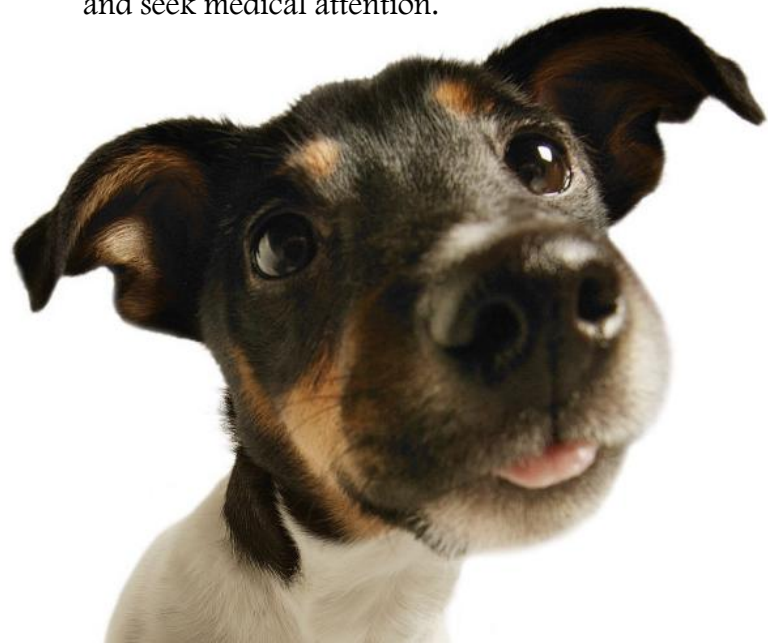


# ANIMAL CONTROL STATS July 2010

## TIP OF THE MONTH:

When confronted with wildlife, such as bees, opossums or coyotes, take caution and alert Animal Control or a professional exterminator. Wild animals and insects have a natural survival instinct that causes them to react. They may not know that you are trying to help them. A bite or a sting can result in serious injury or death. If you are bitten or stung by an insect, seek medical attention if you have allergic reactions such as difficulty breathing. If you are bitten or scratched by an animal, notify Animal Control and seek medical attention.

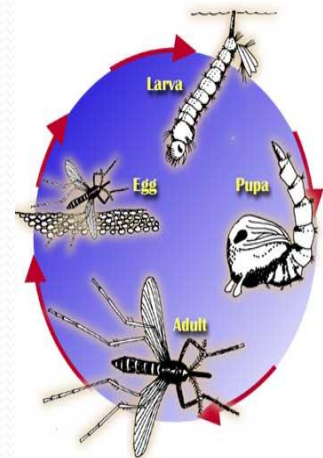

## How Do People Contract Arbovirus Encephalitis?

Any person can become infected when a mosquito carrying one of these viruses bites them.

Mosquitoes obtain the virus when feeding on infected birds and other wild animals, which are the natural carriers of these viruses. Human infections occur most commonly between late spring and early fall. There is no evidence that the diseases are spread directly from one person to another.
