INVESTMENT POLICY

Adopted August 7, 2019 July 1, 2020

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#### INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this document is to set forth specific investment policy and strategy guidelines for the City of South Padre Island (the "City") and the South Padre Island Economic Development Corporation (the "EDC") to achieve the goals of safety, liquidity, public trust, and yield for all investment activity. The City Council of the City and Board of Directors of the EDC shall review its investment strategies and policy not less than annually. This Policy serves to satisfy the statutory requirement (specifically the Public Funds Investment Act, Government Code chapter 2256, (the "PFIA")) to define, adopt and review a formal investment strategy and policy.

Throughout this Investment Policy, the City and EDC shall be collectively referred to as "SOUTH PADRE."

#### INVESTMENT POLICY

#### I. SCOPE

This Investment Policy applies to all financial assets of SOUTH PADRE. The funds are accounted for in SOUTH PADRE's Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) and include (but are not limited to):

- General Fund
- Special Revenue Funds
- Debt Service Funds
- Capital Projects Funds
- Economic Development Funds

#### II. OBJECTIVES

SOUTH PADRE shall manage and invest its cash with the objectives (listed in order of priority): Safety, Liquidity, Public Trust, and Yield. The safety of the principal invested always remains the primary objective. All investments

shall be designed and managed in a manner responsive to the public trust and consistent with State and Local law.

SOUTH PADRE shall utilize cash management procedures which include collection of accounts receivable, vendor payment in accordance with invoice terms, and prudent investment of available cash. Cash management is defined as the process of managing monies to ensure maximum cash availability and interest earnings on short-term investment of idle cash.

#### Safety

The primary objective of SOUTH PADRE's investment activity is the preservation of capital in the overall portfolio. Each investment transaction shall be conducted in a manner to avoid capital losses, whether they are from securities defaults or erosion of market value.

#### Liquidity

The investment portfolio shall be structured such that SOUTH PADRE is able to meet all obligations in a timely manner. This shall be achieved by matching investment maturities with forecasted cash flow requirements, maintaining adequate levels of highly liquid investments and by investing in securities with active secondary markets.

#### Public Trust

In addition to achieving the stated objectives, all participants in SOUTH PADRE's investment process shall seek to act responsibly as custodians of the public trust. Investment Officers shall avoid any transaction which might impair public confidence in SOUTH PADRE's ability to govern effectively.

#### Yield

The investment portfolio shall be designed with the objective of regularly exceeding the average rate of return on three-month U.S. Treasury Bills. The investment program shall seek to augment returns above this threshold consistent with risk limitations identified herein and prudent investment

policies. To determine portfolio performance, this Policy establishes "weighted average yield to maturity" as the standard calculation.

#### INVESTMENT STRATEGY

SOUTH PADRE maintains portfolios which utilize four specific investment strategy considerations designed to address the unique characteristics of the fund groups represented in the portfolios:

- A. Investment strategies for operating fund and commingled pools containing operating funds have as their primary objective to assure that anticipated cash flows are matched with adequate investment liquidity. The secondary objective is to create a portfolio structure which will experience minimal volatility during economic cycles. This may be accomplished by purchasing high quality, short to mediumterm investments that will complement each other in a laddered or barbell maturity structure with a maximum maturity of two years. The dollar weighted average maturity of 365 days or less will be calculated using the stated final maturity date of each investment. Funds shall be managed and invested with the objectives (listed in order of priority): Safety, Liquidity, Public Trust, and Yield.
- B. Investment strategies for debt service funds shall have as the primary objective the assurance of investment liquidity adequate to cover the debt service obligation on the required payment date. Investments purchased shall not have a stated final maturity date which exceeds the next unfunded debt service payment date. Funds shall be managed and invested with the objectives (listed in order of priority): Safety, Liquidity, Public Trust, and Yield.
- C. Investment strategies for debt service reserve funds shall have as the primary objective the ability to generate a dependable revenue stream to the appropriate debt service fund from investments with a low degree of volatility. Investments should be of high quality and, except as may be required by the bond ordinance specific to an individual issue, of short to intermediate-term maturities with a maximum maturity of five years. Funds shall be managed and invested with the

objectives (listed in order of priority): Safety, Liquidity, Public Trust, and Yield.

- D. Investment strategies for special projects or special purpose fund portfolios will have as their primary objective to assure that anticipated cash flows are matched with adequate investment liquidity. These portfolios should include at least 10% in cash equivalent investments to allow for flexibility and unanticipated project outlays. The stated final maturity dates of investments held should not exceed the estimated project completion date. Funds shall be managed and invested with the objectives (listed in order of priority): Safety, Liquidity, Public Trust, and Yield.
- E. Investment strategies for Economic Development Funds will consider that these fund balances are designated for economic development projects and will be scheduled by the South Padre Economic Development Corporation. In addition to considerations addressed in the balance of this Investment Policy, the maximum weighted average maturity of Economic Development Funds shall not exceed two years. The maximum maturity of an individual investment shall not exceed three years. To ensure adequate liquidity for unanticipated cash needs, a portion of the fund balances shall be invested in financial institution deposits, constant dollar investment pools, or money market mutual funds. Any term-specific investments shall be matched with anticipated cash requirements. Funds shall be managed and invested with the objectives (listed in order of priority): Safety, Liquidity, Public Trust, and Yield.

#### III. RESPONSIBILITY AND CONTROL

#### Delegation of Authority and Training

The City Manager and Chief Financial Officer are designated as Investment Officers of SOUTH PADRE. The City Manager shall approve all strategic investment programs prior to implementation. The City's Chief Financial Officer is responsible for day-to-day cash management activities, including, but not limited to, transfers between the City's Primary Depository and

authorized local government investment pools. The City's Chief Financial Officer shall establish procedures for the operation of the cash management and investment programs, consistent with this Investment Policy.

