### MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND SHORELINE TASK FORCE

### Tuesday, April 20th, 2022

### I. CALL TO ORDER.

The Shoreline Task Force of the City of South Padre Island, Texas, held a regular meeting on Tuesday, April 20<sup>th</sup>, 2022, at the Municipal Complex Building, 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor, 4601 Padre Boulevard, South Padre Island, Texas. Chairman Robert Nixon called the meeting to order at 12:00 p.m. A quorum was present with Chairman Robert Nixon, Task Force Vice Chairman Stormy Wall, Task Force Members Abbie Mahan, Michael Sularz, Norma Trevino, Todd Williams, and Carol Bolstad.

City Council Members present include Ken Medders, Kerry Schwartz, and Lydia Caballero. City staff present included: City Manager Randy Smith, Shoreline Director Kristina Boburka, and Coastal Coordinator Erika Hughston.

### II. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE.

Chairman Robert Nixon led the Pledge of Allegiance.

### **III. PUBLIC COMMENTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS:**

Community member Virginia Guillot offered a public comment pertaining to the engineering designs for the Marisol Boat Ramp. Guillot expressed the importance of safety and that parking should be considered a secondary issue. Task Force Member Bolstad commented that she enjoyed the crab signs for the dune restoration project and that the plastic fencing has been removed. Bolstad also stated that she had begun noticing trash washing in. Task Force Member Trevino noted that she runs patrol Monday and Sunday and was concerned about the trash.

### IV. REGULAR AGENDA

I. DISCUSSION AND ACTION TO APPROVE THE MINUTES FROM THE REGULAR MEETING ON APRIL 12<sup>TH</sup>, 2022. (HUGHSTON)

Task Force Member Wall made a motion to approve the minutes, seconded by Task Force Member Mahan. Motion passed unanimously.

II. DISCUSSION AND ACTION TO PROVIDE A RECOMMENDATION TO CITY COUNCIL ON THE PRELIMINARY DESIGNS FOR THE MARISOL BOAT RAMP UNDER THE TEXAS PARKS AND WILDLIFE DEPARTMENT AND RESTORE ACT GRANTS. (BOBURKA, HUGHSTON)

Project Lead Engineer Yesenia Singleton showed the most current boat ramp plans indicating that space is limited and the best possible layout would feature the current plans. The Task Force discussed possible design changes. Task Force Member Williams asked

Singleton if the slope of the ramp could be elevated to accommodate larger draft boats. Task Force Chairman Nixon made a motion to recommend the preliminary plans to City Council with the following stipulations: Increase the ramp slope to 13%, allow the attendant dock to run the entire length of the bulkhead meeting ADA requirements, and add a second entry to the attendant dock at the east end of the property. The motion was seconded by Task Force Member Trevino. Motion passed unanimously.

# III. DISCUSSION AND ACTION TO PROVIDE A RECOMMENDATION TO CITY COUNCIL ON THE PRELIMINARY DESIGNS FOR SEA ISLAND CIRCLE IMPROVEMENTS UNDER THE COASTAL MANAGEMENT PROGRAM (CMP)'S CYCLE 26. (BOBURKA, HUGHSTON)

Task Force Member Mahan made a motion to recommend the preliminary Sea Island Circle plans to City Council, seconded by Task Force Member Sularz. Motion passed unanimously.

# IV. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO PROVIDE A RECOMMENDATION TO CITY COUNCIL ON THE REGULATION OF ELECTRIC SCOOTERS AND BICYCLES ON THE BEACH.

Task Force Chairman Nixon introduced the agenda item and suggested that all use of non-permitted motor vehicles be kept off the beach. Task Force Member Mahan asked if there had been any related injuries caused by motorized scooters or bikes and if this had been a significant problem. Task Force Member Trevino made a motion to table the item until Environmental Health Director Victor Baldovinos could be present, seconded by Task Force Member Bolstad. Motion passed unanimously.

Task Force Member Trevino made a motion to proceed with the aforementioned selection, seconded by Task Force Member Sularz.

Recognizing and acknowledging the legal requirements to provide for public parking for beach access, and for public safety reasons, and to comply with any and all legal requirements, the parking, stopping, or standing of any type of trailer, attached or unattached to any vehicle, or any other type of vehicle, with or without trailers, or other attachments, that occupies or takes up any amount of space in excess of one designated standard parking space, or does not totally fit within one designated standard parking space, for any period of time, is prohibited on Gulf Boulevard, and in all designated City beach accesses. Overnight parking is prohibited on Gulf Boulevard and in all designated City beach accesses.

