I. Summary of Contract Terms

II. Standard Contractual Provisions

A. Definitions

Contract means this Standard Services Contract.

Project Administrator means the person duly designated by the City to manage the services provided for in this Contract.

Services means the services for which the City solicited bids or received proposals as described in this Contract.

B. Services

Contractor will furnish Services to the City in accordance with the terms and conditions specified below:

- i. Complete the damaged reconstruction and renovation of large sandcastle on both sides;
- ii. Make improvements to the support structure and box to enable easier and regular maintenance of the artwork;
- iii. Employ additional sculptors, including Lucinda Wieranga;
- iv. Employ multiple laborers for base work on the initial project development;
- v. Update special holiday features at least four (4) times during the term of the contract;
- vi. Complete sculpture within forty-seven (47) days of awarding the contract.

C. Payment

The City shall pay Contractor for the Services in three (3) installments during the thirty (30) day construction period as specified below:

- i. First installment, as soon as possible, after signing the contract; (25%)
- ii. Second installment of 25% upon 50% of project completion;
- iii. Third and final installment of 50% upon satisfactory completion of project. The Project Administrator's determination of satisfactory completion is final.

D. Termination Provisions

- (1) City Termination for Convenience. Under this paragraph, the City may terminate this Contract during its term at any time for the City's own convenience where the Contractor is not in default by giving written notice to Contractor. If the City terminates this Contract under this paragraph, the City will pay the Contractor for all services rendered in accordance with this Contract to the date of termination.
- (2) Termination for Default. Either party to this Contract may terminate this Contract as provided in this paragraph if the other party fails to comply with its terms. The party alleging the default shall give the other party written notice of the default citing the terms of the Contract that have been breached and what action the defaulting party must take to cure the default. If the party in default fails to cure the default as specified in the notice, the party giving the notice of default may terminate this Contract by written notice to the other party, specifying the date of termination. Termination of this Contract under this paragraph does not affect the right of either party to seek remedies for breach of the Contract as allowed by law, including any damages or costs suffered by either party. However, this provision is not intended to and does not act as a waiver of the City's sovereign immunity.
- E. Liability and Indemnity. Contractor shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend the City, it's officers, agents, and employees from and against any and all suits, actions, legal proceedings, claims, demands, damages, costs, expenses, attorneys' fees and any and all other costs or fees (whether rounding in constitutional law, tort, contract, or property law, or raised pursuant to local, state or federal statutory provision), arising out of the performance of the Contract and/or arising out of a willful or negligent act or omission of the Contractor, its officers, agents, and employees. It is understood and agreed that the Contractor and any employee or subcontractor of the Contractor shall not be considered an employee of the City. The Contractor shall not be within the protection or coverage of the City's workers' compensation insurance, health insurance, liability insurance or any other insurance that the City from time to time may have in force and effect. The City specifically reserves the right to reject any and all of Contractor's employees, representatives or subcontractors and/or their employees for any cause, should the presence of any such person on City property or their interaction with City employees be found not to be in the best interest of the City, be found to be harassing to any City employee or third

- person, or is found to interfere with the effective and efficient operation of the City or the City's workplace.
- F. <u>Liens</u>. Contractor agrees to and shall indemnify and hold harmless the City against any and all liens and encumbrances for all labor, goods and services which may be provided under or as a result of this Contract. At the City's request, the Contractor and all subcontractors shall provide a proper release of any and all liens, or satisfactory evidence of freedom from all liens shall be delivered to the City.
- G. <u>Confidentiality</u>. Any provision of this Contract that attempts to prevent the City's disclosure of information that is subject to disclosure under federal of Texas law or regulation, court or administrative decision or ruling, regardless of the source is invalid. (Chapter 552, Texas Government Code).
- H. Tax Exemption. The City is not liable to Contractor for any federal, state or local taxes for which the City is not liable by law, including state and local sales and use taxes (Section 151.309 and Title 3, Texas Tax Code) and federal excise tax (Subtitle D of the Internal Revenue Code). Accordingly, those taxes may not be added to any item purchased for consumption by the City. Fuel purchased for resale shall include Federal Excise Tax under IRC Section 4081 and Texas Motor Fuel Tax if required under the Texas Tax Code Chapter 162. Texas limited sales tax exemption certificates will be furnished upon request. Contractor shall not charge for said taxes on purchases for consumption by the City. If billed, the City will remit payment less sales tax.
- I. <u>Assignment</u>. The Contractor shall not assign this Contract without the prior written consent of the City.
- J. <u>Law, Venue and Limitations</u>. This Contract is governed by the laws of the State of Texas and a lawsuit may only be prosecuted on this Contract in a court of competent jurisdiction located in or having jurisdiction in Cameron County, Texas.
- K. <u>Entire Contract</u>. This Contract represents the entire Contract between the City and the Contractor and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations, or contracts, either written or oral. This Contract may be amended only by written instrument signed by both parties.
- L. <u>Independent Contractor</u>. Contractor shall perform the work under this Contract as an independent contractor and not as an employee of the City. The City has no right to supervise, direct, or control the Contractor or Contractors officers or employees in the means, method, or details of the work to be performed by Contractor under this Contract. The City and Contractor agree that the work performed under this Contract is not inherently dangerous, that Contractor will perform the work in a workmanlike manner, and that Contractor will take proper care and precautions to insure the safety of Contractor's officers and employees.

- M. <u>Dispute Resolution Procedures</u>. The Contractor and City desire an expeditious means to resolve any disputes that may arise between them regarding this Contract. If either party disputes any matter in relation to this Contract, the parties agree to try in good faith, before bringing any legal action, to settle the dispute by submitting the matter to mediation before a third party who will be selected by agreement of the parties. The parties will each pay one-half of the mediator's fees.
- N. <u>Severability</u>. If a court finds or rules that any part of this Contract is invalid or unlawful, the remainder of the Contract continues to be binding on the parties.

Discussion and action to approve second and final reading of Ordinance No. 18-14, amending Chapter 22 of the Code of Ordinances by amending Section 22-3 providing for amended terms, revising chairpersons voting authority and creating the position of vice chairman for the Shoreline Task Force.

ITEM BACKGROUND

It has come to the City Staff's attention that Chapter 22 is currently incongruent with our other City Boards. This minor edit to Section 22-3 will bring the Shoreline Task Force in line with all of the other advisory boards currently utilized in the City.

Current Chapter 22 Section 22-3 ordinance reads:

The City Council may appoint seven (7) individuals to serve on the Shoreline Task Force. The appointment of individuals shall be for two (2) year terms, such terms to be staggered, and all terms shall expire on September 30 of the year said members term is scheduled to expire or until their successor is appointed. The Task Force shall elect one of the members as Chairperson, and the Chairperson may not make or second motions and may only vote to break a tie vote and if the Chairperson is absent the members shall appoint a temporary Chairperson to preside at the meeting. The initial members appointed by the City Council shall have three (3) members appointed for a one (1) year term and four (4) members appointed for a two (2) year term, and thereafter all appointments will be for a two year term.