To ensure qualified and capable investment management, each Investment Officer shall attend at least one training session, from an independent training source, and accumulating at least 10 hours of instruction relating to the Officer's responsibility under the PFIA within 12 months after assuming duties. Thereafter, each Investment Officer shall additionally attend at least one training session, from an independent training source, and accumulating at least 8 hours of instruction relating to the Officer's responsibility under the PFIA not less than once in a two-year period that begins on the first day of the City's fiscal year and consists of the two consecutive fiscal years after that date.

The approved independent sources of training are: Government Finance Officers Association of Texas, Government Treasurers' Organization of Texas, Government Finance Officers Association, University of North Texas, Texas City Managers Association, and the Texas Municipal League.

#### **Internal Controls**

The City's Chief Financial Officer is responsible for establishing and maintaining an internal control structure designed to ensure that the assets of SOUTH PADRE are protected from loss, theft or misuse. The internal control structure shall be designed to provide reasonable assurance that these objectives are met. The concept of reasonable assurance recognizes that (1) the cost of a control should not exceed the benefits likely to be derived; and (2) the valuation of costs and benefits requires estimates and judgments by management.

Accordingly, the City's Chief Financial Officer shall establish a process for annual independent review by an external auditor in conjunction with the annual audit to assure compliance with policies and procedures. The internal controls shall address the following points:

#### A. Control of collusion.

- B. Separation of transaction authority from accounting and record keeping.
- C. Custodial safekeeping.
- D. Avoidance of physical delivery securities.
- E. Clear delegation of authority to subordinate staff members.
- F. Written confirmation for telephone (voice) transactions for investments and wire transfers.

#### **Prudence**

The standard of prudence to be applied to the Investment Officers shall be the "prudent person" rule, which states: "Investments shall be made with judgment and care under circumstances then prevailing, which persons of prudence, discretion and intelligence exercise in the management of their own affairs, not for speculation but for investment, considering the probable safety of their capital as well as the probable income to be derived." In determining whether an Investment Officer has exercised prudence with respect to an investment decision, the determination shall be made taking into consideration:

- A. The investment of all funds, or funds under SOUTH PADRE's control, over which the Officer had responsibility rather than a consideration as to the prudence of a single investment.
- B. Whether the investment decision was consistent with the written Investment Policy of SOUTH PADRE.

The Investment Officer, acting in accordance with written procedures and exercising due diligence, shall not be held personally responsible for a specific security's credit risk or market price changes, provided that these deviations are reported immediately to the City Manager and/or the Council and that appropriate action is taken to control adverse developments.

#### Ethics and Conflicts of Interest

Investment Officers shall refrain from personal business activity that could conflict with proper execution of the investment program, or that could impair the ability to make impartial investment decisions and shall disclose to the City Manager any material financial interests in financial institutions that conduct business with SOUTH PADRE. They shall further disclose positions that could be related to the performance of SOUTH PADRE's portfolio. Investment Officers shall subordinate their personal financial transactions to those of SOUTH PADRE, particularly with regard to timing of purchases and sales.

An Investment Officer who has a personal business relationship with an organization seeking to sell an investment to SOUTH PADRE shall file a statement disclosing that personal business interest. An Investment Officer who is related within the second degree by affinity or consanguinity to an individual seeking to sell an investment to SOUTH PADRE shall file a statement disclosing that relationship. A statement required under this subsection must be filed with the Texas Ethics Commission and the governing bodies of SOUTH PADRE.

#### Quarterly Reporting

The Investment Officers shall submit a signed quarterly investment report, crafted in compliance with the PFIA, to the City Manager and each respective governing body, that summarizes current market conditions, economic developments and anticipated investment conditions. The report shall summarize investment strategies employed in the most recent quarter, and describe the portfolio in terms of investment instruments, maturities, risk characteristics, and shall explain the total investment return for the quarter.

At the end of the fiscal year, the Investment Officers shall include information incorporating the full year's investment portfolio activity and performance.

#### Methods

The quarterly investment report shall include a succinct management summary that provides a clear picture of the status of the current investment portfolio and transactions made over the last quarter. This management summary will be prepared in a manner which will allow SOUTH PADRE to ascertain whether investment activities during the reporting period have conformed to the Investment Policy. The report will include the following:

- A. A listing of individual investments held at the end of the reporting period by maturity date.
- B. Unrealized gains or losses resulting from appreciation or depreciation by listing the beginning and ending book and market value of investments for the period.
- C. Average weighted yield to maturity of portfolio on entity investments as compared to applicable benchmarks.
- D. Listing of investments held by fund.
- E. The percentage of the total portfolio which each type of investment represents.
- F. Statement of compliance of SOUTH PADRE's investment portfolio with State Law and the Investment Strategy and Policy approved by the governing bodies.

#### Active Portfolio Management

SOUTH PADRE shall pursue an active versus a passive portfolio management philosophy. That is, investments may be sold before they mature if market conditions present an opportunity for SOUTH PADRE to benefit from the trade. The Investment Officers will routinely monitor the contents of the portfolio, the available markets, and the relative value of competing instruments, and will adjust the portfolio accordingly.

SOUTH PADRE is not required to liquidate investments that were authorized investments at the time of purchase but no longer meet one or more requirements of this Policy.

Not less than quarterly, the Investment Officer will obtain the current credit rating for each held investment from a reliable source to ensure that the investment has maintained the required minimum rating. An investment that requires a minimum rating does not qualify as an authorized investment during the period the investment does not have the minimum rating. SOUTH PADRE shall take all prudent measures that are consistent with this Investment Policy to liquidate an investment that does not have the minimum rating.

#### <u>Investments</u>

Assets of SOUTH PADRE may be invested in the following instruments.

#### 1. Authorized

- A. Obligations of the United States of America, its agencies and instrumentalities, including the Federal Home Loan Banks.
- B. Direct obligations of the State of Texas and agencies thereof.
- C. Other obligations, the principal of and interest on which are unconditionally guaranteed by the State of Texas or United States of America or their respective agencies and instrumentalities, including obligations that are fully guaranteed or insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or by the explicit full faith and credit of the United States.
- D. Obligations of the States, agencies thereof, Counties, Cities, and other political subdivisions of any state having been rated as investment quality by a nationally recognized investment rating firm, and having received a rating of not less than "A" or its equivalent.

