Sapphire Circle
- 3. Dune Restoration
- 4. Marina Project

RECOMMENDATIONS/COMMENTS

The Beach and Dune Task Force priorities include: new walkover at Sapphire Circle (#23) and walkover and facility at Gay Dawn Circle (#20). Dune restoration is volunteer project requesting the grantor to purchase the plants.

WHEREAS, the City of South Padre Island has heretofore enacted Chapter 18 (Traffic) of the Code of Ordinances which includes offenses regarding stopping, standing or parking a vehicle; and

WHEREAS, subchapter G of Chapter 545 of the Transportation Code of the State of Texas provides that a vehicle may not stop, stand or park within 30 feet on the approach to a flashing signal, stop sign, yield sign, or traffic control signal located at the side of a roadway or where an official sign prohibits stopping, standing or parking; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that where the side streets (east west) intersect with either Gulf Blvd or Laguna Blvd, the turning radius and line of sight is impaired if any vehicles are parked within 30 feet of the intersection and the same should be prohibited.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS:

<u>Section 1</u>. Chapter 18 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of South Padre Island is hereby amended to add a new Sec. 18-19(A)(18) to read as follows:

Sec. 18-19 Parking--Generally.

- (A) No person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle in any of the following places:
 - "(18) Within 30 feet of the intersection where the side streets (east west) of the City intersect with either Gulf Blvd or Laguna Blvd."

<u>Section 2</u>. This Ordinance repeals all portions of any prior ordinances or parts of ordinances of the Code of Ordinances in conflict herewith.

<u>Section 3</u>. Any violation of this Ordinance may be punished by a fine not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each offense or for each day such offense shall continue and the penalty provisions of Section **21-1** of the Code of Ordinances is hereby adopted and incorporated for all purposes.

<u>Section 4.</u> If for any reason any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by final judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word or provision of this Ordinance for it is the definite intent of this City Council that every section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word or provision of this purpose.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Ordinance shall become effective when published in summary form or by publishing its caption.

(a) An operator may not stop, stand, or park a vehicle:

(5) between a safety zone and the adjacent curb or within 30 feet of a place on the curb immediately opposite the ends of a safety zone, unless the governing body of a municipality designates a different length by signs or markings;

(6) alongside or opposite a street excavation or obstruction if stopping, standing, or parking the vehicle would obstruct traffic;

(7) on a bridge or other elevated structure on a highway or in a highway tunnel;

(8) on a railroad track; or

(9) where an official sign prohibits stopping.

(b) An operator may not, except momentarily to pick up or discharge a passenger, stand or park an occupied or unoccupied vehicle:

(1) in front of a public or private driveway;

- (2) within 15 feet of a fire hydrant;
- (3) within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an intersection;

(4) within 30 feet on the approach to a flashing signal, stop sign, yield sign, or traffic-control signal located at the side of a roadway;

(5) within 20 feet of the driveway entrance to a fire station and on the side of a street opposite the entrance to a fire station within 75 feet of the entrance, if the entrance is properly marked with a sign; or

(6) where an official sign prohibits standing.

(c) An operator may not, except temporarily to load or unload merchandise or passengers, park an occupied or unoccupied vehicle:

- (1) within 50 feet of the nearest rail of a railroad crossing; or
- (2) where an official sign prohibits parking.

(d) A person may stop, stand, or park a bicycle on a sidewalk if the bicycle does not impede the normal and reasonable movement of pedestrian or other traffic on the sidewalk.

(e) A municipality may adopt an ordinance exempting a private vehicle operated by an elevator constructor responding to an elevator emergency from Subsections (a)(1), (a)(5), (a)(6), (a)(9), (b), and (c).

(f) Subsections (a), (b), and (c) do not apply if the avoidance of conflict with other traffic is necessary or if the operator is complying with the law or the directions of a police officer or official traffic-control device.

(g) If the governing body of a municipality determines that it is necessary to improve the economic development of the municipality's central business district and that it will not adversely affect public safety, the governing body may adopt an ordinance regulating the standing, stopping, or parking of a vehicle at a place described by Subsection (a)(1), other than a road or highway in the state highway system, in the central business district of the municipality as defined in the ordinance. To the extent of any conflict between the ordinance and Subsection (a)(1), the ordinance controls.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER 13 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND BY ADDING A NEW SECTION 13-22.3 TO PROVIDE FOR PERMITTING OF TEMPORARY PARKING FACILITIES DURING THE SUMMER IN THE BUSINESS DISTRICT "C" OF THE CITY; PROVIDING FOR REGULATIONS AND FEES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES: PROVIDING A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$500.00) FOR EACH VIOLATION; PROVIDING FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE ORDINANCE; AND PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION IN CAPTION FORM.