Modified Chapter 13 Section 13-24(E) ordinance as follows:

The City Council may appoint seven (7) individuals to serve on the Shoreline Task Force. The appointment of individuals shall be for two (2) year terms, such terms to be staggered, and all terms shall expire on December 31 of the year said members term is scheduled to expire or until their successor is appointed. The Task Force shall elect one of the members as Chairperson and another as vice-Chairperson, and if the Chairperson is absent the vice-Chairperson shall preside at the meeting. The Chairperson will function as a voting member of the SLTF. The initial members appointed by the City Council shall have three (3) members appointed for a one (1) year term and four (4) members appointed for a two (2) year term, and thereafter all appointments will be for a two year term.

ORDINANCE 2018-14

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 22 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS, BY AMENDING SECTION 22-3 PROVIDING FOR AMENDED TERMS, REVISING CHAIRPERSONS VOTING AUTHORITY AND CREATING THE POSITION OF VICE CHAIRMAN.

NOW THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS:

SECTION 1 CODE AMENDMENT

Chapter 22, Section 22-3 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of South Padre Island is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 22-3. - Shoreline task force-appointment.

The City Council may appoint seven (7) individuals to serve on the Shoreline Task Force. The appointment of individuals shall be for two (2) year terms, such terms to be staggered, and all terms shall expire on December 31 of the year said members term is scheduled to expire or until their successor is appointed. The Task Force shall elect one of the members as Chairperson and another as vice-Chairperson, and if the Chairperson is absent the vice-Chairperson shall preside at the meeting. The Chairperson will function as a voting member of the SLTF. The initial members appointed by the City Council shall have three (3) members appointed for a one (1) year term and four (4) members appointed for a two (2) year term, and thereafter all appointments will be for a two-year term.

SECTION 2 CUMULATIVE AND REPEALER CLAUSE

That this ordinance shall be cumulative of all provisions of the City's codes and ordinances except where the provisions of this Ordinance are in direct conflict with the provisions of such ordinance in which event the conflicting provisions of such ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3 SEVERABILITY

That it is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council of the City that the phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this Ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance should be declared unconstitutional by

the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs or sections of the Ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without incorporation in this ordinance of any such unconstitutional phrases, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.

SECTION 4 EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall be effective upon final passage and publication as required by the City Charter and State law.

On August 5, 2015, City Council formed a Food Truck Planning Committee (FTPC) to review a draft ordinance and recommend modifications for Council's consideration.

On February 17, 2016, the first reading of the Mobile Food Unit was approved.

On March 2, 2016, the first was again approved with the addition of the Bay Front District.

On April 6, 2016, the second and final reading was approved to adopt the new ordinance.

On May 22, 2017, a full evaluation of the pilot program was conducted by the FTPC and revisions are presented for City Council's consideration as stated in the current code of ordinance (Sec.10-31.1).

From April 6, 2016 to April 17, 2017, during the pilot program, four Mobile Food Unit Permits were issued.

On April 10, 2018 at 9:00AM, the FTPC met at Gabriella's and agreed that twelve (12) permits would be appropriate to be allowed by ordinance.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 18-15

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS, AMENDING SEC. 10-31; AMENDING SEC. 10-32; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY OF TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2000.00) FOR ANY VIOLATION; AND PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION IN CAPTION FORM.

Whereas, tourists from all over the world visit the City of South Padre Island;

Whereas, to promote a diversity of foods and benefit the City's economy;

Whereas, the City of South Padre Island deems it appropriate to provide for regulation of mobile food establishments in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS:

<u>SECTION 10-31</u>. of Chapter 10 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of South Padre Island pertaining to Mobile Food Units is hereby amended to update the following:

Sec.10-31 MOBILE FOOD UNITS.

- (A) In this section:
 - (1) PERMIT HOLDER means the person to whom the health authority issues a permit for a mobile food unit permit required by Chapter 10 of the Code of Ordinances.
 - (2) MOBILE FOOD UNIT (MFU) has the meaning established in Title 25, Part 1, Chapter 228 Subchapter A (*Definitions*) of the Texas Administrative Code and shall also mean a vehicle mounted, self or otherwise propelled, self-contained food service operation, designed to be readily movable (including, but not limited to catering trucks and trailers) and used to store, prepare, display, serve or sell food. Mobile units must completely retain their mobility at all times. A Mobile Food Unit does not include a stand or a booth.
 - (3) Push carts and roadside food vendor are strictly prohibited.
- (B) All mobile food units shall comply with all applicable laws, including the requirements of this article, except as otherwise provided in this section. The Environmental Health Director or designee may impose additional requirements to protect against health hazards related to the conduct of mobile food units and may prohibit the sale of potentially hazardous foods. The provisions of this section shall be enforceable by the Environmental Health Director or designee.
- (C) Mobile Food Unit and Permit Requirements.
 - (1) Designated Areas. The designated areas for mobile food units are District zoned "EDC" ("Entertainment District Core"), "BF" ("Bay Front"), and "PBN" ("Padre Boulevard North").

- (2) No more than Six (6) Twelve (12) mobile food unit permits may be issued per month on the Island.
- (3) Applicant must be supported locally and have the signature of an owner or designee of a licensed, free-standing food unit on South Padre Island before being eligible for a permit. Limit one local owner's (or designee's) signature per applicant.
- (4) Permit fees are as follows:
 - (a) September through February a monthly fee of \$100 shall be charged.
 - (b) March through August a monthly fee of \$500 shall be charged; or
 - (c) January through December (calendar year), yearly fee of \$1,800 shall be charged.
- (D) The City Manager or City Council may authorize additional "Designated Areas" with additional Mobile Food Establishments as needed.
- (E) A mobile food unit:
 - (1) Must obtain a health permit by the Health Director.
 - (2) Must demonstrate mobility of the mobile food unit at any time, if requested by the Environmental Health Director or designee.
 - (3) Must provide hand washing facilities within the mobile food truck (i.e. an insulated container with a spigot that can be turned on to allow potable, clean, free flowing warm water; a wastewater container); soap; disposable towels; and a waste receptacle.
 - (4) Must show evidence that restrooms and hand washing will be provided for patrons as necessary.
 - (5) Must have a current Texas Department of Motor Vehicle Registration Sticker.
 - (6) Must provide single-service articles, which are biodegradable or recycled products, for use by the consumers.
 - (7) All mobile food units may participate in South Padre Island special events.
- (F) The permit holder of a mobile food unit:
 - (1) Must comply with all requirements of Chapter 10 of the Code of Ordinances.
 - (2) Must apply to the Environmental Health Services Department prior to selling anything. a. A mobile food establishment permit is valid for 30 days.
 - (3) Must submit proof of Sales and Use Tax Permit issued by the State of Texas. If the permit allows multiple locations, then you must provide evidence of being a "list filer" and show proof that the City of South Padre Island is included on that list.
 - (4) Must display, at all times, the Health Permit in a conspicuous place where it can be easily read by the general public on the mobile food unit.

