Council Member Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Council Member Ricco to approve Resolution 2020-21 authorizing the application for a Local Parks Non-Urban Outdoor Recreation Grant for Phase III of John L. Tompkins Park. Motion carried unanimously.

6.2. DISCUSSION AND ACTION TO APPROVE BUDGET AMENDMENT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$16,000 FROM EXCESS RESERVES TO PURCHASE AND INSTALL FENCING AT JOHN L TOMPKINS PARK. (RICCO)

Council Member Ricco made a motion, seconded by Council Member Medders to approve the budget amendment in the amount of \$16,000 to purchase and install fencing at John L. Tompkins Park.

6.3. DISCUSSION AND ACTION FOR APPROVAL OF HDR'S TOMPKINS CHANNEL PHASE I PROPOSAL, TO ALLOW THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE THE PROPOSAL, AND A BUDGET AMENDMENT FOR THE SAME. (BOBURKA)

Council Member Ricco made a motion, seconded by Council Member Medders to approve HDR's Tompkins Channel Phase I proposal, allow the City Manager to execute the proposal, and the budget amendment for the same. Motion carried unanimously.

6.4. DISCUSSION AND ACTION TO ALLOW THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO CONTRACT NEGOTIATIONS WITH THE HIGHEST QUALIFIED FIRM TO FULFILL THE CITY'S NEEDS FOR THE COASTAL MANAGEMENT PROGRAM'S (CMP) CYCLE 25 FUNDED PROJECT TO IMPROVE WHITECAP CIRCLE AND ALLOW THE CITY MANAGER TO SIGN A CONTRACT WHEN ACCEPTABLE TERMS HAVE BEEN MET. (BOBURKA)

Council Member Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Council Member Dalton to allow the City Manager to enter into contract negotiations with the highest qualified firm to fulfill the City's needs for the Coastal Management Programs, Cycle 25 funded project to improve Whitecap Circle and allow the City Manager to sign a contract when acceptable terms have been met. Motion carried unanimously.

6.5. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO APPROVE CHANGE ORDER PROPOSAL #17R FROM E-CON FOR PADRE BOULEVARD TRAFFIC SIGNAL EQUIPMENT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$22,046.50 AND A BUDGET AMENDMENT RELATED. (SANCHEZ)

Council Member Bagley made a motion, seconded by Council Member Schwartz to approve Change Order Proposal #17R from E-Con for the Padre Boulevard traffic signal equipment in the amount of \$22,046.50 and the budget amendment related. Motion carried unanimously.

6.6 DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO MODIFY AND EXTEND THE EMERGENCY ORDER REGARDING BEACH OPERATIONS. (MCNULTY)

Council Member Medders made a motion, seconded by Council Member Ricco to extend the Emergency Order regarding Beach Operations until 11:59 p.m. on December 3, 2020, due to COVID-19. Motion passes on a 5 to 1 vote with Council Member Dalton casting a nay vote.
