Dear Mayor McNulty:

The CCRMA has been developing the SPI 2nd Access project since approximately 2010 in conjunction with TxDOT, Cameron County, and various other project partners. To date we have been able to produce a draft EIS which included conducting a Public Hearing, preliminary engineering documents such as an alternative analysis, hydrology & hydraulic studies, horizontal and vertical alignments, all associated with the environmental phase of the project working towards an approved schematic and environmental clearance. The CCRMA has environmental mitigation studies and other efforts underway to develop strategies to minimize impacts and expedite the project development. Along with TxDOT we performed a Value Engineering Study in 2016 based on the 95% Schematic Design for the project that resulted in several excellent recommendations. Due to the moratorium on the development of toll projects, we stopped work on the environmental phase. As a result, the CCRMA is considering shifting the strategy of developing the project as a non-tolled facility.

As indicated by correspondence dated June 26, 2020 from the RGVMPO Chairman, the SPI 2nd Access project remains one of the Top 5 Priorities for the RGVMPO as a whole. The unique distinction and limitation on the development of this much needed project is that the preceding four RGVMPO priority projects have development authority with TxDOT and the Preliminary Engineering and Environmental Phases fully funded and underway whether by TxDOT or local project partners.

Unfortunately, we were not able to receive assistance from the state to fund the Preliminary Engineering and Environmental phase of the project that would have completed the environmental phase. Thus, I am seeking your financial assistance to complete the environmental phase of the project. In consultation with the Pharr Txdot District office, we believe it will take \$3 million to complete the environmental phase. If we receive \$1 million from SPI, the County and the CCRMA can fund the difference. We are pursuing a meeting with Chairman Buff to request TxDOT Development Authority so that TxDOT can approve and review engineering and environmental

Naturalist Javier Gonzalez Monthly Report June-July 2021

Coastal Nature Camps - Session 1: June 15-18 & Session 2: June 22-25

This year we offered two coastal nature camp sessions instead of the usual one. My goal has been to offer more camps in during the summer months. We had a total of 14 campers. Each camp session is 4 days long, four hours a day. Each day campers learn something different about our local coastal wetlands. The first day is about the habitat, second day is about the bird life, third is insects and fish, and the last day is about conservation stewardship, mammals, and alligators. All the activities are organized to make the campers field biologists. I created and organized camp advertisement, registration, activities, presentations, and directed the camp. I had help from Remy during the camp days and it served as a good training period for him. Cris and Patti helped make lunches for the campers each day. All the campers really enjoyed it and had nothing but positive feedback from their parents.



7/02/21 Boys & Girls Club San Benito Field Trip:

100 kids from the Boy's & Girls Club from San Benito visited the center. We had not had a field trip of that size since early 2020. We were able to manage them well and they had a fun visit. Half of them would stay inside in the auditorium and listen to a Gator Talk while the other half were guided around the boardwalk by our naturalist volunteers. The groups would then rotate activities. We have a few more large field trips on schedule to visit soon. It is great to finally see the large field trips returning after so long.

Grant project organizing:

I have been planning, organizing, and gathering materials to execute grant projects to the order of the conditions given to us by the foundations and organizations that we received the grants from. We have a large-scale post freeze wetland restoration project coming up that will entail, the trimming of all dead mangrove stalks, overgrown cattails, garden landscaping, and ground improvements. This will be a very tedious and time-consuming endeavor, but we are very fortunate and grateful to receive this support.

Summer Birding Tours:

The birding tour participation naturally slows down just a bit during the summer months, but interest remains, and the participants have shifted from birders to vacationers and families. I continue to schedule, post, and advertise the tours through social media, local newspapers, and flyers at hotels.

Upcoming:

Remy and I have planned a couple of camps for late July and early August. This organizing is a continuation of Remy's training. He has helped with creating flyers, posting events on our website, and creating and organizing lessons and activities. The first camp is a two-day Summer Birding Camp that will take advantage of the increased bird diversity during that time, followed by a one day Pollinator Camp on August 6th.

Birding Guides: (4) birding guides lead 4 different tours for a total of 6 volunteer hours a week.

Greeters: (8) Greeters x 4 volunteer hours a week each = 32 volunteer hours a week.

Habitat: I have one new volunteer that is helping with maintaining our gardens and grounds and comes in twice a week (Tue/Fri) for a couple of hours in the morning.

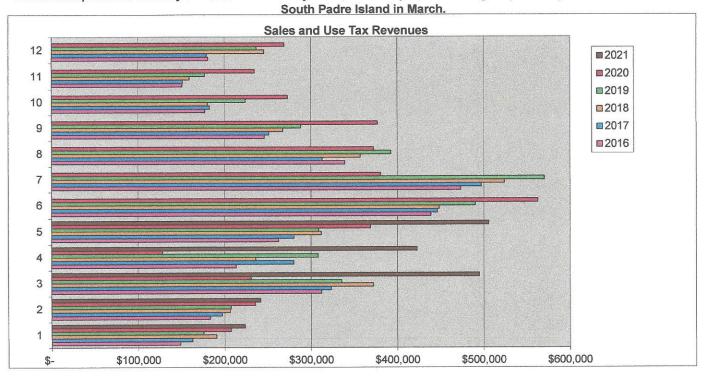

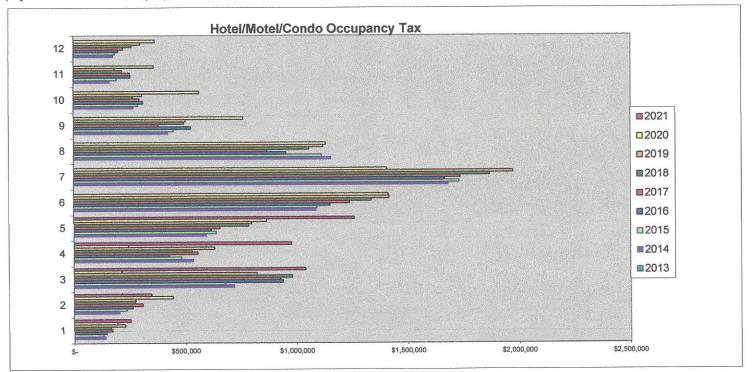