- E. Certificates of deposit and other evidences of deposit at a financial institution that, a) has its main office or a branch office in Texas and is guaranteed or insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or its successor, b) is secured by obligations described in Section V. SAFEKEEPING AND CUSTODY and in a manner and amount provided by law for deposits of SOUTH PADRE, or c) is executed through a depository institution or an approved broker that has its main office or a branch office in Texas that meets the requirements of the PFIA.
- F. Fully collateralized direct repurchase agreements with a defined termination date secured by cash or obligations of the United States or its agencies and instrumentalities pledged with a third party, selected by the City's Chief Financial Officer, other than an agency for the pledger. Repurchase agreements must be purchased through a primary government securities dealer, as defined by the Federal Reserve, or a financial institution doing business in Texas.
- G. Texas local government investment pools that seek to maintain a stable dollar asset value, would be described as "government" portfolios, are specifically authorized by the governing bodies of the City of South Padre Island and the South Padre Economic Development Corporation, and comply with the requirements of State law.
- H. Investment pools that provide fixed maturity, fixed yield investments, are specifically authorized by the governing bodies of the City of South Padre Island and the South Padre Economic Development Corporation, and comply with the requirements of State law.
- I. SEC registered, no load, government money market mutual funds that comply with the requirements of State law.

#### 2. Not Authorized

SOUTH PADRE'S authorized investment options are more restrictive than those allowed by State law. State law specially prohibits investment in the following investment securities.

- A. Obligations whose payment represents the coupon payments on the outstanding principal balance of the underlying mortgage-backed security collateral and pays no principal.
- B. Obligations whose payment represents the principal stream of cash flow from the underlying mortgage-backed security collateral and bears no interest.
- C. Collateralized mortgage obligations that have a stated final maturity date of greater than 10 years.
- D. Collateralized mortgage obligations the interest rate of which is determined by an index that adjusts opposite to the changes in a market index.

#### 3. Holding Period

SOUTH PADRE intends to match the holding periods of investment funds with liquidity needs of SOUTH PADRE. In no case will the average maturity of investments of SOUTH PADRE's operating funds exceed one year. The maximum final stated maturity of any investment shall not exceed five years.

#### 4. Risk and Diversification

SOUTH PADRE recognizes that investment risks can result from issuer defaults, market price changes or various technical complications leading to temporary illiquidity. Risk is controlled through portfolio diversification which shall be achieved by the following general guidelines:

- A. Risk of issuer default is controlled by limiting investments to those instruments allowed by the PFIA, which are described herein.
- B. Risk of market price changes shall be controlled by avoiding overconcentration of assets in a specific maturity sector, limitation of dollar weighted average maturity of operating fund investments to one year, and avoidance of over-concentration of assets in specific instruments.

C. All investment funds shall be placed directly with qualified investment providers as authorized by this Investment Policy and the PFIA.

#### IV. SELECTION OF QUALIFYING INSTITUTIONS

All local government investment pool providers must submit an Investment Policy Certification to acknowledge that they have received a copy of the City's current Investment Policy, in compliance with the PFIA.

#### Primary Depository

In compliance with State legislation, a Primary Depository shall be selected through SOUTH PADRE's banking services procurement process, which shall include a formal request for application (RFA). In selecting a Primary Depository, the credit worthiness of institutions shall be considered, and the City's Chief Financial Officer shall conduct a review of prospective depository's credit characteristics and financial history.

#### Broker/Dealers

For broker/dealers of investment securities, SOUTH PADRE may select any dealers reporting to the Market Reports Division of the Federal Reserve Board of New York, also known as the "Primary Government Security Dealers." Other non-primary firms may be utilized if analysis reveals that such firms are adequately financed to conduct public business. Any broker/dealer must have been authorized by the City Council to execute transactions with SOUTH PADRE prior to any such transaction (Appendix A.).

#### V. SAFEKEEPING AND CUSTODY

#### Insurance and Collateral

All financial institution deposits shall be insured or collateralized in compliance with applicable State law. SOUTH PADRE reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to accept or reject any form of insurance or

collateralization pledged towards deposits. Financial institutions serving as SOUTH PADRE depositories will be required to sign a depository agreement with SOUTH PADRE. The collateralized deposit portion of the agreement shall define SOUTH PADRE's rights to the collateral in case of default, bankruptcy, or closing and shall establish a perfected security interest in compliance with Federal and State regulations, including:

- The agreement must be in writing;
- The agreement has to be executed by the depository and SOUTH PADRE contemporaneously with the acquisition of the asset;
- The agreement must be approved by the Board of Directors or authorized Committee of the depository and a copy of the meeting minutes must be delivered to SOUTH PADRE; and
- The Agreement must be part of the depository's "official record" continuously since its execution.

Insurance, Pledged Collateral or Purchased Securities - With the exception of deposits secured with irrevocable letters of credit at 100% of the principal and anticipated accrued interest amount, all deposits of SOUTH PADRE funds with eligible depositories shall be secured by pledged collateral with a market value equal to or greater than 102% of the deposits principal and anticipated accrued interest, less any amount insured by the FDIC. Repurchase agreements shall be documented by a specific agreement noting the "purchased securities" in each agreement. Collateral pledged and purchased securities shall be held at an independent safekeeping agent approved by SOUTH PADRE and reports of said securities reviewed at least monthly to assure the market value equals or exceeds the related SOUTH PADRE investment.

Evidence of the pledged collateral shall be maintained by the City's Chief Financial Officer or a third-third-party financial institution.