- (5) Shall keep the area around the mobile food establishment clear of litter and debris at all times.
- (6) Shall have adequate and approved garbage and refuse storage facilities for the operator's use and shall have garbage and refuse storage facilities immediately adjacent to the exterior of the mobile food establishments that are insect and rodent-proof for use by consumers. All garbage, refuse and garbage containers must be removed by the Mobile Food Unit upon departure.
- (7) Shall obtain a permit from the Fire Department for the use of Liquid Propane gas equipment for each mobile food establishment and shall make the permit available for inspection upon the request of the Fire Chief or designees or the Environmental Health Director or designee, if liquid propane is utilized by the Mobile Food Unit.
- (G) A mobile food unit may use a barbecue pit when:
 - (1) Must be enclosed in a trailer or the mobile food unit.
 - (2) The barbecue pit is used only for cooking. Processing, portioning, preparation, or assembly of food must be conducted from inside the mobile food establishment.
 - (3) A hand-washing system as defined in the Texas Food Establishment Rules, is provided adjacent to the barbecue pit.
 - (4) Food from a barbecue pit must be protected from the elements at all times. Including but not limited to airborne debris, flying insects, birds, and bird droppings.
- (H) A mobile food unit is limited to signs as required by Chapter 15. The signs must be secured and mounted flat against the mobile food unit, and may not project more than six inches from the exterior of the mobile food unit.
- (I) A permanent water or wastewater connection is prohibited.
 - (1) All water used in the mobile food unit must be from an approved public water system. A mobile food unit may also use commercially bottled water.
 - (2) The materials that are used in the construction of a mobile food unit's water tank and accessories shall be safe, durable, corrosion resistant, nonabsorbent, and finished to have a smooth and easily cleanable surface.
 - (3) A wastewater holding tank in a mobile food unit shall be sized 15% larger in capacity than the water supply tank and sloped to a drain that is 1 inch in inner diameter or greater and equipped with a shut off valve.
 - (4) Mobile Food Unit tank inlet.
 - A Mobile Food Unit's water tank inlet shall be:
 - (a) 19.1mm (3/4 inch) in inner diameter or less and
 - (b) Provided with a hose connection of a size or type that will prevent its use for any other service.
 - (c) Fill hose and water holding tank shall be labeled as "Potable Water."

- (J) Electrical service may be provided by:
 - (1) Temporary service;
 - (2) An onboard generator with the making of noise not to exceed (75) decibels; or
 - (3) Solar panels.
- (K) A mobile food unit's construction:
 - (1) Exterior shall be of weather-resistant materials and shall comply with all applicable laws.
 - (2) Interior shall be constructed of smooth, durable, easily cleanable surfaces. The mobile food unit shall be completely enclosed. No open truck beds; windows shall be screened or kept closed.
 - (3) The surface of the servicing area shall be constructed of a smooth nonabsorbent material, such as concrete or machine-laid asphalt and shall be maintained in good repair and kept clean.
- (L) Appointments for Mobile Food Unit inspections may be made by contacting the Environmental Health Department at (956) 761-8123, Monday Friday, 8am 5pm, excluding holidays.
- (M) All permit holders shall comply with this section. A violation of this section shall be fined as provided by Sec. 21-2 of the Code of Ordinances.
- Sec. 10-31.1 The Food Truck Planning Committee will meet as necessary, to evaluate the program's effectiveness and will take their recommendations to City Council no later than April 17, 2017.

Sec. 10-32 FOOD TRAILERS. MOBILITY.

Notwithstanding the requirement of mobility, a food trailer which is transported by a vehicle and then detached is permitted so long as both the permit holder and the trailer meet all the other conditions of this ordinance but such trailer must be removed within seventy (72) hours of the request under Section 10-31 (E) (2).

Sec. 10-33 Notwithstanding any other provision in this Code of Ordinances, this ordinance governing Mobile Food Units and Food Trailers identified in this Article II provides an exception for any of the activities authorized herein.

Sec.10-34 to 10-49 reserved for future expansion.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> Any violation of this Health and Sanitation Ordinance may be punished by a fine not to exceed two thousand dollars (\$2000.00) for each offense, and for each hour such offense shall continue shall be deemed a violation and a separate offense, and the penalty provisions of Sec. 21-2 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby adopted and incorporated for all purposes.

SECTION 3. If for any reason any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word, or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by final judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word, or provision of this Ordinance for it is the definite intent of this City Council that every section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase, word, or provision hereof be given full force and effect for its purpose.

<u>SECTION 4</u>. This Ordinance shall become effective when published in caption form.

About BRO

- The Brownsville South Padre Island International Airport is located in the southernmost part of Texas, with quick access to the Gulf of Mexico & the US Interstate highway system, BRO serves as a strategic port of entry. The airport is also a familiar beacon to the US for all international and domestic air carriers, as well to corporate and general aviation operators flying through the world's airspace system.
- At BRO, we have two runways capable of serving 95% of the existing commercial fleet and 100% of the corporate and general aviation fleet. ORDINANCE NO. 18-16

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS; AMENDING THE CITY'S FISCAL YEAR 2017 - 2018 OPERATING BUDGET TO INCORPORATE PRIOR BUDGET AMENDMENTS AND BUDGET MODIFICATIONS FOR THE MONTH OF APRIL 2018.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance 17-11, the City of South Padre Island (the "<u>City</u>") adopted the budget for the City for the fiscal year 2017 - 2018 (the "<u>Budget</u>), which provides funding for the City's operations throughout said fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the City needs to adjust the Budget for municipal purposes; and

WHEREAS, City staff has recommended that the City Council of the City adjust the Budget as provided for herein; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City has determined that it is in the best interests of the City to adjust the Budget as provided for herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS:

<u>Section 1</u>. The City's Budget is hereby adjusted as follows:

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that Applicant has agreed to comply with all provisions of the ordinances of the City, including but not limited to the Zoning Ordinance, and has further agreed to comply with the additional restrictions set forth herein;

WHEREAS, the City Council has investigated and determined that it would be fair to accommodate the Outdoor Amusement operations by granting the Specific Use Permit;

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City and the City Council, in compliance with the laws of the State of Texas and the requirements of Sec. 20-18 of the City Code of Ordinances (Zoning) have given requisite notice by publication and otherwise, and holding due hearings and affording a full and fair hearing to all property owners generally and to all persons interested and situated in the affected area and in the vicinity thereof, and in the exercise of its legislative discretion have concluded that the Specific Use Permit should be referenced on the Zoning Map as required by Section 20-24 of the City Code of Ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS:

- **Section 1.** The findings set forth above are incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if fully set forth herein.

- **Section 5.** All terms of this Specific Use Permit shall be complied with prior to issuance of a certificate of occupancy and shall be maintained thereafter. This Specific Use Permit will be declared null and void if:
 - 1. Any failure to comply with any term or condition of this Ordinance, as it exists or may be amended; or
 - 2. This Specific Use Permit was obtained by fraud or deception.

Discussion and action to enter into an agreement between the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), the United States Geological Survey (USGS) and PARTRAC GeoMarine Inc. To explore a particle tracing survey on material placed in the nearshore berm 2A/2B associated with the current BUDM project underway; and a budget adjustment for \$135,000 for the tracer study cost.

ITEM BACKGROUND

This study would provide the City with hard data on where material placed within 2A/2B ends up and how long it stays there. While City staff feels confident that the berm will stabilize our shoreline in that area and act as storm buffer, this study adheres to the City's desire for a scientific and analytical approach to managing our resources.

