"Motor Vehicle" means a self-propelled vehicle intended to be driven on a 9 roadway. Such vehicles include, but are not limited to, cars, trucks, 10 11 motorcycles, scooters, recreational vehicles, or mopeds under motor power. 12 "Motorized Off-Road Vehicle" means any self-propelled, off the road or all-terrain vehicle, designed to be driven off a roadway. Such vehicles include, but are 13 not limited to mini-bike, amphibious vehicle, motorcycle, go-cart, scooter, dune 14 buggy, or all-terrain vehicle (ATV). 15 16 "Natural Resources" means all flora and fauna within parks and the physical factors upon which they depend; including air, water, soil, and minerals. 17 "Park" means any land or water area and all facilities thereon, including but not 18 19 limited to trails, under the jurisdiction, control or ownership of the City. "Person" or "Persons" means individuals, firms, corporations, societies or any group or 20 gathering whatsoever. 21 "Pet" means any animal that is tamed and domesticated and kept as a companion. 22 "Pollutant" means any substance, liquid, or gas which could cause contamination of 23 air, land, or water so as to create or cause a nuisance or render unclean or 24 noxious or impure so as to be actually or potentially harmful, or detrimental or 25 injurious to public health, safety, or welfare. 26 "Property" means any land, waters, facilities, or possessions of the City. 27 "Use Permit" means the written permission that must be obtained from the City to 28 carry out a given activity. 29 "Weapon" means any device including, but not limited to, firearms, bows, electronic 30 weapons, slings, and pellet or B-B guns from which a shot or projectile of any 31 type is discharged or propelled by means of an explosive, gas, compressed air, 32 33 or other means. An electronic weapon means a portable device, which is designated, used or intended to be used, offensively or defensively, to 34 immobilize or incapacitate persons by the use of an electric current. 35 "Wildlife" means any living creature, not human, wild by nature, endowed with 36 sensation, power of voluntary motion, including but not limited to mammals, 37 birds, fish, amphibians and reptiles. 38