#### Custodial Agreement

Collateral pledged to secure deposits of SOUTH PADRE shall be held by a safekeeping institution in accordance with a custodial agreement which clearly defines the procedural steps for gaining access to the collateral should SOUTH PADRE determine that SOUTH PADRE's funds are in jeopardy. The custodial institution, or Custodian, shall be the Federal Reserve Bank or an institution not affiliated with the firm pledging the collateral. A custodial receipt shall be issued to SOUTH PADRE listing the specific investment, CUSIP, rate, maturity, and other pertinent information.

#### Collateral Defined

SOUTH PADRE shall accept only the following as collateral:

- A. FDIC insurance coverage.
- B. A bond, certificate of indebtedness, debenture or letter of credit of the United States or its agencies and instrumentalities, or other evidence of indebtedness of the United States that is guaranteed as to principal and interest by the United States or its agencies and instrumentalities.
- C. Obligations, the principal and interest on which, are conditionally guaranteed or insured by the State of Texas.
- D. A bond of a county, city or other political subdivision of the State of Texas having been rated no less than "A" or its equivalent by a nationally recognized rating agency, with a remaining maturity of ten (10) years or less.
- E. A letter of credit issued to SOUTH PADRE by the Federal Home Loan Bank.

#### Subject to Audit

All collateral shall be subject to inspection and audit by the City's Chief Financial Officer or SOUTH PADRE's independent auditors.

#### Delivery vs. Payment

Investment securities shall be purchased using the delivery vs. payment method. That is, funds shall not be wired or paid until verification has been made that the correct security was received by the safekeeping agent. The security shall be held in an account in the name of SOUTH PADRE or held on behalf of SOUTH PADRE. The safekeeping agent's records shall assure the notation of SOUTH PADRE's ownership of or explicit claim on the securities. The original copy of all safekeeping receipts shall be delivered to SOUTH PADRE.

#### VI. INVESTMENT POLICY ADOPTION

SOUTH PADRE Investment Policy shall be annually reviewed and adopted by action of each respective governing body.

#### ITEM BACKGROUND

The current Padre Boulevard plans have the sidewalk ending on the north end of The Shores. With the new windsports park being planned further north, continuity of the sidewalk would enhance the walk-ability from the current location to the entrance of the windsport park.

The future wind and water sports park is within the vicinity of the Convention Centre and will be connected to the Convention Centre area and reachable via two independent means: (1) by sidewalk (part of which are connected to Padre Boulevard medians), and (2) by a sea-kayak trail.

Two options are being proposed for the sidewalk which would be a 12 foot wide sidewalk versus a 6 foot sidewalk.

On the July 1, 2020 City Council meeting it was approved to proceed forward with the design and bidding.

# AMENDMENT NUMBER 18 TO THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND AND KIMLEY-HORN AND ASSOCIATES, INC.

AMENDMENT NUMBER 18 DATED July \_\_\_, 2020 to the agreement between City of South Padre Island, ("City") and Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc., ("Consultant" or "Kimley-Horn") dated May 18, 2015 ("the Agreement") concerning Padre Boulevard (PR 100) Improvements for Sidewalks and Medians (the "Project").

The Consultant has entered into the Agreement with the City for the furnishing of professional services, and the parties now desire to amend the Agreement.

Therefore, it is mutually agreed that the Agreement is amended to include Additional Services to be performed by Consultant and provisions for additional compensation by the City to the Consultant, all as set forth in Exhibit A hereto. The parties ratify the terms and conditions of the Agreement not inconsistent with this Amendment, all of which are incorporated by reference.

Consultant will perform the following Additional Services:

Prepare construction plans for the proposed sidewalk and driveway within PR 100 (Padre Boulevard) right-of-way just north of The Shores Development in South Padre Island, Texas for the future Wind & Water Sports Park Development. The construction plans are anticipated to include removal sheets, plan and profile sidewalk layouts, driveway plan view layouts, drainage area map, erosion control sheets, and signing and striping layouts. It includes environmental and TxDOT permitting. The City shall establish the sidewalk width prior to starting design, which will be located on the west side of PR

The construction plans will be prepared as a standalone set with the expectation that the City will bid this construction separately, but the construction plans will be considered part of the existing PR 100 Medians, Boardwalk, and Sidewalk plan project for TxDOT. If TxDOT requires a separate permit process (ENV, CSJ #, LOSA), it will be performed as an additional service.

Due to the everchanging circumstances surrounding the COVID-19 Virus, situations may arise during the performance of this Agreement that affect availability of resources and staff of Kimley-Hom, the client, other consultants, and public agencies. There could be changes in anticipated delivery times, jurisdictional approvals, and project costs. Kimley-Hom will exercise reasonable efforts to overcome the challenges presented by current circumstances, but Kimley-Hom will not be liable to Client for any delays, expenses, losses, or damages of any kind arising out of the impact of the COVID-19 Virus.

This amendment includes the following tasks:

#### 1. TOPOGRAPHIC SURVEY

Kimley-Horn, through a subconsultant, will perform topographic survey for the limits shown in Attachment A provided with this amendment. The following items will be performed:

- Limits of topographic survey:
  - Area outlined and hatched in yellow in Attachment A
- Perform field survey ground control
- Locate pertinent objects and above-ground features, which may include:
  - Roadway pavement (including identifying changes in pavement material, i.e. concrete vs asphalt)
  - Sidewalk pavement (including curb ramps, detectable warning surfaces, any change in grade on sidewalk or curb ramp panels)
  - Stairs and railings (identify materials)
  - o Building thresholds (limits and elevations)

- Drainage structures (i.e. culverts, ditches, inlets, manholes, and outfalls) including top of curb/grate elevations: flow line elevations and sizes
- Utilities (signs or markings showing the presence of underground utilities, valves, manholes, flowlines, meters, backflow preventers, vents, hydrants, poles, and guy wires)
- Large (6 inch diameter and up), significant trees (identify species and caliper)
- Limits of landscaped areas will be defined. Individual plants and or trees (less than 6 inch diameter) will not be located
- Fences (including material type and height) and gates (including limits)
- Retaining walls (landscape or structural)
- Street Lights
- Bus Stops (pad and structure)
- o Trash cans
- Existing pavement markings
- Signs (identify sign message and sign face direction)
- Right-of-Way monumentation
- Prepare a final topographic drawing in digital format (including contours and break lines) showing the features located in the field as well as right-of-way information. Digital files will be in .DGN format.

