



Causes

Harmful bacteria are the most common cause of food poisoning, but there are many other causes, including the following:
•Bacteria and Viruses

•Molds, Toxins, and Contaminants

Parasites

•Allergens

Long-Term Effects

One in six Americans will get sick from food poisoning this year. Most of them will recover without any lasting effects from their illness. For some, however, the effects can be devastating and even deadly.

Serious long-term effects associated with several common types of food poisoning include:

Kidney failure

 Brain and nerve damage Chronic arthritis

Certain groups of people are more susceptible to foodborne illness. This means that they are more likely to get sick from contaminated food and, if they do get sick, the effects are much more serious. These groups include: Persons with chronic illnesses Pregnant women Older adults