The tracer study objectives are to:

- 1) Test the postulated onshore sediment transport pathway for material placed on a recently constructed nearshore berm, offshore South Padre Island, Texas;
- 2) Test the postulated longshore and cross shore beach sediment transport pathways for material arriving at the beach from the nearshore berm;
- 3) Assess the rate of sediment transport following tracer deployment.

Deliverables

- Interim survey and data report(s) and a final interpretative report.
- Presentations on Final report to SPI.

A final presentation to SPI describing the report will be performed within 500 calendar days of ERDC-CHL receipt of funds.

Immediate partners

The USGS has research vessels and current measuring instruments they are willing to deploy for the data collection and an agreement for assistance writing a scientific study.

USACE has supplied us with their proposed scope of work and a proposed agreement

PARTRAC has supplied us with their proposed scope of work and a proposed contract.

Staff is also thinking long term and has engaged the GLO, USACE, United States Geographical Survey (USGS) and PARTRAC in establishing a proposed procedure for long term monitoring and study of SPI's coastal processes.

Long-term partners

The **GLO** is willing to expand our CEPRA agreements to be able to invest in a long term study "I believe this is an invaluable opportunity for such a study" (Thomas Durnin, email dated 5/3/18). While they are unable to get the money in place in time for this study, this funding source can serve invaluable for future efforts.

USACE has also stated the desire to utilize the resources in the Costal Scientific and Engineering Collaborative (CSEC) and the Engineer Research and Development Center (ERDC) both immediately and in the long term. A cost sharing initiative is being pursued through the "Planning Assistance to States" program which would allow for a 50-50 cost share.

USGS is interested in establishing a role in our long-term study as this work aligns perfectly with their mission. They are exploring the potential for both in-kind and monetary partnering with the City of South Padre Island. They have offered a three year partnership culminating in a published journal article.

PARTRAC will remain an integral part of SPI's nearshore and onshore monitoring as need dictates. They have proven to be a very helpful and reliable partner thus far in SPI's one and a half year relationship with them since signing a memorandum of understanding in September 12, 2016.

Invest in the tracer study. Due to USGS, USACE, and GLO, all having restrictive time constraints on their sources of money it appears that the financial burden for this initial study will fall to the City. Thanks to the "Coastal Coalition" being formed by the Shoreline Department the initial quotes of between \$207,000 and \$350,000 not including vessels or scientific instruments has been brought down to \$135,000 with the USGS and USACE aiding in cost-saving efforts.

Statement of Work (SOW) for "SAND TRACER STUDY OF A NEARSHORE BERM IN SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS"

1.0 Purpose

The City of South Padre Island (SPI) has engaged Partrac GeoMarine, Inc. (Partrac), a Marine Survey and Coastal Consultancy company, to conduct a sediment tracing study to evaluate sediment transport pathways of dredged material from a newly constructed nearshore berm offshore South Padre Island, Texas.

There is interest from SPI, the State of Texas General Land Office, the US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), and the US Geological Survey (USGS) to better understand the movement, of material from a nearshore berm placement to the active beach profile of South Padre Island.

The tasks outlined in this SOW will provide quantitative data to examine sediment transport pathways between the nearshore berm and South Padre Island beach, and pathways of material when on the beach. The data can be used to calibrate and validate sediment transport models that predict sediment transport rates and directions of nearshore placement, and will be of use in planning future BUDM projects.

2.0 Background




Fig. 1. Map of South Padre Island showing Placement Area 2B (highlighted in red).

The study will take advantage of an emergency dredging contract that is currently underway to remove material from the Brazos Island Harbor (BIH) Entrance Channel. Material from this contract will be used to construct a nearshore feeder berm in Placement Area 2B off South Padre Island (Fig. 1).

Several nearshore berm placements have taken place since 1988, with material being placed in the southerly Placement Area 1A/1B (See Fig. 1). Previous monitoring has shown that material moves towards the beach, with major dispersal in an alongshore direction.

Partrac has successfully undertaken a large number of nearshore and onshore sediment tracing projects, including a recent nearshore berm beneficial use project in Scotland.

2.1 Partrac tasks outline

The role of Partrac in the SPI sand tracer study will be to:

- 1) conduct an offshore and onshore background (Baseline) sediment survey;
- 2) deploy the tracer material at the berm site;
- 3) conduct an initial post-deployment offshore and onshore sediment sampling program;



- 4) interface with SPI, USGS, USACE personnel in the collection and handling of samples for subsequent sediment analysis;
- 5) provide support and guidance to project participants during the lifetime of the sampling program; and
- 6) provide interim reports and a final interpretative report following receipt of the results of the sediment sampling analyses. The interpretative report should consider all supporting datasets (e.g. hydrodynamic, bathymetric, topographic etc.).

It is understood that USACE are arranging for sediment samples to be analyzed under an existing contract by Texas A&M Galveston. Partrac will also interface with specified Texas A&M staff/ PhD students in the sediment analysis technique.

3.0 Objectives

The tracer study objectives are to:

- test the postulated onshore sediment transport pathway for material placed on a recently constructed nearshore berm, offshore South Padre Island, Texas;
- 2) test the postulated longshore and cross shore beach sediment transport pathways for material arriving at the beach from the nearshore berm;
- 3) assess the rate of sediment transport following tracer deployment.

4.0 Scope of Work

Following contract award Partrac will provide a detailed method statement for agreement with all relevant parties.

Task 1: Tracer deployment and sediment sampling

4.1) Baseline Survey

A random sediment sampling survey will be conducted by Partrac at and around the nearshore berm, and on the beach opposite and alongshore from the nearshore berm to determine unequivocally that the tracer particles are identifiable within the native sediment load. It is of note for example, that were there to be a high background signal of iron bearing (i.e. magnetic) material



present in the native sediments, the fluorescent signature would result in the tracer being uniquely identifiable within the native sediment load and vice-versa.

4.2) Deploy Tracer

2000 kg of dual signature (fluorescent/ferrimagnetic) tracer will be deployed by Partrac to the surface of the newly constructed nearshore berm.

4.3) Sediment (seabed and shoreface) sampling

Sediment grab sampling (offshore) and shallow core collection (onshore) will be conducted by Partrac, post tracer deployment, according to the following plan:

Campaign 1:

Seabed sampling: 1 day, following tracer deployment Beach sampling: 2 days, following tracer deployment

Campaign 2:

Seabed sampling: 4 days, following tracer deployment Beach sampling: 5 days, following tracer deployment

Campaign 3:

Seabed sampling: 7 days, following tracer deployment Beach sampling: 8 days, following tracer deployment

Note the schedule is flexible according to site conditions.

Partrac will interface with USGS, SPI and USACE staff as appropriate in the correct sampling method to be applied to subsequent sampling campaigns after Partrac staff are no longer on the ground.

Task 2: Data processing and report compilation

- 2.1) Tracer counts (converted to tracer dry mass) and associated QC data will be reviewed by Partrac and an interpretative assessment of the data provided.
- 2.2.) Interim and Final reports will be compiled and provided to SPI in a timely manner at the end of the sampling program.