WHEREAS, the City of South Padre Island is a beachfront and bay front resort City that experiences during the summer high visitation and traffic in the Business District "C" of the City; and

WHEREAS, due to a large amount of automobile traffic during the summer and the required parking for existing facilities becomes inadequate; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to encourage and allow temporary parking facilities during the summer period when there is excessive automobile traffic and boat trailers in the business district.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Code of Ordinances of the City of South Padre Island is hereby amended to add a new Section 13-22.3 to Chapter 13 to read as follows, to-wit:

"Sec. 13-22.3. Permits for Temporary Parking Facilities in the Business District.

During the summer (Friday before Memorial day to the day after Labor day) permits may be issued by the City for temporary parking facilities in the Business District "C". These permits may be granted with special provisions and requirements that the City Manager or his/her designee may deem necessary to preserve the health and safety of the users and of the neighborhood where said temporary parking is located. Any person or entity desiring to have temporary parking facilities shall comply with the following:

- a) Obtain a permit issued by the City with an initial fee of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) and the City Council by Resolution may change this fee.
- b) The permit must specifically describe in writing where the temporary parking facilities will be located.
- c) The parking area is not required to be paved but it must have a surface that will not allow vehicles to become stuck or encroach in any wetlands.

- d) The City Manager or her/his designee may require that the parking area be fenced with appropriate entrances and exit gates in order to allow for the orderly entrance and exit of traffic to the public streets.
- e) The permit may require that the permit holder provide security, as well as sanitation facilities for the area. No type of business activity may be conducted on or from the permitted parking area other than parking for a fee."

<u>Section 2</u>. Any violation of this Ordinance may be punished by a fine not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each offense or for each day such offense shall continue and the penalty provisions of Section 21-1 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby adopted and incorporated for all purposes.

Section 3. If for any reason, any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word, or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by final judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word, or provision of this Ordinance, for it is the definite intent of this City Council that every section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word, or provision hereof be given full force and effect for its purpose.

<u>Section 4</u>. This Ordinance shall become effective when published in summary form or by publishing its caption.

ORDINANCE NO. 10-24

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER 18 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND BY ADDING A NEW SECTION 13-30 TO PROVIDE FOR PERMITTING AND REGULATING MOTORIZED CARTS AND GOLF CARTS, PROVIDING FOR DEFINITIONS, REQUIRED EQUIPMENT, RESTRICTIONS ON STREETS THAT IT MAY USE, REQUIRED PERMIT AND FEES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING A PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$500.00) FOR EACH VIOLATION; PROVIDING FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE ORDINANCE; AND PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION IN CAPTION FORM.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Code of Ordinances of the City of South Padre Island is hereby amended to add a new Section 18-30 to Chapter 18 to read as follows, to-wit:

"Sec. 18-30. GOLF CARTS.

(A) The following words, terms and phrases when used in this Section, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this Section except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Driver: means the person driving and having physical control over the motorized cart.

<u>Motorized cart</u>: means those electric and gasoline powered carts, commonly referred to as golf carts, but which must have a minimum of four (4) wheels and which have an attainable top speed not greater than twenty-five (25) miles per hour on a paved level surface and which is manufactured in compliance with those federal motor vehicle safety standards for low-speed vehicles. Specifically excluded from this definition are those motorized conveyances commonly referred to as ATVs, four-wheelers, mules, and gators.

Owner: means the person holding title to the motorized cart.

<u>Parking area:</u> means those areas accessible to the public by motor vehicular traffic and which are designated for temporary parking of motor vehicles, usually in places referred to as parking lots.

<u>Street</u>: means the public roadways of the City of South Padre Island by whatever name (e.g., road, alley, avenue, highway, route, boulevard, etc.) that:

- a) Has a posted speed limit of thirty-five (35) miles per hour or less; or
- b) Provides for no more than two (2) lanes of vehicular traffic per direction; or
- c) Is not designated as part of either the state of federal highway system.

(B). Electric and gasoline motorized cart required equipment.

Every motorized cart must be equipped as mandated by the Texas Transportation Code, Section 551.404(a) and/or required by the City of South Padre Island the following:

(1) Operational headlamps;

(2) Operational tail lamps;

(3) Side reflectors;

(4) Operational parking brake; and

(5) Rearview mirror(s).

(6) A reflective triangle shaped slow-moving sign attached and facing to the rear;

(7) Owners of motorized cart must carry valid liability insurance for said cart in the minimum amount required by State law for the operators of a motor vehicle or the driver must carry proof that he/she has such liability insurance.

(8) Driven during daylight hours only.

(9) Be permitted thru the city and display a current (annual) sticker permit at the cost of \$50 per cart and a \$25 replacement fee.

(10) Seatbelts for all passengers.

(C). Gasoline carts.

Every motorized cart powered by gasoline shall at all times be equipped with an exhaust system in good working order and in constant operation and meeting the following specifications:

(1) The exhaust system shall include the piping leading from the flange of the exhaust manifold to and including the muffler and exhaust pipes or including any and all parts specified by the manufacturer.

