DUNE PLANTING METHODOLOGY

Dune Vegetation

EarthBalance[®] will furnish all necessary plants, equipment, labor, and materials in connection with the establishment of vegetation for the purpose of dune protection at the City of South Padre Island, Texas within the limits shown on the contract drawings in strict accordance with the specifications and drawings following the procedures outlined in the Coastal Dunes – Dune Protection and Improvement Manual for the Texas Gulf Coast, Fifth Edition.

EarthBalance[®] proposes to supply and install 36,000 sea oats (*Uniola paniculata*) and 36,000 bitter panicum (*Panicum amarum*). The plants will be grown in 2-inch multi-well trays (liners) with a minimum height of 12 inches and a fully developed root ball that is consistent with the size of the specified container, but is not root-bound, at the time of delivery. The plant root shall fill the soil cell. The plants will be healthy, disease-free, and actively growing when installed. The root ball will be properly moistened to prevent desiccation. All planting units will be handled, packed, transported, and stored at the installation site in a manner as to ensure protection against desiccation, thermal stress, disease, or physical damage.

Plant Unit Handling

All plant units will be in conformance with the specifications. At least 10 days' notice will be provided prior to delivery of any plants or equipment. Plants will be watered and then boxed up (3 trays of plants per box) at the EarthBalance[®] Native Nursery the morning of transport. Boxes are necessary to protect the plants during transport. A full load of boxes will be stacked into an enclosed plant trailer (approximately 24' trailer) and contain the entirety of the plants. Plants will be delivered to the project site in their original trays to ensure good plant condition and prevent desiccation. Upon arrival at the project site the plants will be stored in the enclosed plant trailer to keep them protected from the heat until they are ready to install. The plants can be stored safely in the boxes for 7-10 days on the trailer; however, they are likely to be installed in less than 5 days. The trailer has front and rear doors that will be open for air circulation during the heat of the day. In our experience, this method of transport ensures the best plant condition upon arrival and upon installation of the material. The experienced EarthBalance[®] planting crew supervisor will verify the plant condition meets the project specifications prior to planting each day.

Planting units will be installed utilizing a rotary auger on a portable gasoline-powered drill. An approximately 2-inch diameter by 8-inch-deep hole will be drilled for each planting unit. The top of the root ball will be completely covered by at least 6 inches of sand after installation. EarthBalance[®] has found this installation method to be very efficient and results in much more uniform spacing than hand-digging techniques. In

addition, the planting depth can be controlled utilizing a stop on the auger bit. This method results in very minimal sand fracture, which better preserves ambient soil moisture.

Plants will be spaced on 12-inch centers, with each successive alongshore line staggered by approximately 12-inches in the alongshore direction half of the distance between plant units. Sea oats will be interspersed throughout the bitter panicum at a ratio of 1:1. Plants will be installed in a continuous progression along the beach, completing each planting zone before moving on to the next.

Pre-hydrated water retention gel will be added into each planting hole along with Osmocote 18-6-12 to help bolster initial survival of the plants.

Crew Supervisor

The project will be supervised by a Project Manager and a Crew Supervisor. The Crew Supervisor will be responsible for daily onsite management of the crew. Crew Foremen will coordinate crew labor under the direction of the Crew Supervisor. Both the crew foreman and crew supervisor have a lengthy history and knowledge in dune restoration having worked on numerous beach restoration projects spanning the east coast and southern United States.

Nursery Location

Plants are being propagated at the EarthBalance[®] Native Nursery in DeSoto County, Florida. The nursery address is 1904 County Road 760A, Arcadia, FL 34266.

Warranty

The project success criteria and replanting requirements will be followed. These include 100% survival for at least 10 days and an 85% survival rate at 180 days.

SAND FENCE METHODOLOGY

Sand Fence

EarthBalance[®] will furnish all necessary equipment, labor, and materials in connection with the installment of sand fence for the purpose of dune protection at the City of South Padre Island, Texas within the limits shown on the contract drawings in strict accordance with the specifications and drawings following the procedures outlined in the Coastal Dunes – Dune Protection and Improvement Manual for the Texas Gulf Coast, Fifth Edition.

EarthBalance[®] will supply and install 360 fence panels approximately 5-10 feet Gulf-ward of any existing dunes within the project extent. Panels will be 10 feet in length and installed at a 35 degree angle to the shoreline. The panels will be spaced at 10-foot increments throughout the project limits. The panels will actually be 11 feet in length and

will be wrapped 6 inches around each post. EarthBalance[®] also has budgeted to install up to 72 dune protection signs on 4-inchX4-inchX8-feet signposts at 50-foot intervals throughout project extent.

Materials

The fence posts will be white cedar with a length of 7 feet and a diameter of 3 inches. Panels will consist of white cedar wooden slats woven together with four 2-wire strands of 13 steel wire gauge galvanized wire. The panels will consist of 1 and a half-inch slats spaced 2 and a quarter-inches apart. Panels will be connected to the posts with galvanized stainless steel u-shaped staples over the 2-wire strands.