#### 2. ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION RE-EVALUATION

Kimley-Horn, through a subconsultant, will re-evaluate the project to include the proposed Wind Sports sidewalk construction. The re-evaluation will include the following tasks:

#### Perform Field Data Collection

Subconsultant will perform a field visit in order to collect data to enable subconsultant to analyze potential environmental impacts associated with the proposed project, to include potential impacts to waters of the U.S., potential impacts to state listed threatened and endangered species, and potential effects to federally listed threatened and endangered species protected by the Endangered Species Act.

<u>Update Padre Boulevard (PR 100) Median, Boardwalk, and Sidewalk Improvements</u> Project Wetlands/Waters of the U.S. Delineation Report

Subconsultant will update the Wetlands/Waters of the U.S. Delineation Report previously prepared for the Padre Boulevard (PR 100) Median, Boardwalk, and Sidewalk Improvements project to include an evaluation of the data collected via the field data collection task. This document would be completed using the updated guidance provided in the TxDOT Environmental Toolkit.

<u>Update Padre Boulevard (PR 100) Median, Boardwalk, and Sidewalk Improvements Project Tier I Site Assessment and Species Analysis Form and Spreadsheet</u>

Subconsultant will prepare an updated Tier I Site Assessment and a new Species Analysis Form and Species Analysis Spreadsheet for the re-evaluation project. This task would update the previously prepared information for the Padre Boulevard (PR 100) Median, Boardwalk, and Sidewalk Improvements project to include an evaluation of the data collected in the field data collection task and provide the required documentation according to the updated TxDOT Environmental Toolkit.

#### Complete TxDOT Re-evaluation Checklist

The proposed scope of work will include preparation of TxDOT Re-evaluation technical documentation support for review by the City of South Padre Island and TxDOT Pharr District to be prepared in accordance with the most recent TxDOT guidance on reevaluations.

#### Assumptions

- Field data collection will take place along the proposed shared use path location
- Design plans will be made available by the Engineer which will be of sufficient detail to be used for potential impact quantification
- Any right of entry required will be acquired by the City of South Padre Island
- · All document submittals will be done electronically

#### **Exclusions**

- GLO required approvals. The City will be responsible for setting the Dune Protection Line and any GLO / County permitting.
- USACE Section 404 permitting (PCN or IP), this task could be completed under an additional scope and budget
- Completion of presence/absence surveys for endangered species
- · Construction phase services including on-site monitoring
- Work extending beyond the specified limits of the project at the time of this work order
- Section 4(f)/6(f) analyses or statements regarding parkland impacts
- ASTM 1527-13 compliant Database Search
- Hazardous Materials Phase I & Phase II ESAs
- USFWS coordination or consultation
- Intensive or reconnaissance historic structures surveys; assessments of eligibility, or management recommendations for any historic structures
- Archeological permit coordination, reconnaissance or intensive pedestrian survey, monitoring, site testing, or data recovery
- Additional documentation services requested as a result of a change in environmental regulations from those in practice and acceptable at the time of approval of this work authorization

#### 3. SIDEWALK DESIGN

Kimley-Horn will prepare sidewalk design plans for the west side of PR 100 (Padre Boulevard) for the future Wind Sports Development north of the existing Shores Development in South Padre Island, Texas. The sidewalk is anticipated to tie into the previously designed sidewalk along PR 100 on the south end and will end at the proposed driveway for the Wind Sports Development on the north end of this proposed sidewalk segment. The construction plans are anticipated to include plan on profile sidewalk layouts, driveway plan view layouts, drainage area map, erosion control details, and signing and striping layouts. The previously approved drainage area map will be modified to include the proposed improvements.

The City will give Kimley-Horn direction as to where the proposed driveway should be placed and the design criteria for the driveway.

This task does not include improvements to PR 100 roadway pavement.

Kimley-Horn will prepare draft 90% design plan sheets addressing these plan modifications and submit to the City and TxDOT for review and comment. Kimley-Horn will incorporate up to one (1) round of concurrent comments from the City and TxDOT and prepare final sidewalk and driveway construction plans. Submittals will be in .PDF format (11"x17").

### 4. DRIVEWAY PERMITTING AND DESIGN

Kimley-Horn will prepare and submit a driveway permit application (PDF format) to TxDOT and City for review and approval. Kimley-Horn cannot guarantee TxDOT approval of the permit application.

This task does not include improvements to PR 100 roadway pavement, other than striping a northbound left turn lane using the existing travel lanes and paved shoulders.

The City will inform Kimley-Horn on the size of the Wind Sports facility in square feet and estimated daily vehicle traffic generated. The City of South Padre Island will send design files for the Wind Sports Development to Kimley-Horn. Kimley-Horn will use these files to design the proposed driveway within PR 100 ROW using current TxDOT standards. Kimley-Horn will submit the 90% driveway design to City and TxDOT for review and comment. Kimley-Horn will address up to one (1) round of simultaneous comments and prepare final driveway construction plans to be incorporated into the previously approved PR 100 Medians, Boardwalk, and Sidewalk Construction plan set.

Kimley-Horn will not collect traffic counts as part of this task. All permitting fees will be paid for directly by the City of South Padre Island.

### 5. BIDDING AND CONSTRUCTION PHASE SERVICES

Kimley-Horn's role is limited, and services are only provided upon request from the City and billed on a reimbursable basis as labor and direct expenses are incurred. The budgeted fee for this task is based on approximately 100 hours of labor. If additional effort is required, it will be performed as an Additional Service.