(2) The exhaust system and its elements shall be securely fastened with brackets or hangers, which are designed for the particular purpose of fastening motorized cart exhaust systems.

(3) The engine and powered mechanism of every motorized cart shall be so equipped, adjusted and tuned so that the exhaust is the amount of a motorized cart in good working order.

(4) It shall be unlawful for the owner of any motorized cart to operate or permit the operation of such cart on which any device controlling or abating atmospheric emissions which is placed on a cart by the manufacturer is rendered unserviceable by removal, alteration or which interferes with its operation.

(D) Operation regulations.

(1) All drivers of motorized carts shall hold a valid Texas driver's license and shall abide by all traffic regulations applicable to vehicular traffic when using the authorized streets and parking areas of the city.

(2) Motorized carts shall not be operated on sidewalks at any time.

(3) All motorized carts are entitled to a full use of a lane on the authorized streets and parking areas of the city and no motor vehicle shall be driven in such a manner as to deprive any motorized cart of the full use of a lane.

(4) The driver of a motorized cart shall not overtake and pass in the same lane occupied by the vehicle being overtaken.

(5) No driver shall operate a motorized cart between lanes of traffic or between adjacent lines of rows of vehicles.

(6) The driver of a motorized cart may cross a multi-lane or a county or state route only at a signalized intersection.

(7) Driving on Padre Blvd. (PR 100) is prohibited.

(8) Motorized carts may only cross Padre Blvd at a signalized intersection.

(E) Liability.

Nothing in this Section shall be construed as an assumption of liability by the City of South Padre Island for any injuries to persons, pets or property which may result from the operation of a motorized cart by an authorized driver.

Owners are fully liable and accountable for the actions of any individual that they provide permission to operate and drive said motorized cart, both on personal and/or city and public properties. This described liability responsibility especially applies to personal injuries or property damage resulting from motorized cart drivers who are minors under the age of twentyone (21) with or without a current and valid Texas drivers license.

(F). Penalties.

Any person who violates the terms of this Section shall be penalized as provided by Sec. 21-1 of the Code of Ordinances."

<u>Section 2</u>. Any violation of this Ordinance may be punished by a fine not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each offense or for each day such offense shall continue and the penalty provisions of Section 21-1 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby adopted and incorporated for all purposes.

Section 3. If for any reason, any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word, or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by final judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word, or provision of this Ordinance, for it is the definite intent of this City Council that every section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word, or provision hereof be given full force and effect for its purpose.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Ordinance shall become effective when published in summary form or by publishing its caption.

The City currently offers Retiree Medical Insurance to the city employees who have a minimum of 25 years of service with the City of SPI. This amendment will lower the minimum years required to be eligible for the city contribution (\$5.00 X Years of Service = City Contribution) to 20 years, which will be parallel to the retirement years of service established with Texas Municipal Retirement System (TMRS).

Informational note: If an employee chooses to pay for retiree medical insurance at the current premium of \$522.83/month from the age of 50 to the age of 65 (when qualified for Medicare) a retiree will pay \$94,000 in retirement income to medical insurance premiums before the age of 65.

40.1 Retiree Medical Insurance

The Town of South Padre Island will provide group medical insurance to employees retiring from TMRS with a minimum of twenty-five (25) twenty (20) years of service with the Town of South Padre Island. All years of service must be worked for the Town of South Padre Island.

Retiring employees who meet the eligibility requirements and have at least twenty-five (25) (20) years of continuous full time employment will be granted service credits. A retiree is only eligible to receive a Town contribution for retiree medical insurance if the employee is at least fifty (50) years of age at the time of retirement.

Service credits will be calculated as five (5) dollars for each year of service for a retiree who has twenty-five (25) (20) to thirty (30) years of service with the Town of South Padre Island. A maximum of thirty (30) years of service credit will be applied to retiree medical coverage premiums.

(i.e. \$5.00 X 25 years of service = \$125.00 applied towards the retirees' monthly premium).

Once the retiree opts out of the retiree medical insurance program, the Town of South Padre Island's obligation to contribute funds to this benefit is ended and the retiree may not participate in the future.

Service credits can only be applied to retiree premiums only. Any excess credits cannot be used for dependent coverage.

The cost to the retiree is 100% of the applicable premiums minus any serve credit amount.

The Town will only contribute to the Town's designated retiree medical insurance plan. The Town will not contribute to any other medical insurance plans.

Employees retiring with less than twenty-five (25) (20) years of service will be eligible to continue on the medical insurance plan at their own expense. Dependents that are enrolled on the Town's health plan at the time of the employee's retirement are eligible to continue on the plan at the retiree's expense.

When a retiree or their dependent(s) become eligible for Medicare or reach the age of sixty-five (65) the Town insurance will cease. If for any reason, other than death, the retired employee terminates from the Town insurance plan, the dependent(s) covered will also terminate. Retirees or dependent(s) that have terminated their insurance with the Town will not be eligible to re-enroll on the Town's health plan at any time in the future.
