Tropical Storm Watch canceled for SPI

South Padre Island, TX, Sept. 20, 2020: The Tropical Storm Watch that was issued for the Lower Texas Coast has been canceled. Local impacts will be coastal flooding, dangerous surf and rip currents, and beach erosion for the Island.

Tropical Storm Watch issued for SPI

South Padre Island, TX, Sept. 19, 2020: A Tropical Storm Watch has been issued for the Lower Texas Coast. Currently, storm models show Tropical Storm Beta heading westward before shifting north-northeast. The National Weather Service is predicting one to two inches of rain with moderate winds beginning Sunday through Tuesday.

This storm may cause coastal flooding, dangerous surf and rip currents, and beach erosion for the Island. The community should continue to follow weather updates.

"While Beta's path is further north than initially projected, it is best for everyone to be prepared," said Jim Pigg, Fire chief. "Planning what to do in advance is an important part of being prepared."