Bidding. Kimley-Horn assumes that the City will advertise and award the construction bids and contract for one (1) construction contract. During the bidding phase, the City will be the perspective bidders' contact for plans and bid document packages. Kimley-Horn will provide assistance answering bidders' questions and, if needed, create addenda to interpret, clarify, or expand the bidding documents. One week prior to the scheduled bid opening, Kimley-Horn will assist the city in preparing for and conducting a pre-bid meeting with prospective bidders. Kimley-Horn will attend this pre-bid meeting via conference call. The City will administer the bid opening and review of bids for compliance with the contract. Upon approval of the award recommendation, the City will prepare the necessary signature copies of the construction contract, and will deliver these to the winning bidder for their signatures. It will be the responsibility of the winning bidder to deliver the signed copies to the City for completion.

Kimley-Horn will assist the City in conducting and may attend one (1) Pre-Construction Conference.

Visits to Site and Observation of Construction. Kimley-Horn will provide on-site construction observation services during the construction phase. For purposes of establishing fee, Kimley-Horn assumes a total of seven (7) site visits total will be necessary for the construction project. Such visits and observations by Kimley-Horn are not intended to be exhaustive or to extend to every aspect of Contractor's work in progress. Observations are to be limited to spot checking, selective measurement, and similar methods of general observation of the Work based on Kimley-Horn's exercise of

professional judgment. Based on information obtained during such visits and such observations, Kimley-Horn will evaluate whether Contractor's work is generally proceeding in accordance with the Contract Documents, and Kimley-Horn will keep City informed of the general progress of the Work.

The purpose of Kimley-Horn's site visits will be to enable Kimley-Horn to better carry out the duties and responsibilities specifically assigned in this Agreement to Kimley-Horn, and to provide City greater degree of confidence that the completed Work will conform in general to the Contract Documents. Kimley-Horn shall not, during such visits or as a result of such observations of Contractor's work in progress, supervise, direct, or have control over Contractor's work, nor shall Kimley-Horn have authority over or responsibility for the means, methods, techniques, equipment choice and usage, sequences, schedules, or procedures of construction selected by Contractor, for safety precautions and programs incident to Contractor's work. nor for any failure of Contractor to comply with laws and regulations applicable to Contractors furnishing and performing the Work. Accordingly, Kimley-Horn neither guarantees the performance of any Contractor nor assumes responsibility for any Contractor's failure to furnish and perform its work in accordance with the Contract Documents.

Clarifications and Interpretations. Kimley-Horn will respond to reasonable and appropriate Contractor requests for information and issue necessary clarifications and interpretations of the Contract Documents to City as appropriate to the orderly completion of Contractor's work. Any orders authorizing variations from the Contract Documents will be made by City.

Change Orders. Kimley-Horn may recommend Change Orders to City, and will review and make recommendations related to Change Orders submitted or proposed by the Contractor.

Shop Drawings and Samples. Kimley-Horn will review and approve or take other appropriate action in respect to Shop Drawings and Samples and other data which Contractor is required to submit, but only for conformance with the information given in the Contract Documents. Such review and approvals or other action will not extend to means, methods, techniques, equipment choice and usage, sequences, schedules, or procedures of construction or to related safety precautions and programs.

Substitutes and "or-equal". Evaluate and determine the acceptability of substitute or "or-equal" materials and equipment proposed by Contractor in accordance with the Contract Documents, but subject to the provisions of applicable standards of state or local government entities.

Disagreements between City and Contractor. Kimley-Horn will, if requested by City, render written decision on all claims of City and Contractor relating to the acceptability of Contractor's work or the interpretation of the requirements of the Contract Documents pertaining to the progress of Contractor's work. Kimley-Horn is not responsible for the accuracy of the information provided by the Contractor and/or the City. Kimley-Horn will provide the following deliverables for the construction contract:

- One CD-ROM or DVD-ROM disc with all project related files, including each Record Drawing sheet in PDF format

Limitation of Responsibilities. 

### ITEM BACKGROUND

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission has awarded the City of South Padre Island a Non-Urban Outdoor Recreational grant of \$500,000 for Phase II of the John L. Tompkins Park. Phase II will include a skate park, a walking trail with exercise stations, benches, solar lighting, shade structures, bocce ball, additional play equipment and a soccer field. Newline skate was selected to design the skate park component. The skate park committee , parks committee and a community open house were all utilized to advise Newline on the final design.

A Skate Park Open House was held on June 23rd to obtain public input on the design. 130 individuals visited the skate.myspi.org website during the meeting and 41 people took the on-line survey providing Newline a clear direction on the desired features of the park.





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
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













however bids for construction came in high and a redesign was needed. In 2020 the process was restarted to create a design that better fit the site and included new feedback from the community. This final design is the result of several public workshops, online surveys and meetings with local skatepark advocates.

Based on feedback from the community, the South Padre Island skatepark now includes a larger flow bowl with a roll-in pocket, more hips and an extension for greater depth. The lower street plaza no longer contains stairs which allowed for the larger bowl, along with a larger stacked manual pad + ledge combination.

At the initial 3D concept presentation, several terrain options were included for participants to vote on. The final design contains the quarter pipe extension, banked hip and slappy curb which were all selected by the community. The vote was split on the two bowl options presented, but now the park includes a larger bowl which allows for a greater range of riding styles and skill levels for all to enjoy.

# PROJECT BACKGROUND


### 1.1 INTRODUCTION & PROJECT SCOPE

Local advocates have desired a skatepark on South Padre Island for years. As far back as 2011 efforts to create a safe place for South Padre youth to skate have been documented in local media, and in 2015 the South Padre Skatepark page was created on Facebook for local advocates to organize and communicate.

In 2017 New Line Skateparks joined Naismith Engineering & Hanson Professional Services as a skatepark design subconsultant for the new South Padre Island skatepark at John L. Tompkins Park. An initial design for a street-style Phase 1 skatepark plus additional options to add a mini ramp or bowl area as Phase 2. Unfortunately bids for construction came in over budget and the project was temporarily put on hold.