City Council discussed the item at their regular meeting on May 4, 2022, and tabled the item until further discussion is had with the Task Force.

### Regarding amendment recommendation to Section 18-19 (A) of the City of South Padre Island Code of Ordinances by the Shoreline Taskforce

To the Honorable South Padre Island Mayor Patrick McNulty and South Padre Island City Council,

Over the last several meetings and one workshop that included input and consultation from City Manager Randy Smith and SPIPD Chief Claudine O'Carroll, the SPI Shoreline Taskforce (SLTF) has been discussing observed issues regarding parking in designated Public Beach Access Parking Spaces along Gulf Blvd. and the Public Beach Access cul-de-sacs.

The issues that have been identified by the SLTF in these spaces has been properties utilizing these Beach Access Parking Spots being utilized by property owners and condominiums for overflow parking, the parking of boat, utility and other trailers overnight and oversized vehicles taking up multiple spaces. These spaces are dedicated to the access and use of the City's Public Beach for our daily visitors as required by the Texas General Land Office under the Texas Open Beaches Act (Texas Natural Resources Code Title 2, Subtitle E, Chapter 61, Subsection A). The abuse of these spots takes away opportunities for convenient access to our City Beaches from our visitors and residents that are not living on Gulf Blvd.

As a result of this, the SLTF has been working with Shoreline Director, Kristina Boburka and City Attorney, Ed Cyganiewicz on a resolution which has resulted in an amendment recommendation of Section 18-19 (A) of the City of South Padre Island's Code of Ordinances which addresses parking within the city limits. The recommended language submitted by Mr. Cyganiewics is as follows:

"Section 18-19 (A) (21)

Recognizing and acknowledging the legal requirements to provide for public parking for beach access, and for public safety reasons, and to comply with any and all legal requirements, the parking, stopping, or standing of any type of trailer, attached or unattached to any vehicle, or any other type of vehicle, with or without trailers, or other attachments, that occupies or takes up any amount of space in excess of one designated standard parking space, or does not totally fit within one designated standard parking space, for any period of time, is prohibited on Gulf Boulevard, and in all designated City beach accesses.

Overnight parking is prohibited on Gulf Boulevard and in all designated City beach accesses.

Any violation of this section is punishable by a maximum fine of \$500.00."

The SLTF approved this language to be sent to the City Council at our January 11 regular meeting for your review and approval. The SLTF requests that the City Council approves this language and direct Mr. Cyganiewicz to formally draft the amendment for City Council's approval at a future meeting so that this amendment can be adopted before our high season starts in March of this year. This would also include an approval of the City Council to direct the Shoreline Department and Public Works to add any signage that would be required.

### Bidders' Request for Clarification

### QUESTION FROM BIDDERS

- Can you provide clarification on pier depth / length in regards to the MSL. Pier detail on S2.10 detail 5 is calling for bearing depth -30 below MSL and foundation elevation at 11.45 and 11.33. Is there a benchmark or elevation for the MSL in that area? Or is the length of the pier the 30' plus the 11.45
- 2. Not a question, more of a suggestion. The paving detail for the brick paver parking lot Ref L3.02 Detail 7 calls for limestone base under the brick paver. The only supplier is the port of Brownsville Vulcan Materials, and they are completely out of stock and no word on new shipment. We are using the Alanza Flex Base LAG10. Most of the cities are approving it because of the supply issues. We may have to substitute at time of construction.
- Pile depth clarification. On S2.2 & S2.3 pile depth is minimum of 12'. Is that from the cut elevation once dunes are graded to the top of landing on the walkover or the MSL?
- 4. Can the width of the walk over be reduced to allow for a 6 ft length of composition deck plank?

### RESPONSE FROM OWNER

 Contractor shall refer to benchmark and elevation noted on civil drawing C1.3 for benchmark elevation information.

- 2. The proposed Alanza Flex Base LAG10 is an approved parking lot base substitution material. However, if selected, this material will require the base thickness to increase from 6 inches as noted on the drawings up to 7 inches per this addendum. The sand cushion can be reduced from 2 inches as noted on the drawings to 1 inch.
- The timber piles shall extend a minimum of 12 ft from proposed dune grade elevation noted on drawing C1.8.
- Contractor shall bid width of walk over structure as detailed on the bid documents.
   No change in width or variation or deviation from noted dimensions shall be allowed.