<u>Assumptions</u>

Partrac are realistic in recognizing that tracing technology is one tool available to us for monitoring and understanding the transport processes of sediments in water borne environments and that in all studies the potential exists for high energy events to result in the loss of tracer material beyond/below the limit of detection. Throughout our correspondence with project partners we have strived to identify and communicate the limits associated with the technology and measures required to minimize these limits, for instance by introducing a greater mass of tracer material to the system. It is noteworthy determination of a material transport rate (principally derived from the location of the mass centroid of tracer) is achievable, however determination of transport rates along individual transport pathways is more complex and difficult to achieve. As the project develops we will be entirely open regarding the limits associated with interpretation of the data and will aim to improve upon these throughout.

The main assumptions are:

- 1) For hydraulic equivalence of the tracer with the natural sediment, USACE will provide Partrac with a representative grain size distribution of material to be used in the nearshore berm, collected in the Brownsville Ship Channel entrance; if this is not available at the time of tracer manufacture, Partrac will use historical grain size data supplied by USACE. It is important that the final hydraulic characteristics of the tracer material are agreed by all parties involved.
- USGS will provide a suitable vessel for use during tracer deployment and offshore sampling, and a small Smith-McIntyre or Van Veen grab for seabed sample collection during the initial sampling period and up to 7 days after tracer deployment;
- 3) It is expected that Partrac staff will be on site for a total period of approximately 10 days during the pre-deployment, deployment, and post-deployment phases;
- 4) Partrac staff will participate in the planning meetings arranged by SPI/USACE to coincide with the tracer deployment;
- 5) USACE will arrange for sediment samples collected by grab and coring to be analyzed by Texas A&M. Partrac will provide suitable guidance in the analysis method to appropriate Texas A&M staff or PhD students;
- 6) Texas A&M will provide Partrac with the results of the sediment sample analyses in a timely manner after sample collection.
- 7) SPI will provide storage for the tracer and any equipment used by Partrac before and during the tracer deployment and initial sampling campaign.
- 8) All ancillary data collected during the study will be made available to Partrac in a timely manner.



Recommendations

- Partrac recommends that a current meter/wave measuring device is deployed on the seabed near to the tracer deployment zone for as long a period as possible immediately prior to and during the sediment sampling program.
- 2) Partrac recommends that sediment sampling on the beach, and offshore, is conducted at the following intervals after Partrac staff are no longer on the ground: 7, 14, 28, 90, 180, 270 and 365 days following tracer deployment. In addition, if possible, additional sampling campaigns (both offshore and onshore) should be conducted following high energy events (i.e. storms).

Other

- 1) Partrac will make every effort to ensure timely delivery of the tracer following receipt of a Purchase Order from SPI. Partrac cannot be held responsible for delays caused, or charges incurred, by US Customs. Note: normal delivery time is between 28-42 days, and there have been no significant delays with previous importation of tracer into the US.
- 2) All data, after the final report has been submitted, belong to SPI, USGS, USACE, Partrac and Texas A&M.
- 3) Partrac are happy for USGS to be lead author on a publication to be submitted to an International Scientific Journal reporting the results of the tracer and nearshore berm study.

5.0 Cost

Partrac will undertake the SOW as described for a total cost of \$76, 750 (see Quotation).

Statement of Work for "SAND TRACER STUDY OF A NEARSHORE BERM IN SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS"

1.0 Purpose.




Figure 1. Map of South Padre Island and nearshore berm site.

The City of South Padre Island (SPI) has engaged the Galveston District (SWG) through the Planning Assistance to States program to monitor and analyze ongoing beneficial placement of dredge material in a nearshore berm off the coast of SPI. This Statement of Work (SOW) is to assist SPI's vendor in monitoring and quantifying the evolution of a nearshore berm. SPI's vendor is using particle tracing technology, and there is interest from the city, state (Texas General Land Office) and USACE to better understand the quantity and time scales necessary to move a nearshore berm into the active beach profile in this region (Figure 1). The tasks outlined in this SOW would provide quantitative data on the timing and effectiveness of nearshore placement and would be advantageous in planning future beneficial use of dredge material projects.




Figure 2. Detailed map of South Padre Island and nearshore berm site.

2.0 Background

2.1 General Requirement

An emergency dredging contract is currently underway to remove material from the Brazos Island Harbor (BIH) Entrance Channel. A USACE dredge, *McFarland*, will be performing the work, as no industry hoppers dredges were able to perform the work. The incremental cost to place this material closer to the beach rather than in the ODMDS is locally funded. USACE and SPI have partnered in the past on similar nearshore projects, however there remains considerable uncertainty regarding the timing and quantity of material that is mobilized to the littoral zone. While nearshore placement is typically less expensive than beach placement, further quantitative evidence is needed to understand how the material spreads and is eventually pushed up into the active surf zone.

2.2 Project History and Proposed Methods

On SPI, sediment removed by maintenance dredging is regularly placed back into the littoral system, available for cross shore and longshore sediment transport to the beaches. For nearshore placement, maintenance material is placed by hopper dredge in the Nearshore "Feeder" Berm Site. Previous monitoring of material placed at the Feeder Berm has demonstrated that it moves

toward the beach and disperses with the major movement being in the alongshore direction. Table 1 contains the dredging placement history in SPI with 4.4 million cubic yards being placed in the nearshore.

Other previous work includes numerous studies and publications documenting placements, the ongoing Coastal Texas Mega-Study, Sediment budget creation for the area, Beach-fx modeling, annual beach profile surveys conducted by SPI and USACE, Bureau of Economic Geology studies, previous beach nourishment designs, etc. In addition to previous work conducted, models development through the Coastal Inlets Research Program (CIRP) and the Regional Sediment Management (RSM) Program exist and will be leveraged to help complete analyses discussed in this SOW.

This study will include two major sets of tasks. The first will result in the deployment of several thousand pounds of florescent sediment tracer on the newly completed berm. A subsequent surface sediment sampling effort will be made at defined time steps in order to map the movement of the berm. This will be combined with high frequency hydrographic surveys to quantify the movement of the berm. The second task will be the post processing of the data and comparison of the physical data results to the Sediment Mobility Tool (SMT) and the existing Coastal Modeling System (CMS) numerical model over the same time period. To achieve this goal, the following general procedure will occur:

- SPI conducts tracer deployment and subsequent sediment sample collections at precoordinated intervals
- 2. USACE-SWG utilizing a CESU mechanism performs the sediment sample tracer counts
- 3. USACE-SWG using hydrosurvey data performs analyses of sediment quantity movement and compares this to the spatial and temporal variability of the tracer data to determine estimated quantity and timing of sediment movement
- 4. USACE Coastal Hydraulics Laboratory (CHL) compares the SMT to the results of the field study
- 5. USACE SWG/CHL qualitatively evaluates the numerical modeling results of the existing CMS model and subsequently calibrates the model to the physical data
- 6. Formalize and document the results

3.0 Objectives.

This study consists of the following objectives:

- 1. Intensively monitor the nearshore berm project
 - a. Sediment tracers
 - b. Sediment sampling
 - c. Beach and Hydrographic surveying
- 2. Analyze, and document sand transport vectors and time scales
- 3. Evaluate the approximation of the SMT to actual data
- 4. Estimate the physical processes through the numerical model, CMS and calibrate the model to the physical data
 - a. Document and develop recommendations for future beneficial use efforts

4.0 Scope of Work.

Task 1: Tracer deployment and subsequent monitoring

Task 1.1: Deploy tracer

This task will begin by placing several thousand pounds of tracer medium on the surface of the recently completed nearshore berm. This will include 10 field days to train in the collection of sampling, assist in the sampling design, and oversee the overall study.