Installment Methods

Sand fence will be installed in a continuous progression along the beach. Fence posts will be installed in entirety prior to starting panel installation. Fence post location will be field located by an experienced EarthBalance[®] crew supervisor to determine the exact placement Gulf-ward of the existing dunes to not encroach on public use of the beach at normal high tide. Post holes will be dug three feet deep using a low-impact tracked skid-steer with a 10-inch auger bit. If a skid-steer is not permitted on the beach, installation will occur with handheld gas-powered augers. Posts will be placed within the hole, leveled, backfilled, and then packed to ensure the posts do not budge. Posts will be installed with 3 feet in the ground and 4 feet out to provide a uniform look.

After the entirety of posts are installed the crew will start panel installation, moving in a continuous progression along the beach. A trench approximately 6 inches deep will be dug from post to post. The fence panel will be placed within the trench and stretched from post to post. The panel will be facing Gulf-ward and will have 6 inches of wrap around each post. The panels will be connected to the posts using galvanized stainless steel u-shaped staples at each of the 2-wire strands, for a total of 8 staples per post. Staples on the inside wire strand will be touching the wire to keep the panel from shifting. Staples on the outside wire strand will have a $1/8^{th}$ inch gap as to not crimp the wire. The 6-inch trench will then be backfilled and packed to provide tightness in the panels and prevent shifting.

TIMELINE FOR INSTALLATION

EarthBalance[®] proposes to start work in middle of February 2022. Fence installation will occur first. The Approximate timeframe for fence installation is 6 working days. Dune vegetation installation will occur directly after the fencing and will take approximately 5 days for install. Full project completion should take approximately 11 days for install.

SAFETY AND QUALITY-CONTROL PLAN

ORGANIZATION

Project site activities will be coordinated and supervised by a Project Manager and a Crew Manager or Supervisor. Crew Foremen will coordinate crew labor under the direction of the Crew Manager or Supervisor.

SAFETY PLAN

EarthBalance[®] adheres to a strict Company Safety Plan for all projects and work activities. EarthBalance[®] Project Managers and Crew Supervisors are annually trained in safety basics including first aid and CPR and are certified by the American Red Cross.

ACCIDENT PREVENTION PLAN

EarthBalance[®] will implement and adhere to an Accident Prevention Program through the life of this project. This Program will include an initial project site and equipment inspection and activity hazard analysis, weekly safety meetings with all EarthBalance[®] staff on site, daily safety/equipment/PPE inspections, enforcement of the EarthBalance[®] Workplace Health and Safety and Hazard Communications Plans, and identification of fully trained equipment operators.

SAFETY INSPECTIONS, MEETINGS, AND REPORTING

The EarthBalance[®] Safety Plan requires a minimum of weekly tailgate safety meetings with all Crew Supervisors, Foremen, and Staff. These meetings are documented in writing and submitted to the Company Safety Representative.

The Company Safety Representative or Project Manager performs an initial safety inspection on site prior to the commencement of work on any project site. This inspection is documented in writing. Daily site and equipment safety checks may also be performed by the Crew Supervisor as needed or as required by project contract.

Unannounced safety audits may be conducted by the Company Safety Representative. These audits include review of the activities, inspections of equipment and PPE, inspection and re-supply of first aid kits, and review of fire protection, housekeeping, hazard communication. These safety audits are documented in writing.

Every incident and accident must be properly reported and investigated to determine the cause and what actions are needed to prevent a recurrence. All employees are responsible for immediately reporting to their immediate Supervisor any injury, incident, or near miss, no matter how minor. "Immediately" means at or near the time of the injury or incident and on the same day as the injury or incident. It is the Supervisor's responsibility to file a *First Report of Injury or Illness* with the Company Safety Representative at the Corporate Office in North Port, Florida (or via cell phone) as soon as possible after being notified of the accident or injury. All reported accidents, near misses, or incidents are

promptly and thoroughly investigated by the Supervisor and/or Manager and the Company Safety Officer using the *Incident/Accident Investigation Report*. The goal of the investigation is to determine what actions, measures, or controls are necessary to prevent a recurrence.

HEALTH AND SANITATION

EarthBalance[®] will provide potable water in clean, dispensing containers (e.g., Igloobrand water coolers) and paper drinking cups for all staff on site. Plastic garbage bags will be provided for any trash and these bags will be collected and disposed offsite daily. Portable toilet facilities will be provided and maintained by a local rental service through the life of the work by EarthBalance[®] on the site.

An adequately stocked, appropriate size first aid kit is kept in every EarthBalance®-owned vehicle. A minimum of two adequately stocked first aid kits will be readily available on the project site at all times. EarthBalance® Project Managers and Crew Supervisors are first aid and CPR certified by the American Red Cross.

FIRE PREVENTION

All EarthBalance[®] vehicles are equipped with a fully charged and inspected hand-held fire extinguisher (Class A, B, C). All fuel will be stored in metal safety cans. All ignition sources (e.g., open flames, spark producing equipment, heating equipment, etc.) should be controlled to avoid contact with flammable or combustible materials or liquids.

There shall be NO CELL PHONE USE, NO SMOKING, or NO OPEN FLAMES in areas used for fueling, servicing fuel systems for internal combustion engines, and receiving or dispensing of flammable or combustible liquids. The motors of all equipment being fueled shall be shut off during re-fueling operations. All transfer of fuel to small equipment will be performed within an impervious containment tub.

PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE)

EarthBalance[®] will provide all required PPE for the project and job site. PPE will be inspected daily, and the consistent use of required PPE will be strictly enforced.