In 2020 a new design process began for an improved park with an updated budget. This concept design process is now complete and plans for construction will be drawn by NLS upon approval from the City of South Padre Island.

# **PROJECT BACKGROUND**

## 1.2 VISION AND OBJECTIVES

**Vision:** To create a well-rounded skatepark that meets the needs and desires of the South Padre Island community and its visitors.

### **Objectives:**

- -Ensure skatepark terrain most desired by community is included in design
- -Create a skatepark that allows for progression and provides opportunities for beginner to advanced riders
- -Create a skatepark that allows for all styles of riding, including both street and transition styles
- -Create an new amenity and attraction for visitors to South Padre Island
- -Design the park to work with site constraints while maximizing skateable surface area





# **EXISTING CONDITIONS**

## 2.1 SITE CONDITIONS & ANALYSIS

The site of the new South Padre Island Skatepark is within the recently developed John L. Tompkins Park at 6100 South Padre Boulevard. The park now contains two playgrounds, a basketball court, a restroom and a large green space, with an area between the playgrounds and basketball courtset aside for the skatepark. The site also features numerous palm trees and shrubs along with a parking area with room for 23 vehicles.

New pathways border the skatepark site on three sides with the basketball court on the fourth side creating a rectangular space for development. The site is essentially flat, with a slight ridge running east-west across the space with the north and south ends being slightly lower. Existing catch basins at the northeast and southeast corners of the site collect rainwater via surface flow. Elevations across the site range from +7.25' to 8.75' above sea level.














## 2.2 OPPORTUNITIES AND CONSTRAINTS

**Opportunities:** The skatepark site presents a blank slate ready for development. John L. Tompkins Park already contains most of the necessary infrastructure and site amenities users desire, which allows the budget to be focused on developing rideable terrain. Existing catch basins can be used for drainage tie-ins for the skatepark but need to be preserved to catch stormwater from the adjacent landscape.

**Constraints:** The primary constraints of the site are the existing pathways and basketball court which contain the space on all sides and must be protected, as well as the depth of the adjacent drain structures. In order to avoid allocating too much of the budget to walls and railings, the edges of the skatepark need to be set back from the pathways and basketball court to allow room for landscape berming. Any bowl structures will not be able to descend very far below the existing grade due to the shallow depth of drain structures. The primary site amenity users desire that is not readily available is shade, but there is room for future shade installation.





## 2.3 GEOTECHNICAL RECOMMENDATIONS

In December of 2014 a geotechnical report for John L. Tompkins Park was prepared by Terracon Engineering for the City of South Padre Island. Several boreholes were drilled to investigate subsurface soil conditions to make recommendations for new structures built in the park.

Engineers found that the site was suitable for the proposed park development. The following recommendations were made:

- -Stripping should include surface vegetation, construction debris, loose topsoil or other unsuitable materials
- -Proofrolling should be performed to detect weak areas which should be excavated and replaced with a structural fill
- -A minimum of 6 inches of native soils should be over excavated and replaced with compacted fill soils to achieve finished grade
- -Contractors should refer to the full report for slabon-grade construction recommendations
- -Any changes to the grades after this report will need to be documented in order to provide skatepark subgrade design


## 3.1 COMMUNITY CONSULTATION: WORKSHOP



Throughout the design process for the skatepark, the South Padre Island community has been invited to participate and give feedback on several occasions.

Initial site sketches were developed based on previous feedback received in 2017, and in January of 2020 New Line principal Kyle Dion visited South Padre to meet the community and discuss the direction of the design.


After a design direction was selected by the community, New Line developed a conceptual 3D model for feedback. Though NLS representatives were unable to fly to Texas due to Covid travel restrictions, an online presentation and survey were created for the community to provide further feedback on the design. An in-person open house was hosted by the City of South Padre Island, and New Line representatives Kyle and Chris attended virtually to listen to comments and answer questions.


The final skatepark design is based on an anticipated square footage that can be afforded with the available budget, plus an optional addition area that will be constructed should additional budget be available.

The goal for the base bid budget is to include all of the key terrain desired by the community, with the optional addition adding new features and extra riding space for more users. As of January 2020 the construction budget available was \$277,705, and the base park design (without optional addition) is scaled to fit this budget based on historical skatepark pricing in the region. External economic factors and market forces outside the control of New Line Skateparks can influence pricing, along with seasonal availability of qualified builders.



## 3.3 DESIGN SKETCHING

Numerous different design approaches and layouts were sketched through the design process. At each step in the process the design is shared with the New Line design team for review, and team members will sketch ideas they have for changes and improvements. Here are a few of those sketches to show how the design has evolved:




## 3.4 THEMING

The concept for the South Padre Island skatepark includes a local aesthetic and theming in the color of the steel and concrete, as well as in the overall design.

Local input on the theming of the skatepark included requests for:

- -Island themes of sand, waves, and wildlife including sea turtles, tarpon and redfish
- Colors from the vintage SPI logo
- -SpaceX themes
- -Nautical imagery
- -Local mural and graffiti art, local artist Manuel Zamudio recommended
- -Public graffiti and sticker walls

The final concept for the skatepark includes a wave pattern of sand colored concrete as well as colored steel painted to match the city logo in yellow, pink and blue. Additional aesthetic touches and artwork could be included in certain features but would increase the cost of the skatepark.




## 3.5 2D CONCEPT OPTIONS

In January 2020, three 2D concept options were developed to determine the direction of the design going forward. Each presents a unique configuration, and feedback from the community helped guide the design process. Design Options #1 and #3 both represent more open, plaza style terrain with no enclosed bowl. #1 is the most street oriented, while #3 contains a mix of street and transition with a mini half pipe ramp in the corner.


Design Option #2 was the clear community preference due to the presence of an enclosed bowl, and with that direction from the community #2 was then developed into a 3D model. In addition to the enclosed bowl and lower street plaza area, the SPI community requested that we shift the bowl south and add additional skateable space that will be included if an increased budget becomes available.