Task 1.2: Collect sediment samples

A site visit will be conducted to South Padre Island with SWG and ERDC and any other partners identified by the Sponsor. The objectives of this meeting include discussing the previously completed similar efforts, identifying SPI needs, clarifying individual roles and responsibilities, and formalizing the sediment data collection plan. The initial site visit will be performed during one of the initial sediment sample collection events and will include all parties. The proposed grab sampling schedule is below:

- 1. 24 hour on berm (50 samples)
- 2. 28 hour on beach (50 samples)
- 3. 7 days 100m x 100m grid (100 samples)
- 4. 14 days 100m x 100m grid (100 samples)
- 5. 28 days 100m x 100m grid (100 samples)
- 6. 3 months 100m x 100m grid (100 samples)
- 7. 6 months 100m x 100m grid (100 samples)
- 8. 9 months -100 m x 100 m grid (100 samples)
- 9. 12 months 100m x 100m grid (100 samples)

Task 1.3: Beach surveying

The SPI staff will conduct periodic land survey of the beaches 2 miles on either side of the berm location at a minimum whenever a hydrographic survey is conducted.

Task 1.4: Hydrographic surveying

The SWG will collect hydrographic surveys at the timing agreed upon during the site visit and as resources allow.

Task 1.5: Analyze samples

A CESU mechanism will be used to perform tracer counts on the collected samples.

Task 2: Data processing and model analysis

Task 2.1: Geospatially define sediment vectors

Volume change analysis of the hydrographic survey data along with the sampling results will enable to determination of sediment vectors. This data will then be able to be analyzed to determine the quantity and timescales of sediment movement by these berms.

Task 2.2: Compare the results to SMT

The exactness of the SMT will be compared to the physical data.

Task 2.3: Approximate the physical processes using CMS and calibrate the existing model

Using the physical data the existing CMS model will be compare and ultimately calibrate to replicate the movement seen in the model.

Task 3: Letter Report evaluating the nearshore berm effectiveness and tools used to estimate and place them along with future recommendations

The evaluation of the nearshore berm placement in terms of sediment movement in the active littoral zone will be rolled up in a letter report describing the whole event and providing estimated costs and lessons learned. This report will be drafted up by the ERDC with assistance from SWG. A final team meeting to discuss the results and final report will be held in the SPI or SWG offices.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ARMY AND

THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS FOR DEVELOPMENT OF A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into this 16 day of May, 2018, by and between the Department of the Army (hereinafter the "Government"), represented by the U.S. Army Engineer, Galveston District (hereinafter the "District Engineer") and the City of South Padre Island, Texas (hereinafter the "Non-Federal Sponsor"), represented by the Shoreline Director.

WITNESSETH, THAT:

WHEREAS, Section 22 of the Water Resources Development Act of 1974, as amended (42 U.S.C. 1962d-16) authorizes the Secretary of the Army, acting through the Chief of Engineers, to provide assistance in the preparation of a comprehensive water resources plan (hereinafter the "Plan") to a State or non-Federal interest working with a State, and to establish and collect fees for the purpose of recovering 50 percent of the costs of such assistance except that Secretary may accept and expend non-Federal funds provided that are in excess of such fee; and

WHEREAS, the Government and the Non-Federal Sponsor have the full authority and capability to perform in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. The Government shall develop the Plan, in coordination with the Non-Federal Sponsor, in accordance with the attached Scope of Work, and any modifications thereto, that specifies the scope, cost, and schedule for activities and tasks, including the Non-Federal Sponsor's in-kind services.
- 2. The Non-Federal Sponsor shall provide 50 percent of the costs for developing the Plan in accordance with the provisions of this paragraph. As of the effective date of this Agreement, the costs of developing the Plan are projected to be \$____300,000______, with the Government's share of such costs projected to be \$____150,000_____, and the Non-Federal Sponsor's share of such costs projected to be \$____150,000_____, which includes estimated credit in the amount of \$____150,000_____, for in-kind services.
- a. After considering the estimated amount of credit for in-kind services that will be afforded in accordance with paragraph 4, if any, the Government shall provide the Non-Federal Sponsor with a written estimate of the amount of funds required from the Non-Federal Sponsor for the initial fiscal year of development of the Plan, with a fiscal year beginning on October 1st and ending on September 30th of the following

year. No later than 15 calendar days after such notification, the Non-Federal Sponsor shall provide the full amount of such funds to the Government by delivering a check payable to "FAO, USAED, **Galveston District (M3)**" to the District Engineer or by providing an Electronic Funds Transfer of such required funds in accordance with procedures established by the Government.

- b. No later than August 1st prior to each subsequent fiscal year during development of the Plan, the Government shall provide the Non-Federal Sponsor with a written estimate of the amount of funds required from the Non-Federal Sponsor during that fiscal year. No later than September 1st prior to that fiscal year, the Non-Federal Sponsor shall provide the full amount of such required funds to the Government using one of the payment mechanisms specified in paragraph 2.a. above.
- c. If the Government determines at any time that additional funds are needed from the Non-Federal Sponsor to cover the Non-Federal Sponsor's costs of developing the Plan, the Government shall provide the Non-Federal Sponsor with written notice of the amount of additional funds required. Within 60 calendar days of such notice, the Non-Federal Sponsor shall provide the Government with the full amount of such additional funds.
- d. Upon completion of the Plan and resolution of any relevant claims and appeals, the Government shall conduct a final accounting and furnish the Non-Federal Sponsor with the written results of such final accounting. Should the final accounting determine that additional funds are required from the Non-Federal Sponsor, the Non-Federal Sponsor, within 60 calendar days of written notice from the Government, shall provide the Government with the full amount of such additional funds. Should the final accounting determine that the Non-Federal Sponsor has provided funds in excess of its required amount, the Government shall refund the excess amount, subject to the availability of funds. Such final accounting does not limit the Non-Federal Sponsor's responsibility to pay its share of costs, including contract claims or any other liability that may become known after the final accounting.
- 3. In addition to its required cost share, the Non-Federal Sponsor may determine that it is in its best interests to provide additional funds for development of the Plan. Additional funds provided under this paragraph and obligated by the Government are not included in calculating the Non-Federal Sponsor's required cost share and are not eligible for credit or repayment.
- 4. The in-kind services includes those activities (including services, materials, supplies, or other in-kind services) that are required for development of the Plan and would otherwise have been undertaken by the Government and that are specified in the Scope of Work and performed or provided by the Non-Federal Sponsor after the effective date of this Agreement and in accordance with the Scope of Work. The Government shall credit towards the Non-Federal Sponsor's share of costs, the costs, documented to the satisfaction of the Government, that the Non-Federal Sponsor incurs in providing or performing in-kind services, including associated supervision and administration. Such

costs shall be subject to audit in accordance with paragraph 9 to determine reasonableness, allocability, and allowability, and crediting shall be in accordance with the following procedures, requirements, and limitations:

- a. As in-kind services are completed and no later than 60 calendar day after such completion, the Non-Federal Sponsor shall provide the Government appropriate documentation, including invoices and certification of specific payments to contractors, suppliers, and the Non-Federal Sponsor's employees. Failure to provide such documentation in a timely manner may result in denial of credit. The amount of credit afforded for in-kind services shall not exceed the Non-Federal Sponsor's share of costs.
- b. No credit shall be afforded for interest charges, or any adjustment to reflect changes in price levels between the time the in-kind services are completed and credit is afforded; for the value of in-kind services obtained at no cost to the Non-Federal Sponsor; or for costs that exceed the Government's estimate of the cost for such item if it had been performed by the Government.
- 5. The Non-Federal Sponsor shall not use Federal Program funds to meet any of its obligations under this Agreement unless the Federal agency providing the funds verifies in writing that the funds are authorized to be used for the Plan. Federal program funds are those funds provided by a Federal agency, plus any non-Federal contribution required as a matching share therefor.
- 6. In carrying out its obligations under this Agreement, the Non-Federal Sponsor shall comply with all the requirements of applicable Federal laws and implementing regulations, including, but not limited to: Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (P.L. 88-352), as amended (42 U.S.C. 2000d), and Department of Defense Directive 5500.11 issued pursuant thereto; the Age Discrimination Act of 1975 (42 U.S.C. 6102); and the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (29 U.S.C. 794), and Army Regulation 600-7 issued pursuant thereto.
- 7. Upon 30 calendar days written notice to the other party, either party may elect, without penalty, to suspend or terminate further development of the Plan. Any suspension or termination shall not relieve the parties of liability for any obligation incurred.
- 8. As a condition precedent to a party bringing any suit for breach of this Agreement, that party must first notify the other party in writing of the nature of the purported breach and seek in good faith to resolve the dispute through negotiation. If the parties cannot resolve the dispute through negotiation, they may agree to a mutually acceptable method of non-binding alternative dispute resolution with a qualified third party acceptable to the parties. Each party shall pay an equal share of any costs for the services provided by such a third party as such costs are incurred. The existence of a dispute shall not excuse the parties from performance pursuant to this Agreement.
- 9. The parties shall develop procedures for the maintenance by the Non-Federal Sponsor of books, records, documents, or other evidence pertaining to costs and expenses

for a minimum of three years after the final accounting. The Non-Federal Sponsor shall assure that such materials are reasonably available for examination, audit, or reproduction by the Government.

- a. The Government may conduct, or arrange for the conduct of, audits of the Plan. Government audits shall be conducted in accordance with applicable Government cost principles and regulations. The Government's costs of audits for the Plan shall not be included in the shared costs of the Plan, but shall be included in calculating the overall Federal cost of the Plan.
- b. To the extent permitted under applicable Federal laws and regulations, the Government shall allow the Non-Federal Sponsor to inspect books, records, documents, or other evidence pertaining to costs and expenses maintained by the Government, or at the request of the Non-Federal Sponsor, provide to the Non-Federal Sponsor or independent auditors any such information necessary to enable an audit of the Non-Federal Sponsor's activities under this Agreement. The costs of non-Federal audits shall be paid solely by the Non-Federal Sponsor without reimbursement or credit by the Government.
- 10. In the exercise of their respective rights and obligations under this Agreement, the Government and the Non-Federal Sponsor each act in an independent capacity, and neither is to be considered the officer, agent, or employee of the other. Neither party shall provide, without the consent of the other party, any contractor with a release that waives or purports to waive any rights a party may have to seek relief or redress against that contractor.
- 11. Any notice, request, demand, or other communication required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be deemed to have been duly given if in writing and delivered personally or mailed by certified mail, with return receipt, as shown below. A party may change the recipient or address for such communications by giving written notice to the other party in the manner provided in this paragraph.

Hydroacoustic Flow Monitoring and Sediment Sampling for Offshore Dredge Material in South Padre Island, Texas

Introduction: Understanding sediment movement in channels and along beaches in the Padre Island area is critical for resource managers and all stakeholders. Sediment can deposit over time in entrances to the harbor channel areas impeding boat traffic and requiring dredging. Beaches can erode with time losing valuable shoreline for recreation. The placement of the sediment material from dredging offshore in berms may have the potential to replenish beaches as this sediment migrates alongshore.

Currently there is an emergency dredging of the Brazos Island Harbor Entrance Channel near South Padre Island with the material to be placed in an offshore berm. The City of South Padre Island is working with Partrac GeoMarine, Inc. (Partrac) to conduct a sediment transport study using tracer material (approximately 2000 kg) that will be added to the offshore berm. Tagged sediment particles could help understanding sediment migration from the berm over time.

Problem Statement: The movement of sediment data from the offshore berm to onshore beaches is not well known. Sediment transport is highly dependent on local conditions. Without monitoring data (velocities, sediment samples, and bathymetry to name a few) it is difficult evaluate the success of projects. Monitoring data are vital for resource managers for making informed decisions. Understanding the water/sediment resource and how the sediment delivery system operates is needed for all stakeholders. In addition, these data are critical for the calibration and validate of sediment transport models that can help predict "what if" scenarios and future planning.

Objectives and Scope: The U.S. Geological Survey (USGS), South Texas Program office would work with Partrac Inc. to conduct a sediment sampling surveys, at time of berm placement and then post berm construction. The sediment sampling and methods would follow protocols specified by Partrac. There would be nine (9) data campaigns from initial berm construction to nearly one year later. A post storm campaign (if needed) would also be performed. Collection of sediment grab samples for both offshore and shallow cores (onshore). Sediment samples would be delivered to the specified analytical laboratory for tracer quantification.

Hydroacoustic data (current, velocity, and bed movement) would also be collected by the USGS at the time of sediment sample collection to provide a synoptic "snapshot" by their ADCM (Acoustic Doppler Current Profiler). The USGS would follow all USGS protocols for collection, processing and storing of hydroacoustic data.

The USGS has a suitable vessel, sampling gear, and ADCP equipment for the study.

Deliverables: The USGS will be responsible for all their work for data collection and interpretation according to USGS standards.

- Data, interpretation, and report to the City of South Padre Island (and other partners).
- Presentations and interim meetings/updates to the City of South Padre Island. Typically, presentation are three times a year (or more often as requested by the City).
- All data collected by the USGS will be stored according to their protocols and quality checked.
- A journal article or other suitable publication (USGS report) on the findings of the study.
- The USGS will take the lead author on the publication in conjunction with Partrac and their data collected together.

Timeline: The USGS Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) is from Oct. 1st to Sept. 30th.


The initial phase of data collection will begin in FY18 and continue in FY19.



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
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
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
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
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

































Fig. 7. Summarized trend vectors and 1975 shoreline erosion/accretion rates

CONCEPTUAL MODEL

Residual vectors are summarized on an overlay of sand and silt distributions from the 1976 survey (Fig. 7). Coastal erosion/accretion rates prior to the 1976 survey are also illustrated (Morton and Pieper, 1975).

A conceptual model of transport pathways and processes (Fig. 8) shows two major pathways, from the north and the south. The majority of sediment in the northern pathway moves offshore, however fine to very coarse sand is introduced into the South Padre Island system from a nearshore source extending from at least 10 mi north of Mansfield Channel to ~10 mi south of the channel, bypassing the channel entrance.

