Keep SPI Beautiful Committee (KSPIBC) Regular Meeting Minutes 02/12/2015

1. Call To Order

Meeting was called to order at 4:00 pm by KSPIBC Chairwoman Susan Dalton

2. Pledge of Allegiance

Committee Chairwoman Susan Dalton led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

3. Public Comments and Announcements

Environmental Health Director Victor Baldovinos informed committee members that the Environmental Health Services Department is conducting pesticide spraying to minimize the mosquito population.

Committee Member Sanchez advised of the upcoming beach cleanup scheduled for May 9, 2015 at beach access 11 from 9-11am, in conjunction with the Great American Trash-Off. She also corrected the date of the Spring Adopt-A-Beach which is scheduled for April 25, 2015.

Jody Hughes, Chairwoman for the City of South Padre Island's Parks, Recreation and Beautification Committee took the podium to introduce herself.

4. Approval of Minutes from January 8, 2015 (Meeting), January 20, 2015 (Workshop) and January 27, 2015 (Workshop)

Committee Member Sanchez motioned to accept the minutes as written for the meeting and both workshops, and Committee Member Tannenbaum seconded. All voted in favor; motion carried unanimously.

5. Update on the 2015 Governor's Community Achievement Award (Victor Baldovinos)

Environmental Health Director Victor Baldovinos congratulated everyone and advised that the grant was submitted on time, and he received confirmation from the recipient. Committee Chairwoman Dalton thanked all members for their dedication with the application process.

6. <u>Discussion and possible action regarding training webinars available to KSPIB committee</u> (Susan Dalton)

Chairwoman Dalton informed every one of the free training webinars that are available, and would appreciate members taking the time to participate when possible.
