Short Term Rental Update

Anyone who owns, operators, or advertises a short term rental (STR) will need to obtain a short term rental license. The annual license fee will be \$125 per rental unit. All old and new short term rentals will need to be registered at <u>www.myspi.org/hottax</u> where each unit will receive a new license number. These fees will provide funding towards the new STR program and enforcement.

Hurricane Season Tips

Be Prepared

The City of South Padre Island would like to remind you to be prepared during this hurricane season. Don't wait until a warning is issued and the stores are empty and/or closed. Here is an example prep kit list you can use.

- Water (1 gallon per person per day)
- Food for at least 3 days
- Emergency kit Sanitation needs, First aid kits, flashlight, extra batteries, and a whistle.
- Battery-powered or hand crank radio.

Evacuation routes: View the Texas Department of Transportation or Office of Emergency Management website to find routes near you, by visiting <u>here</u>.

Emergency shelter location: To find a shelter near you, check the FEMA mobile app: <u>here</u>.

Never use a generator, gasoline powered equipment and tools, grill, camp stove or charcoal burning device inside or in any partially enclosed area. Keep these devices outside and at least 20 feet from doors, windows, and vents.

Stay Informed

The City of South Padre Island utilizes RAVE to notify citizens, businesses, and visitors of emergency situations. Click <u>here</u> to sign up.

Many use social media in the event of a disaster to let relatives and friends know they are safe. It is a great way to stay current with the City, state and national social media resources and warnings. Here are a few to make sure you are following:

Prepare an emergency plan and an evacuation plan. Also, make sure every member of your family knows what to do if they are not home when an emergency is declared.

- Become familiar with your evacuation zone.
- Gather needed supplies for at least three days (including medication).
- Keep important documents in a safe place or create password-protected digital copies.
- Keep a list of emergency contacts readily available.

After the Storm

Air out - open all doors and windows whenever you are present.

Move out - removal any contaminated material. (Ex, porous materials that may have visible fungal growths).

Tear out - flooring, paneling, drywall, insulation, and electrical outlets saturated by floodwater.

Clean out - disinfect any remaining debris and mud.

Dry out - the building and any remaining contents.

Pets

Include basic survival items and items to keep your pet happy and comfortable.

- Food at least 3 days in an airtight and waterproof container.
- Water at least 3 days worth.
- Medicines and medical records.
- Collar or harness with ID tag, rabies tag, a leash, and create/pet carrier.
- Familiar items treats, toys, and bedding to help reduce stress for your pets.