Coarse silt is introduced from the south via a major, northwardstrending pathway. A possible relict source (White et al., 1986), or 'redistribution center', also supplies the southern part of the South Padre Island sediment system. Interestingly, where convergence zones occur near the shore, there appear to be well defined pathways transporting sand and fines at least 10 mi offshore, where they may be lost to the sediment system.

Discussion and action to approve Resolution No. 2018-14 requesting that the State of Texas and specifically the Texas General Land Office annually set aside a portion of State GOMESA funds for Texas coastal municipalities and their implementing entities within the coastal zone, as defined in the Texas Coastal Management Program.

ITEM BACKGROUND

Due to the large influx of GOMESA funding tied to offshore energy revenues, the State has recently experienced a massive influx of funding. The GLO is intending to parse out this funding in a competitive manner without taking into account the coastal city's unique burden to adhere to mandates passed down from the state. This resolution would add SPI's voice to several other coastal communities in resolving:

- 1. That from state GOMESA revenues, the Texas General Land Office should annually set aside for Texas coastal municipalities or municipal coastal entities with direct responsibility to implement CEPRA, CMP, DPA and/ or OBA an amount of annual funds equal to the total annual GOMESA revenues awarded to all Texas coastal counties; and
- 2. That the coastal municipality set-aside of state GOMESA revenues be distributed on a competitive basis only to Texas coastal municipalities or municipal coastal entities with direct responsibility to implement CEPRA, CMP, DPA and/ or OBA; and
- 3. That the Texas General Land Office and Texas Legislature should not seek to substitute state GOMESA revenues to replace current state appropriations for CEPRA or other existing state coastal grant programs but instead seek to maintain these existing state revenue commitments consistent with sound fiscal practices; and
- 4. That Texas General Land Office support and be consistent with federal GOMESA laws and regulations allowing local GOMESA funds to be used as match for other federal grant programs.

RESOLUTION NO. 2018-14

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS, REQUESTING THAT THE STATE OF TEXAS AND SPECIFICALLY THE TEXAS GENERAL LAND OFFICE ANNUALLY SET ASIDE A PORTION OF STATE GOMESA FUNDS FOR TEXAS COASTAL MUNICIPALITIES AND THEIR IMPLEMENTING ENTITIES WITHIN THE COASTAL ZONE, AS DEFINED IN THE TEXAS COASTAL MANAGEMENT PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, the Texas coast and its diverse economy provide significant economic, recreational, and spiritual benefits to the all people of Texas and state investment in the coastal region is critical to the future of this great state;

WHEREAS, the federal Gulf of Mexico Energy Security Act (GOMESA) of 2006 shares leasing revenues with Gulf producing states and the Land & Water Conservation Fund for coastal restoration projects; and

WHEREAS, the State of Texas received \$40.5 million in GOMESA revenue in FY-2017; and

WHEREAS, \$10.1 million in FY-2017 GOMESA revenue was distributed to "coastal political subdivisions," defined as coastal counties within the CMP boundary, specifically including: Aransas County, Brazoria County, Calhoun County, Cameron County, Chambers County, Galveston County, Harris County, Jackson County, Jefferson County, Kenedy County, Kleberg County, Matagorda County, Nueces County, Orange County, Refugio County, San Patricio County, Victoria County, and Willacy County; and

WHEREAS, "political subdivision" is defined to mean, "the local political jurisdiction immediately below the level of State government, including counties, parishes, and boroughs", therefore specifically <u>excluding</u> the Texas coastal municipalities from any direct local government distribution of GOMESA funds set aside for "coastal political subdivisions; and


WHEREAS, no provision in GOMESA or its implementing regulations permit coastal municipalities to apply for or mandate that coastal municipalities can participate in GOMESA distributions made to coastal counties;

WHEREAS, the State of Texas, acting through the General Land Office, will receive a direct Phase II GOMESA distribution capped at \$100 million annually until 2055 and has received its first state distribution in the amount of \$40.5M for FY 2017;


WHEREAS, no provision in GOMESA or its implementing regulations permit coastal municipalities to apply for or mandate that coastal municipalities can participate in GOMESA distributions made to the state of Texas;

WHEREAS, Cities and Counties are a declining share of CMP Applicants and Grant Awards such that:

 Over the past two years, only 17 of 93 CMP grant applications (18.3%) were submitted by cities and counties. Over the past five years, only 51 of 236 CMP applications (21.6%) were submitted by local government entities.



 Over the past five years, only \$1,578,394 in CMP funds were awarded to local governments. This represents only 18.4% of the \$8,565,640 of total CMP awards over the period.



- Over the past two years, \$402,719 in CMP funding was awarded to cities and counties. This represents 11.5% of the \$3,480,000 of total CMP awards over that period.
- Over the same five CMP cycles, 128 of 236 applications (54%) were submitted by universities and the General Land Office awarded \$4,230,008 or 49.3% of all CMP funds to universities;

WHEREAS, Texas coastal counties are now direct GOMESA recipients, but coastal municipalities are excluded from any direct GOMESA funding;

WHEREAS, the coastal municipalities of Texas are responsible in various degrees for compliance with and implementation of the Texas Open Beaches Act of 1959, Dune Protection Act, CEPRA, and CMP implementation; and

WHEREAS, state funding support for meeting these implementation responsibilities is limited and inadequate for the coastal communities of Texas, creating financial stress of coastal municipalities to fulfill these state-mandated programs; and

WHEREAS, GOMESA revenues are reserved for the following purposes:

- 1. Projects and activities for the purpose of coastal protection, including conservation, coastal restoration, hurricane protection, and infrastructure directly affected by coastal wetland losses;
- 2. Mitigation of damage to fish, wildlife, or natural resources;
- 3. Implementation of a federally-approved marine, coastal, or comprehensive conservation management plan;
- 4. Mitigation of the impact of OCS activities through the funding of onshore infrastructure projects; and

5. Planning assistance and administrative costs not-to-exceed 3 percent of the amounts received.

WHEREAS, state GOMESA funds administered through the General Land Office suitable for and critical to carrying out state-mandated priorities for Texas coastal municipalities within the CMP boundary.

NOW THEREFORE; BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TEXAS CHAPTER OF ASBPA/CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SOUTH PADRE ISLAND, TEXAS:

- That from state GOMESA revenues, the Texas General Land Office should annually set aside for Texas coastal municipalities or municipal coastal entities with direct responsibility to implement CEPRA, CMP, DPA and/ or OBA an amount of annual funds equal to the total annual GOMESA revenues awarded to all Texas coastal counties; and
- 2. That the coastal municipality set-aside of state GOMESA revenues be distributed on a competitive basis only to Texas coastal municipalities or municipal coastal entities with direct responsibility to implement CEPRA, CMP, DPA and/ or OBA; and
- 3. That the Texas General Land Office and Texas Legislature should not seek to substitute state GOMESA revenues to replace current state appropriations for CEPRA or other existing state coastal grant programs but instead seek to maintain these existing state revenue commitments consistent with sound fiscal practices; and
- That Texas General Land Office support and be consistent with federal GOMESA laws and regulations allowing local GOMESA funds to be used as match for other federal grant programs.