## 3.6 3D CONCEPTUAL MODEL

On June 23rd, 2020, a 3D concept design was presented to the community based on the preference of Design Option #2 featuring an enclosed bowl.


This design includes a relatively small bowl with two depths and a mini half pipe shallowend, along with a lower street plaza consisting of stairs, ledges, rails, banks and quarter pipes. Positive feedback was received from the community, and New Line designers were able to discuss changes with participants who attended the open house. While there is little room or budget to add new terrain, certain features within the design could be changed without adding cost.



## 3.7 COMMUNITY CONSULTATION: CONCEPTUAL MODEL

In addition to the 3D model based on the community's preferred design direction, several terrain alternatives were modeled to illustrate how features could change. These options were included in the online survey for voting, and a clear preference was indicated on three of the four features. Participants voted strongly in favor of the mini hip, quarter pipe extension and slappy curb, but the vote was much closer on the bowl options.

In the comments received by survey participants there were numerous requests for more bowl/transition style terrain such as snake runs, pump tracks and full pipes, but there were not any requests for more street terrain. One participant asked if it would be possible to remove the stairs in favor of more bowl terrain. After a discussion with community representatives it was decided that the best direction was indeed to remove the stairs and increase the size of the bowl.



### **CONCEPT OVERVIEW**

The final design for the new South Padre Island skatepark at John L. Tompkins park combines both street and transition elements to create a space with terrain for all different riders to enjoy. Though the site is limited by existing pathways, drainage infrastructure and a basketball court, this design maximizes the park footprint for the construction budget available. An elevated platform contains a multi-depth flow bowl while banks and quarter pipes lead down to a lower street plazs. The plaza area contains a variety of ledges, a banked hip and flat rail with small banks and quarter pipes extension. The alternate bid area extends transition ramps around the corner of the park with pump bumps for riders to maintain speed, and will be constructed if sufficient budget is available.






## **4.2 DESIGN ELEMENTS**

The new design elements in the final skatepark concept include the expanded bowl and improved lower plaza area. While there are no longer any stairs in the design, the bowl now includes multiple hips, pockets, a roll-in corner and an extension corner for greater variety and appeal to a wider range of riders.

With the removal of the stairs there is now more room for the lower plaza ledges, hip and rail. The hip has increased in size, the slappy curb lengthened, and manual pad now includes a stacked ledge on top of it for combination tricks. This configuration includes all of the most popular street and transition features and is sure to provide something fun for all styles of riders.

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020, the City of South Padre Island issued a proclamation declaring a Local State of Disaster for public health emergency for the City of South Padre Island to protect residents, visitors and businesses from the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the conditions necessitating this declaration of a Local State of Disaster by the Mayor continue to exist; and

WHEREAS, Section 418.108(b) of the Texas Government Code provides that a declaration of a Local State of Disaster may not be continued for a period in excess of seven days without the consent of the governing body of the political subdivision.

### NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS:

- 1. That the Declaration of a Local State of Disaster for public health emergency proclaimed for the City of South Padre Island by the Mayor on March 16, 2020 shall continue until 11:59 p.m. on Monday, August 31, 2020.
- 2. This order is passed as an emergency measure and pursuant to Section 418.108 of the Texas Government Code and shall take effect immediately from and after its issuance.
- **3.** This order shall be given prompt and general publicity and promptly filed with the City Secretary.

# FIRST AMENDED EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ORDER REGARDING BEACH OPERATIONS

**WHEREAS**, it is the responsibility of every American to aid in the prevention of the spread of this virus. Our hope is that by imposing these measures quickly and firmly, we will help bring this national emergency to an end quickly and help revitalize the economy we all enjoy as soon as possible.

**WHEREAS**, Section 418.108(a) of the Texas Government code provides that the presiding officer of the governing body of a political subdivision may declare a state of local disaster; and

WHEREAS, extraordinary measures must be taken to contain COVID-19 and prevent its spread throughout Cameron County, including the quarantine of individuals, groups of individuals, and property and, additionally, including compelling individuals, groups of individuals, or property to undergo additional health measures that prevent or control the spread of disease.

WHEREAS, the transmission of COVID-19 remains significant threat to the health and safety of the community, rates of infection are increasing at an exponential rate, and according to the Cameron County Health Authority and the Administration of all the local hospitals and the number of people admitted to the hospitals, ICU, or placed on ventilators is also dramatically rising; and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor has determined that extraordinary emergency measures must be taken to mitigate the effects of this public health emergency; and

**THEREFORE**, the following are MANDATORY restrictions based on Texas Health and Safety Code Section 122.006, that a city can "adopt rules to protect the health of persons in a municipality" and in accordance with the City's Declaration of a Local State of Disaster for Public Health Emergency issued on March 16, 2020, and section 418.108(A) of the Texas Government Code.

The following will be mandated immediately.

#### **BEACH VENDORS**

- Beach vendors can only preset the front-row following the spacing guidelines below.
- All non-single pole shade structures will be prohibited.
- All single-pole shade structures will be separated by a minimum of 15 feet from outside edge/tip of the structure.
- All secondary beach chairs and umbrellas must be stored at the dune line and setup on demand only.
- Chairs and umbrellas must be rented and occupied at the time of setup, for the secondary rows.
- Only two chairs per single pole shade structure will be permitted.

#### **BEACH GOERS**

- All non-single pole shade structure will be prohibited.
- All single-pole shade structure will be separated by a minimum of 15 feet from outside edge/tip of the structure.
- Only two chairs per single pole shade structure will be permitted.
- Other setups are prohibited within the 15 feet between the equipment.

This emergency management order will remain in effect until July 31, 2020, at 11:59 p.m.

Peace Officers, City of South Padre Island Health Inspectors, Code Enforcement/Ordinance Officers/Inspectors are hereby authorized to enforce this order. A violation of this order is a Class C Misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.00 in accordance with the City of South Padre Island Code of Ordinances.
