The Shoreline Department placed 4,400 lbs. of "tracer sand" on top of a nearshore berm on Wednesday, Aug. 15.

The movement of these sand grains will be tracked for the next year and the results will assist in future placement of nourishment material on SPI.

Phase 2 Side Street project

The City of South Padre Island held an open house meeting regarding the reconstruction of four additional side streets on Wednesday, Aug. 15.

The four streets reviewed were:

- West Mars Lane
- West Georgia Ruth Drive
- West Polaris Drive
- A portion of East Mars Lane toward Gulf Boulevard

This project will improve the street conditions, drainage and increase pedestrian mobility by adding sidewalks on select streets. The project is scheduled to begin in October. Once started, it should take about three months and will cost approximately \$345,000.

Council Highlights

At the meeting held on Wednesday Aug. 15, the City Council held a public hearing on the 2018-2019 Property Tax Rate and the 2018-2019 Fiscal Year Budget. The City tax rate will remain the same rate as last year.

City Council approved a Memorandum of Understanding with the Friends of Animal rescue to provide animal care services for the City of South Padre Island.

City Council discussed restroom facility solutions to service beachgoers. A workshop will be scheduled in the future to discuss options for a permanent solution.

City Council approved the second and final reading of Ordinance No. 18-19 amending Chapter 4.

City Council approved the color choices and patterns for the Padre Boulevard crosswalks and boardwalks associated with the Padre Boulevard Medians and North Sidewalks/Boardwalks Project.

City Council approved the development of a legislative agenda and completing the process of selecting professional services to advocate and educate on behalf of South Padre Island during the 2019 Legislative session.


Space available includes a 2,500 square foot event hall with limited kitchen facilities. Community groups, non-profits, businesses and individuals can request a reservation at the Community Center.
