In the Spotlight this week is City Manager, Randy Smith! Randy was born and raised in Houston, TX where he began a long career in public service. First working as a court clerk on Houston's municipal jail docket court, then many years as a police officer working in patrol, juvenile and mental health. He has an Associate of Arts in Business Administration, a Bachelor's of Science in Criminal Justice, and a Master's in Criminal Justice Management from Boston University. He's also a graduate of the FBI National Academy Session 224 in Quantico, VA.

In 1997 Randy was appointed Police Chief /Public Safety Director for Surfside Beach, TX before becoming the Police Chief here on South Padre Island in 2010. He was appointed City Manager for South Padre Island in

2019 where he continues to serve the citizens and visitors of South Padre Island. Throughout the years, Randy has sat on numerous public safety boards and committees, one most notable is a board that determines what Texas Police Chiefs will learn through their continuing educational requirements.

As City Manager, Randy bridges the gap between City Council and the day-to-day administration of the City. As for the future, Randy says he "looks forward to continuing to work collaboratively with City Council, staff, and the community to implement future initiatives for South Padre Island.
