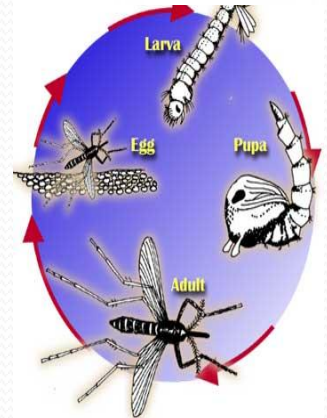

“ Mosquitoes are believed to have evolved around 170 million years ago during the Jurassic era (206-135 million years ago) with the earliest known fossil from the Cretaceous era (144-65 million years ago). They are thought to have evolved in South America, spreading initially to the northern continent Laurasia and re-entering the tropics from the north. Some ancestral mosquitoes were about three times the size of the extant species and they are a sister group to the Chaoboridae (biting midges).”
